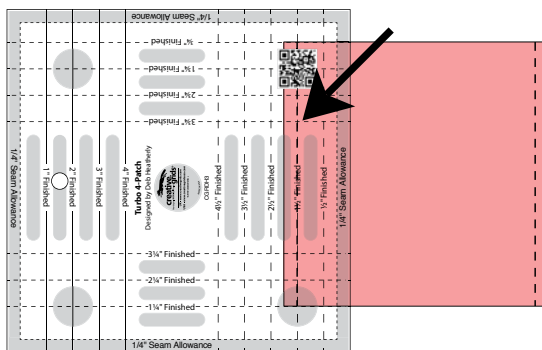
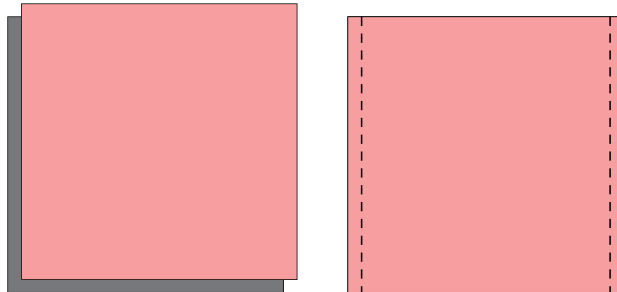


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NON-SLIP Turbo 4-Patch

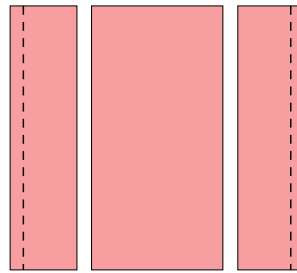
Turbo 4-Patch makes four-patch units in sixteen different sizes (from 1/2" to 4 1/2") quickly, easily, and accurately. Multiple blocks are made at a time and all cuts are based on your stitching lines, which assures accuracy on even the smallest of four-patch blocks. Turbo 4-Patch may be used with a variety of fabric sizes, including the most popular pre-cuts on the market. (It's a great scrap buster!)

1. Layer contrasting fabric right sides together. Stitch 1/4" from the edge on opposite sides.

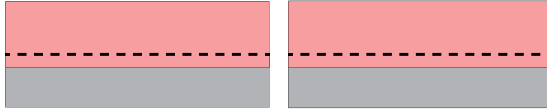


2. Using the Turbo 4-Patch, place the line for the desired finished size four-patch on the stitching line of one side of the fabric. (Notice how the other lines on the tool act as a guide to keep you square as you trim.)

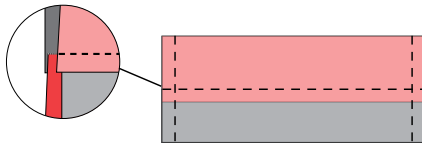
3. Make your cut, then repeat the process for the opposite stitching line. (Depending on the size fabric you are using, and the size four-patch blocks you are making, you may have fabric left over in the center. If so, repeat the above directions, stitching on opposite sides and cutting as directed above until you have used all of the fabric.)



4. Press units with seams to one side. Press toward the darkest fabric.



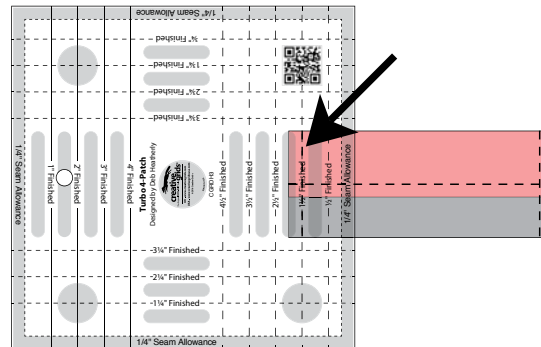
5. Place pressed units right sides together nesting seams on both ends. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the edge over nested seams on opposite sides.



6. Using the Turbo 4-Patch, place the line for the desired finished size four-patch on the stitching line of one side of the unit. (Notice how the lines on the tool also act as a guide to keep you square as you trim.)

Make your cut, then repeat the process for the opposite stitching line.

Note: Depending on the size fabric you are using, and the size four-patch blocks you are making, you may have enough fabric left in the center of the nested units to make more units. Simply repeat above directions, stitching on opposite sides of the remaining fabric and cut more four-patch units.



7. Open the four-patch units. Press.
