## Fabric Requirements

3½ yards Ombré-C4700 Peacock
2¼ yards Ombré-C4700 Sunset
11⁄8 yards Soho-White
$43 / 4$ yards Ombré backing fabric of your choice
73" x 85" batting

## Cutting

The Studio Ombré fabrics gradate from light to dark across the width of fabric. Cut the fabrics accordingly for either a light or dark quilt. For easier assembly, label the cut pieces A-J (nol). From Ombré-C4700 Peacock:

- Cut eleven 3" x width-of-fabric (WOF) strips. Sub-cut seventeen $3^{\prime \prime} \times 10 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips (A) and seventeen 3 " $\times 13^{\prime \prime}$ strips (B). - Cut nine $35 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut eighteen $35 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 18 \frac{1}{4}$ " strips (C).
- Cut two $83 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut six $83 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Cut the squares once diagonally to make twelve triangles (D).
- Cut seven $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF border strips.
- Cut eight $2 \frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF binding strips.

From Ombré-C4700 Sunset:
-Cut nine $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut thirteen $3^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1 ⁄ 21} 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips (E) and thirteen $3^{\prime \prime} \times 13^{\prime \prime}$ strips (F).

- Cut six $35 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut twelve $35 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 181 / 4$ " strips (G).
- Cut three $83 / 8$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut nine $83 / 8$ " squares. Cut the squares once diagonally to make eighteen triangles $(\mathrm{H})$. From Soho-White:
- Cut four $83 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut fifteen $83 / 4^{\text {" }}$ squares. Cut the squares once diagonally to make thirty triangles (J).


## Block Construction

1. Stitch a J triangle to the lower edge of a $3^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1} / 22^{\prime \prime}$ A strip. Sew a 3" x $13^{\prime \prime}$ B strip to the adjacent side. (figure 1) Trim the edges to make a triangle unit. (figure 2) Make seventeen $\mathrm{A} / \mathrm{B} / \mathrm{J}$ units.
2. Repeat step 1 to make thirteen $E / F / J$ units. (figure 3)
3. Right sides together, center and stitch one H triangle to a $35 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 18 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ C strip. (figure 4) Stitch this unit to an A/B/J Peacock unit made in step 1. Trim the block to $12 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ square, keeping the long diagonal seam centered from corner to corner. (figure 5) Make nine blocks.
4. Following step 3, complete the requisite number of blocks in the color combinations shown in figure 6.



## Quilt Top Assembly

5. Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for block placement and orientation, lay out six rows of five blocks each. Number the rows for easier assembly.
6. Stitch the blocks together in each row, matching adjacent seams. Press the seams of adjacent rows in alternating directions. 7. Stitch the rows together in numerical order, matching adjacent seams. Press the seam allowances in one direction.
7. Sew the $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF C4700 Peacock border strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Measure the width of the quilt top through the center and cut two strips that length from the pieced border strip. Sew one strip to the top and the other strip to the bottom of the quilt top. Press seam allowances toward the border.
8. Measure the length of the quilt top through the center. Cut two strips that length from the pieced border strip. Sew one strip to each side of the quilt top. Press the seam allowances toward the border.

## Finishing

10. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing and quilt as desired. 11. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
11. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.
