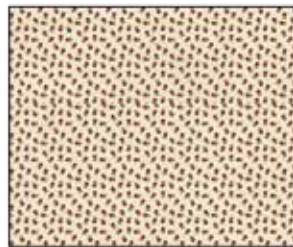

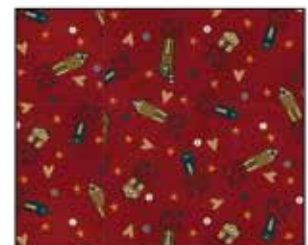

1 1/2 yards	Words - Blue (E)	8638-17*
1/8 yard	Ditsy Flower - Green (F)	8640-66
5/8 yard	Words - Green (G)	8638-66
1/3 yard	Houses - Red (H)	8642-88
7/8 yard	Ditsy Flower - Red (I)	8640-88
1/8 yard	Stripe - Green (J)	8641-66
1/8 yard	Character Toss - Blue (K)	8637-17
5/8 yard	Ditsy Flower - Cream (L)	8640-44
3 1/2 yards	Character Toss - Cream (Backing)	8637-17

Quilt Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Words - Cream (A), cut:

- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (64) 2 1/2" squares.
- (3) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (32) 2 7/8" squares.

From the Houses - Navy (B), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (16) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Sprig Toss - Navy Blue (C), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (16) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Sprig Toss - Yellow (D), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (32) 2 1/2" squares.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (9) 2" squares.

From the Words - Blue (E), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (16) 2 1/2" squares.
- (2) 3 1/2" x 49 1/2" length of fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 3 1/2" x 55 1/2" WOF strips from the remaining fabric, piece as needed.
- (7) 2 1/2" x 35" WOF strips from the remaining fabric for the binding.

From the Ditsy Flower - Green (F), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (16) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Words - Green (G), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (16) 2 1/2" squares.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (24) 2" x 10 1/2" strips.

From the Houses - Red (H), cut:

- (3) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (32) 2 7/8" squares.

From the Ditsy Flower - Red (I), cut:

- (3) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (32) 2 7/8" squares.
- (3) 2 3/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 3/4" x 45" strips.
- (3) 2 3/4" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 3/4" x 49 1/2" strips.

From the Stripe - Green (J), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (16) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Character Toss - Blue (K), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (16) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Ditsy Flower - Cream (L), cut:

- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (64) 2 1/2" squares.
- (3) 2 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (32) 2 7/8" squares.

From the Character Toss - Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 58" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 58" x 68" back.

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Sewing Instructions

1. Place (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric A square and (1) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric I square right sides together (Fig. 1).

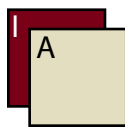

2. Draw a line from one corner to the opposite corner.

3. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on both sides of the line (Fig. 2).

4. Cut apart on drawn line to yield two half-square triangle units. Press seams open and square the units to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a total of sixty-four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " half-square triangle units.

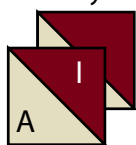

5. Repeat steps 1 through 4 using (32) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric L squares and (32) $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric H squares to make a total of sixty-four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " half-square triangle units (Fig. 4).

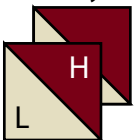

6. Sew (1) AI unit on each side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square (Fig. 5). Repeat and make thirty-two AI units.

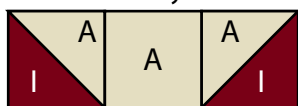

7. Sew (1) LH unit on each side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square (Fig. 6). Repeat and make thirty-two LH units.

8. Sew on (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square on to each side of (1) AI strip unit (Fig. 7). Repeat to make sixteen.

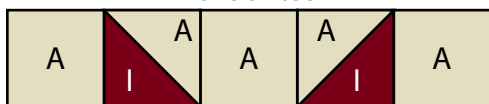

9. Sew on (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square on to each side of (1) LH strip unit (Fig. 8). Repeat to make sixteen.

10. Sew (9) assorted $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares together to make a $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " nine patch square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make sixteen.

11. Using (2) AI strip units, (2) AI units and (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " nine patch square, arrange the units as shown in Figure 10 and sew together. Repeat to make eight blocks.

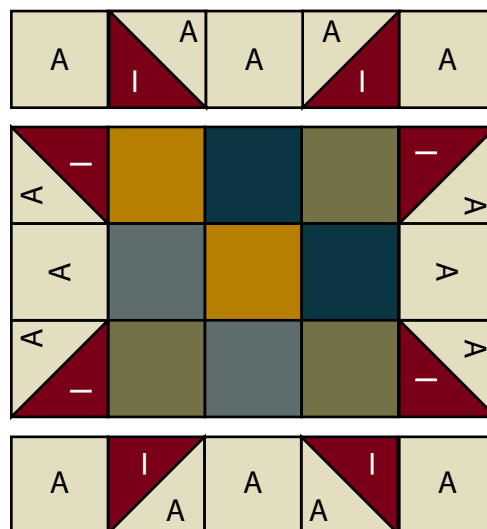

12. Using (2) LH strip units, 2) LH units and (1) 6 ½" x 6 ½" nine patch square, arrange the units as shown in Figure 11 and sew together. Repeat to make eight blocks.

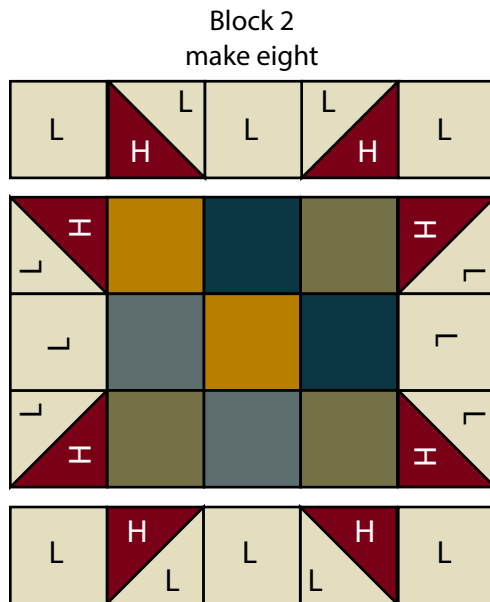

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)

13. Sew (4) assorted star units and (3) 10 ½" x 2" Fabric G strips together, alternating them to make 1 row. Repeat to make four rows.

14. Sew (4) 10 ½" x 2" Fabric G strips and (3) 2" x 2" Fabric D squares together, alternate them to make sashing row. Repeat to make three sashing rows.

15. Sew the (4) rows and (3) sashing rows, together to make a quilt top.

16. Sew (1) 2 ¾" x 45" Fabric I strip to each side of quilt top.

17. Sew (1) 2 ¾" x 49 ½" Fabric I strip to top and (1) 2 ¾" x 49 ½" Fabric I strip to bottom of quilt top.

18. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 49 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of quilt top.

19. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric E strip to top and (1) 3 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric E strip to bottom of quilt top.

20. Layer and quilt as desired.

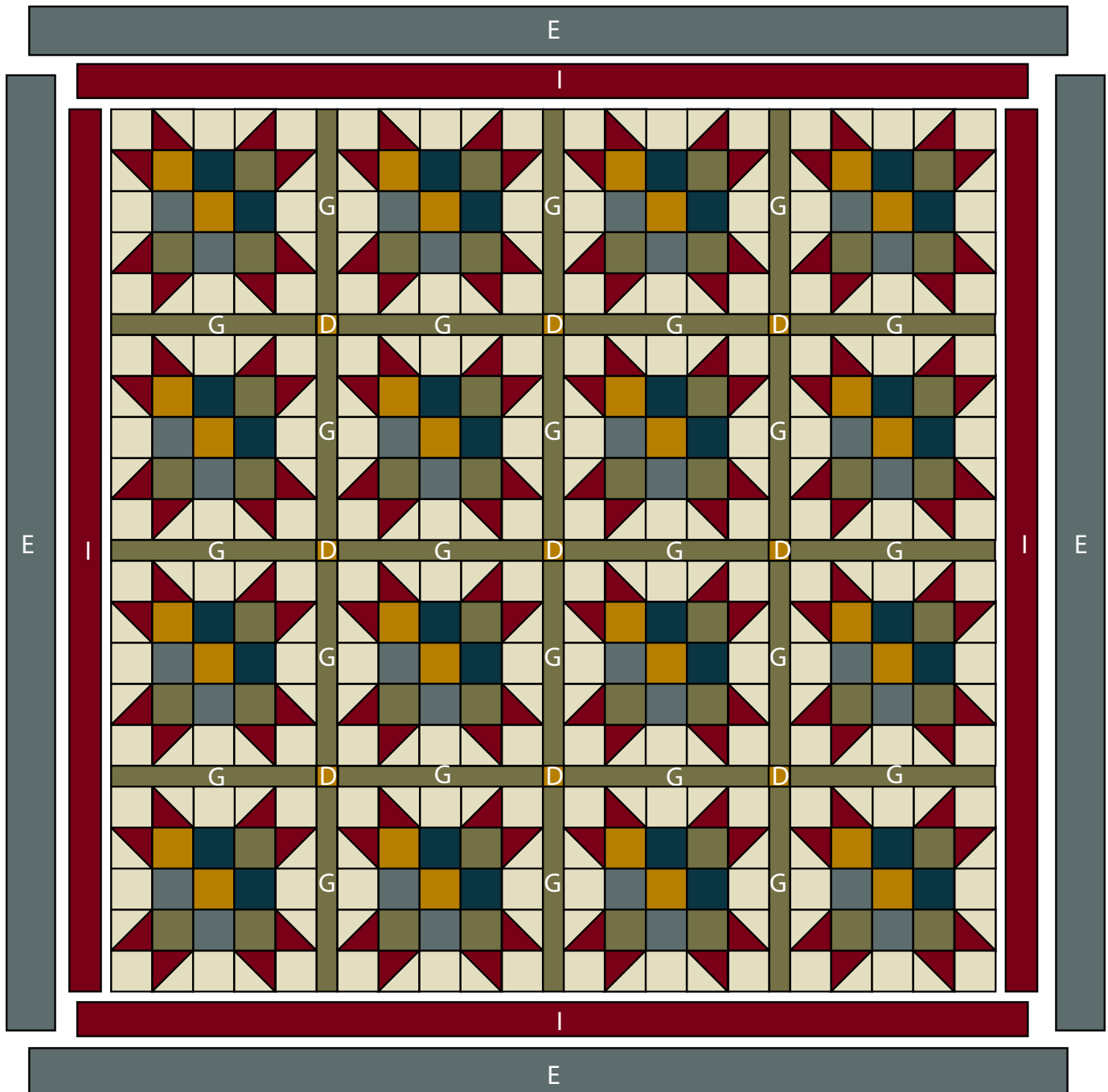
21. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x 35" Fabric E strips together, end to end with diagonal seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

22. Bind as desired.
