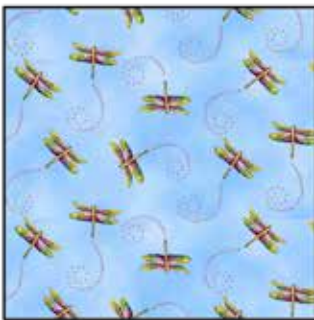

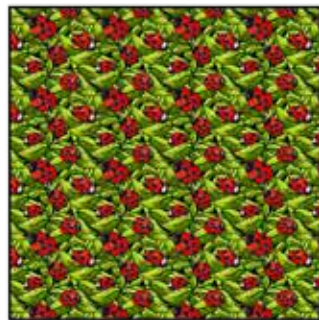

Materials

1 panel	24" Panel - Lt. Blue (A)	8679P-11
1 yard	Splash - Spring (B)	3504-Spring
2 ½ yards	Stripe - Lt. Green (C)	8681-65
1 yard	Butterflies - Blue (D)	8683-77
1 ½ yards	Frogs - White (E)	8682-01
1 ⅛ yards	Fusion Illusion - Orchid (F)	4368-Orchid*
5 yards	Garden Allover - Blue (Backing)	8680-77

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the 24" Panel - Lt. Blue (A), fussy cut:

- (1) 23" x 39" panel.

From the Splash - Spring (B), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 39" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 27" WOF strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 67 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 53 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ¾" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¾" x 46" strips.
- (2) 1 ¾" x 32 ½" WOF strips.

From the Stripe - Lt. Green (C), cut:

- (2) 6" x 84" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips, each centered on the blue & white strip.
- (2) 6" x 68" LOF strips, each centered on the blue & white strip.
- (2) 2 ½" x 50" LOF strips, each centered on the purple strip.
- (2) 2 ½" x 34" LOF strips, each centered on the purple strip.

From the Butterflies - Blue (D), cut:

- (12) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (192) 2 ½" squares.

From the Frogs - White (E), cut:

- (11) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (96) 4 ½" squares.

From the Fusion Illusion - Orchid (F), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Garden Allover - Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 88" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 72" x 88" back.

Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 39" Fabric B strip to each side of the 23" x 39" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 27" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure 26" x 42" to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).

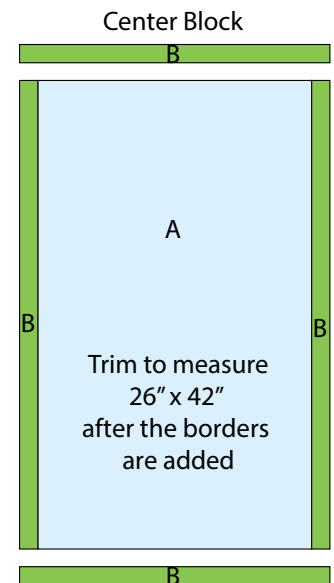

2. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.

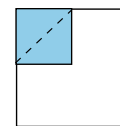

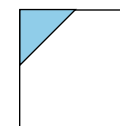

3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric D square to the lower right corner of the 4 ½" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 1 block (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (48) Unit 1 blocks total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and use Figure 6 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (48) Unit 2 blocks.

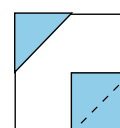

make 48

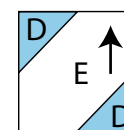

make 48

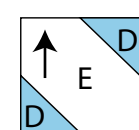

6. Sew (2) Unit 2 blocks and (2) Unit 1 blocks together to make (1) Block (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (24) Blocks total.

Note: Pay attention to the orientation of the units.

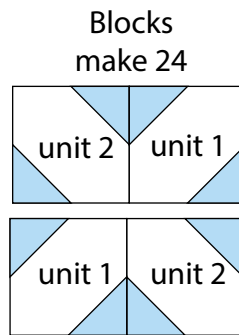

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)

7. Center (1) 2 1/2" x 50" Fabric C strip on one side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

8. Repeat Step 7 to sew (1) 2 1/2" x 34" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 8).

9. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 8), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

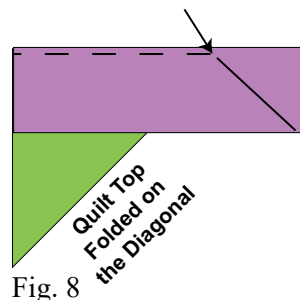

10. Sew (1) 1 3/4" x 46" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 3/4" x 32 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

11. Sew (6) Blocks together. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.

12. Sew (6) Blocks together. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) 2" x 64 1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 67 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 53 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Center (1) 6" x 84" Fabric C strip on one side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

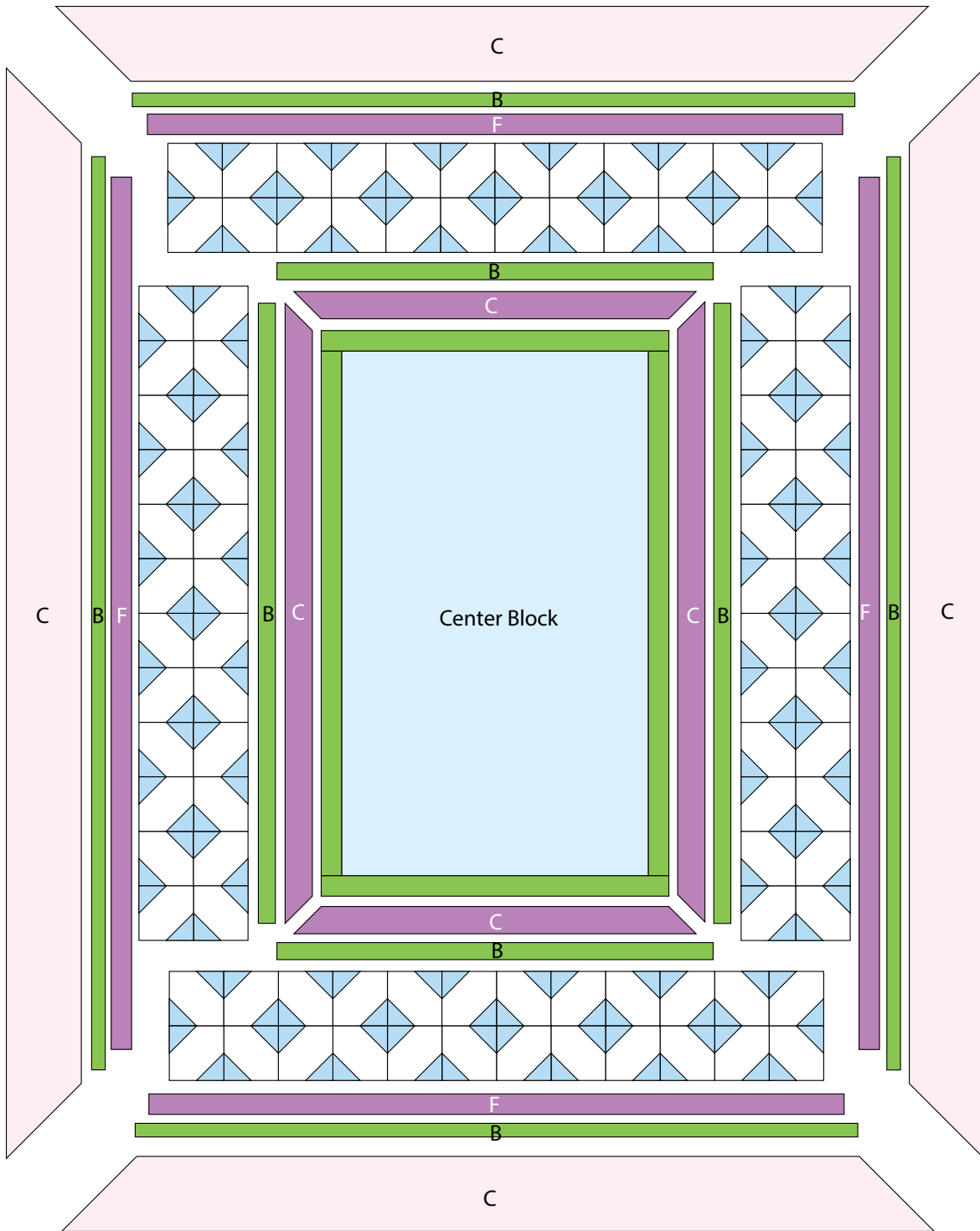
16. Repeat Step 15 to sew (1) 6" x 68" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 8).

17. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 8), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

18. Layer and quilt as desired.

19. Sew the (8) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

20. Bind as desired.
