Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (3556P-11 Book Panel – Multi):

- Fussy cut (12) 8 ½" blocks.

Fabric B (1351-Slate Just Color! – Slate), cut:

- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (8) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2" x 11 ½" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric C (3553-11 Butterfly – Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric D (3554-44 Bunnies – Cream), cut:

- (4) 3" x WOF strips.

Fabric E (3554-11 Bunnies – Blue), cut:

- (8) 3" x WOF strips.

Fabric F (3555-12 Dot – White), cut:

- (4) 3" x WOF strips.

Fabric G (3551-12 Bunny Scene – White), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric H (3552-1 Carrots – White), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric I (3551-11 Bunny Scene – Blue), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 4 ½" squares.

Backing (3555-11 Dot – Blue), cut:

- (2) 54" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 54" x 68" for the back.

Sewing

Sew using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2" x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2" x 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (1) A block (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (12) A blocks total.

2. Sew (1) 3" x WOF Fabric D strip, (1) 3" x WOF Fabric E strip, (1) 3" x WOF Fabric F strip and (1) 3" x WOF Fabric E strip together lengthwise and in that order to make (1) DE strip set (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) DE strip sets total.

3. Cut the DE strip sets into (31) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " DE strips (Fig. 3).

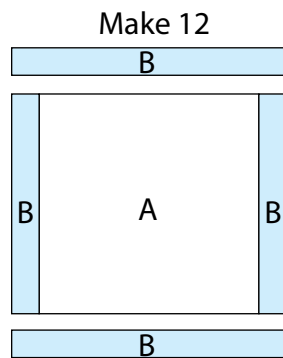

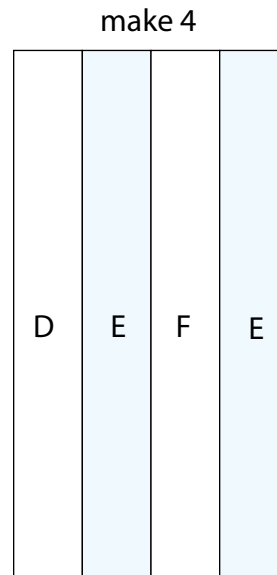

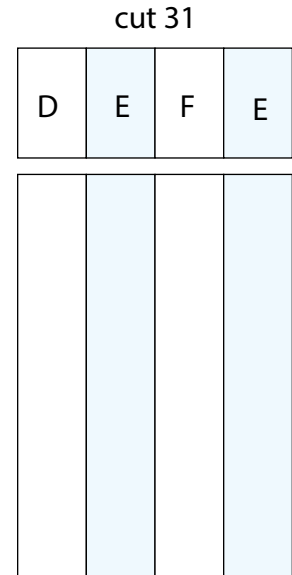

4. Sew (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square, (1) DE strip, (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square, (1) DE strip, (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square, (1) DE strip and (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square together, end to end and in that order, to make (1) CH strip. Repeat to make (5) CH strips total.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

5. Sew (4) DE strips and (3) A blocks together, alternating them, to make (1) row. Repeat to make (4) rows total. Pay attention to the orientation of the DE strips.

6. Sew the (5) CH strips and (4) rows together, alternating them, to make the quilt top. Pay attention to the orientation of the CH strips.

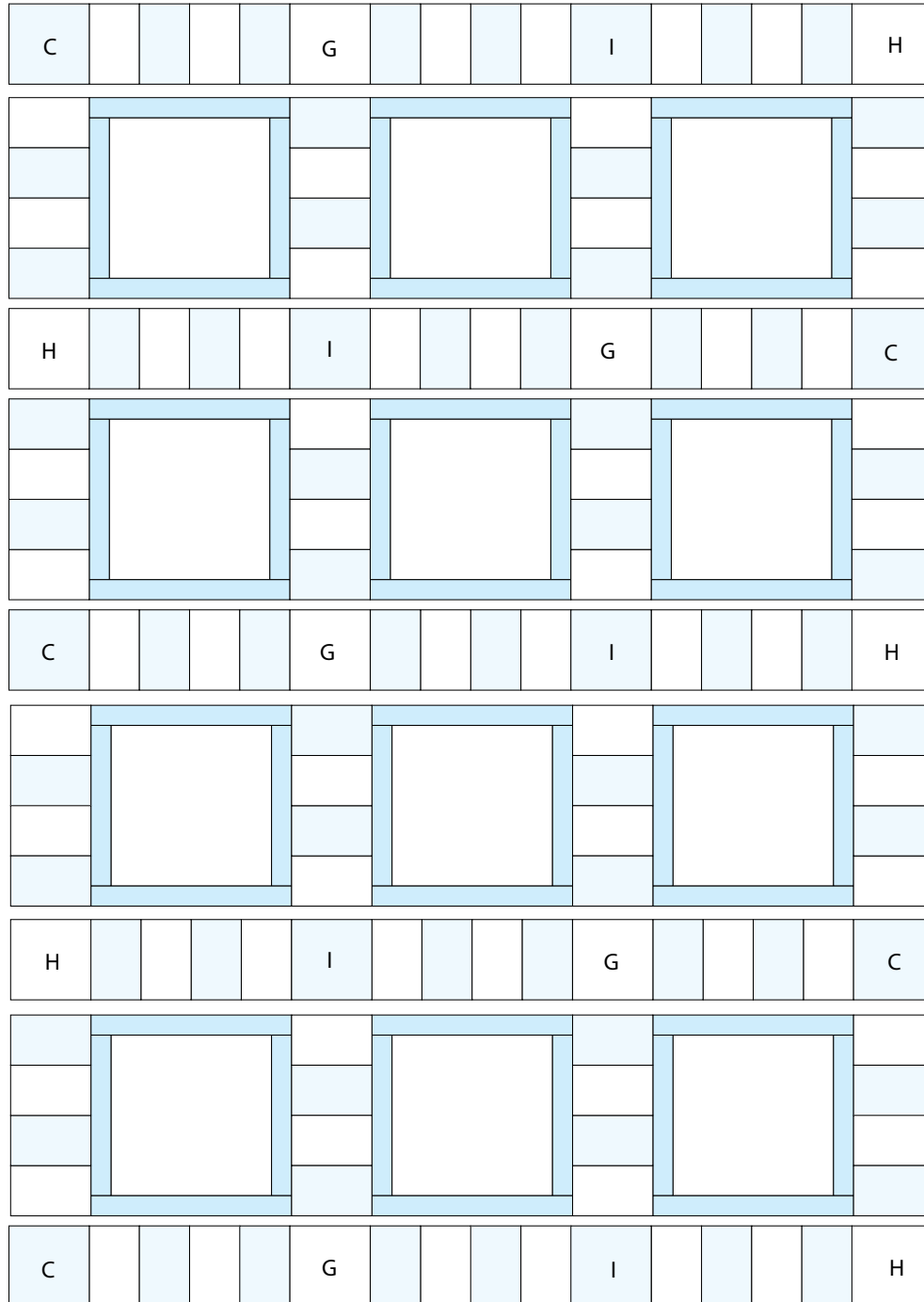
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

7. Press the quilt top and 54" x 68" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

8. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric B binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

9. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
