

Tonga Piñata & Tonga Topaz

Fabric Requirements

One Tonga Treat Piñata or Topaz 2¹/₂" Strip pack (forty 2¹/₂" x width-of-fabric [WOF] strips, two each of twenty fabrics)

3 yards background fabric (includes inner border)

- Tonga Piñata: B7900 Parchment
- Tonga Topaz: B4181 Coconut

2/3 yard outer-border fabric

- Tonga Piñata: B4169 Piñata
- Tonga Topaz: B4171 Topaz

1/4 yard Tonga binding fabric of your choice

3³/₄ yards Tonga backing fabric

71" x 79" batting

Cutting

From each of thirty-two Tonga Treat strips:

• Cut eight $2^{1}/2^{1}$ x $4^{1}/2^{1}$ rectangles and two $2^{1}/2^{1}$ squares. Keep all the rectangles cut from one strip together and the squares from one strip together.

From each of three Tonga Treat strips:

• Cut twelve 2¹/₂" squares.

From Tonga background fabric:

- Cut twelve 41/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut sixteen 21/2" x 41/2" rectangles from each strip.
- Cut sixteen 2¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut sixteen 2¹/₂" squares from each strip.
- Cut six $1^{1/2}$ " x WOF strips for inner border.

From Tonga outer border fabric:

• Cut seven 3" x WOF strips.

From Tonga binding fabric:


• Cut two 21/2" x WOF strips. Pair these with the five leftover Tonga Treat Strips.

Block Construction

Block A-In each block, work with eight rectangles cut from the same Tonga Treat strip.

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each 2½" background square. Place a marked square right sides together on the left side fig. 1 of the 2½" x 4½" colored rectangle, noting the line direction. (figure 1)

2. Sew on the marked line. Trim the seam allowances to 1/4" and press the triangle open. (figure 2)




3. Repeat steps 1 and 2, placing the background square on the right side of the rectangle, noting the line direction. Make a total of four pieced units. (figures 3 and 4)



4. Sew a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " colored rectangle to a pieced unit from step 3 as

shown in figure 5. Make a total of four units.



6. Repeat steps 1-5 to make a total of thirty-two of Block A.



Block B




fig. 7-Make 4.

7. Repeat steps 1 and 2 using one 2½" x 4½" background rectangle and a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " colored square. (figure 7) Make a total of four units using two pairs of matching $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.



from step 7. (figure 8) 9. Sew four of the pieced fig. 8 units from step 8 together, as shown, to make Block B. (figure 9) 10. Repeat steps 7-9 to make a total of fig. 9-Block B-Make 24.

Quilt Top Assembly

twenty-four of Block B.

Refer to the quilt photos for color placement.

- 11. Create a pleasing color arrangement of Block A in four vertical rows of eight blocks each. Do the same to create three vertical rows of Block B.
- 12. Sew the blocks together in each row, then alternately sew the A and B rows together to make the quilt top, matching adjacent seams.
- 13. Sew the 11/2" x WOF inner border strips end to end using diagonal seams. Cut two 1½" x 56½" top/bottom borders and two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $66\frac{1}{2}$ " side borders. Sew one $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $56\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the top and another to the bottom of the quilt top. Press seam allowances toward the border. Sew one 1½" x 66½" strip to each side of the quilt top.
- 14. Following step 13, add the outer borders using the 3" x WOF strips. Cut top/bottom borders 3" x 58½" and side borders 3" x 71½".

Finishing

15. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing and quilt as desired. 16. Stitch the assorted binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.

17. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.





fig. 6-Block A-Make 32.
