Finished Quilt Size: 56" x 70"


Fabric A : Fish Panel 24031EB 1 yard
-Fussy cut six panel squares $1 / 4$ " outside the cream (approximately 12 " x $13 "$ )

Fabric B: Blue Scales 24035W $11 / 4$ yards

- Cut (1) $12 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut into twelve $21 / 2 " \times 12 "$ strips.
- Cut (6) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut into twelve $21 / 2 "$ x 17"strips.
-Cut (6) $13 / 4$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut into twenty four $13 / 4$ " $\times 91 / 2 "$ strips.

Fabric C: Blue Lures 24033B $1 / 4$ yard

- Cut (1) $41 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut into $\operatorname{six} 41 / 2 "$ squares.

Fabric D: Gold Plaid 24036A 1/3 yard

- Cut (2) $41 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut into twenty-four 3" x $41 / 2$ " strips.

Fabric E: Gold Scales 24035X 3/8 yard
-Cut (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut into twenty-four 3" squares.

Fabric F: Blue Plaid 4036B $1 / 4$ yard

- Cut (6) $13 / 4$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut into twenty-four $13 / 4$ " x $91 / 2 "$ strips

Fabric G: Water 24034B 1/4 yard

- Cut (2) 3"x WOF strips. Sub-cut into twenty-four 3" squares.

Fabric H: Green Scales 24035G* 11/s yards

- Cut (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together and cut (2) $21 / 2 " \times 561 / 2 "$ strips and (2) $21 / 2 " \times 461 / 2 "$ strips for the inner borders.
- Cut (7) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric I: Tossed Fish 24032E 2¼ yards

- Cut (3) $5 \frac{1}{2} " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together and cut (2) $5 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$ " $\times 56^{1 / 2 "}$ " strips.
- Cut (2) $51 / 2 " \times 601 / 2 "$ strips from the LOF.

Back: Cream Lures 24033A 33/4 yards

- Cut (2) $64 "$ x WOF strips. Sew the strips together, using a horizontal seam. Press. Trim to make one $64 "$ x 78 " backing.


## Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of one Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $2 \frac{1}{2} " \times 17 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the Fabric A panel (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure $14 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 14 \frac{1}{2}$ " to make Block One. Repeat to make six Block One squares total.

2. Sew (1) 3 " $\times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to each side of one $41 / 2$ " Fabric C square. Sew (1) 3" Fabric E square to each end of (1) 3 " $\times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to make a top border. Repeat to make a bottom border. Sew the border to the top and bottom of the Fabric C square to make one Block Center (Fig. 2). Repeat to make six Block Centers total.

3. Sew (1) $13 / 4 " \times 91 / 2 "$ Fabric F strip to the top of (1) $13 / 4$ " x $91 / 2$ " Fabric B strip to make one strip border (Fig. 3). Repeat to make twenty-four strip borders total.

While all possible care has been taken to ensure the accuracy of this pattern, we are not responsible for printing errors or the way in which individual work varies.
4. Sew one strip border to each side of the Block Center. Sew (1) 3" Fabric G square to each end of one strip set to make the top border. Repeat to make the bottom border. Sew the borders to the block center to make one Block Two (Fig. 4). Repeat to make six Block Twos

## Quilt Assembly

(Refer to the quilt layout while assembling the quilt top)
5. Sew two Block Ones and one Block Two square together, alternating them to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
6. Sew two Block Twos and one Block One square together, alternating them to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
7. Sew the rows together in numerical order to make the quilt top.
8. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 561 / 2$ " Fabric H strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $2^{1 / 2 "} \times 46^{1 / 2 "}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
9. Sew (1) $51 / 2 " \times 60^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric I strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew (1) $51^{1 / 2 "} \times 56^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric I strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
10. Layer quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired.
11. Trim layers even with quilt top.
12. Sew the (7) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with $45^{\circ}$ seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half, lengthwise with wrong sides together, and press.
13. Bind as desired.
