

⅓ yard	Frogs - White (A)	8682-01
1/8 yard	Fusion Illusion - Orchid (B)	4368-Orchid
⅓ yard	Ladybugs - Green (C)	8685-66*
½ yard	Garden Allover - Purple (D)	8680-55
⅓ yard	Butterflies - Blue (E)	8683-77
1/8 yard	Fusion Illusion - Sunshine (F)	4368-Sunshine
1/8 yard	Splash - Chamois (G)	3504-Chamois
1 ² / ₃ yards	Splash - Ice (H)	3504-Ice
2 yards	Stripe - Lt. Green (I)	8681-65
3 ¹ / ₃ yards	Birdhouses - Lt. Green (Backing)	8686-65

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Frogs - White (A), cut:

• (4) Template 1 blocks.

From the Fusion Illusion - Orchid (B), cut:

• See instructions to cut (4) holes.

From the Ladybugs - Green (C), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (6) 3 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (6) 1 1/4" x 9 1/2" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Garden Allover - Purple (D), cut:

• (3) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (24) 5" squares.

From the Butterflies - Blue (E), cut:

• (2) Template 1 blocks.

From the Fusion Illusion - Sunshine (F), cut:

• See instructions to cut (2) holes.

From the Splash - Chamois (G), cut:

• (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (6) 2" x 2 3/4" strips.

From the Splash - Ice (H), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (12) 3 ½" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (12) 2" x 8" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (12) 2" x 5 \(\frac{3}{8} \)" strips.
- (2) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (24) 2 ³/₄" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (24) 2" squares.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (12) 2" x 12 ½"
- (3) 1 5/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (12) 1 5/8" x 9 1/2" strips.
- (6) Template 2 triangles.
- (6) Template 3 triangles.

From the Stripe - Lt. Green (I), cut:


- (2) 6" X 66" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips each centered on the Blue/White strips.
- (2) 6" x 54" LOF strips each centered on the Purple/White strips.

From the Birdhouses - Lt. Green (Backing), cut:

• (2) 58" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 58" x 70" back.

Sewing Instructions


1. Place (1) Fabric H-Template 2 triangle on top of (1) Fabric A-Template 1 block, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 1). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the small triangle open.

- 2. Place (1) Fabric H-Template 3 triangle on top of the Fabric A-Template 1 block, right sides together, aligning the right sides (Fig. 2). Sew the (2) triangles together along the right side. Press the small triangle open to make (1) Unit 1 block (Fig. 3). Trim the block to measure 9 ½" x 8".
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (4) Unit 1 blocks total.





4. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (2) Fabric E-Template 1 blocks, (2) Fabric H-Template 2 triangles and (2) Fabric H-Template 3 triangles to make (2) Unit 2 blocks (Fig. 4).

unit 2 make 2



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5. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric H square on the left side of (1) 3 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 6). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ½" seam allowance.








6. Place another 3 ½" Fabric H square on the right side of the 3 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 8).

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (6) Unit 3 strips total.



8. Sew (1) 2" x 5 3/8" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) 2" x 2 3/4" Fabric G strip to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (6) Unit 4 strips total.



9. Sew (1) 2" x 8" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 block. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top of the Unit 1 block. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to the bottom of the Unit 1 block to make (1) Birdhouse Block (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (4) Birdhouse Blocks total.







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- 10. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about ½" outside the drawn lines.
- 11. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 12. Refer to Figure 11 to arrange and press (1) Fabric B hole onto (1) Birdhouse Block.
- 13. Finish the raw edges of the shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make (1) Block One (Fig. 11).
- 14. Repeat Steps 12-13 to make (4) Block Ones total.
- 15. Repeat Steps 9-13 to make (2) Block Twos using Figure 12 for fabric identification and location.




16. Place (1) 2 ¾" Fabric H square on the bottom left corner of (1) 5" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 13). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 13). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 14). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.




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- 17. Follow Figure 15 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric H square to the upper right corner of the 5" Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 5 block (Fig. 16).
- 18. Repeat Steps 16-17 to make (6) Unit 5 blocks total.



19. Repeat Steps 16-17 and use Figures 17-19 for fabric identification, location and direction to make (6) Unit 6 blocks, (6) Unit 7 blocks and (6) Unit 8 blocks.



20. Follow Figure 20 and sew (1) Unit 5 block (1) Unit 6 block, (1) Unit 7 block, (1) Unit 8 block and (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric C strip together to make (1) Butterfly block. Repeat to make (6) Butterfly blocks total.



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Block Three

21. Sew (1) 1 5/8" x 9 ½"
Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Butterfly block. Sew (1)
2" x 12 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Butterfly block to make (1) Block Three (Fig. 21).
Repeat to make (6) Block Threes total.



Quilt Top Assembly (Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)

- 22. Sew (1) Block One to each side of (1) Block Three to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.
- 23. Sew (1) Block Three to each side of (1) Block Two to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
- 24. Sew the (4) rows together, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.
- 25. Sew (1) 2" x 48 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 26. Center (1) 6" x 66" Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¹/₄" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¹/₄" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 27. Repeat Step 26 to sew (1) 6" x 54" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 22).
- 28. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 22), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ½" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.





- 29. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 30. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 31. Bind as desired.

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




Template Two
