## Yardage Requirements

(Shiny Objects collection)
1/8 yard each:
Fabric D - \#3026_001
Fabric E - \#3023_004
Fabric F - \#3023_003
1/4 yard of Fabric G - \#3024_003
1/2 yard of Fabric H - \#2792_010
1 yard each:
Fabric A - \#3019_001
Fabric B - \#3019_004
1-7/8 yards of Fabric C - \#3019_003
4 yards backing fabric
$72^{\prime \prime} \times 72^{\prime \prime}$ piece of batting
Basic sewing supplies

## Cutting and Preparation

## From each of Fabric A and B, cut:

Twelve 2-1/2" x WOF strips; recut six strips as shown:


## From Fabric C, cut:

Twenty-four 2-1/2"x WOF strips; recut twelve strips as shown:


From each of Fabric $D$ and $E$, cut:
One 2-1/2" x WOF strip; recut into five 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric F, cut:
One 2-1/2" x WOF strip; recut into ten 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric G, cut:
Twenty 2-1/2" squares, fussy-cut to center a bird or flower motif

From Fabric H, cut:
Seven 2-1/4" x 42" strips for binding

## Making the Quilt

Note: Refer to the Row Assembly Diagram on p. 3 as you work.

1. Sew two $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31^{\prime \prime}$ dark Fabric A strips to opposite sides of one 2-1/2" Fabric D square as shown to make a dark green \#1 row. In the same way, make a light green \#1 row using one 2-1/2" Fabric G square.
2. In the same way, make one dark pink \#1 row using a 2-1/2" Fabric E square, one light pink \#1 row using a Fabric $G$ square, two dark blue \#1 rows using 2-1/2" Fabric F squares, and two light blue \#1 rows using Fabric $G$ squares.
3. Sew one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$ dark Fabric A strip and one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip to opposite sides of one 2-1/2" Fabric D square to make a dark green \#2 row. Make two. In the same way, make two light green \#2 rows using 2-1/2" Fabric G squares.
4. In the same way, make two dark pink \#2 rows using 2-1/2" Fabric E squares, two light pink \#2 rows using $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric $G$ squares, four dark blue \#2 rows using 2-1/2" Fabric F squares, and four light blue \#2 rows using 2-1/2" Fabric G squares.
5. Sew together one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip, one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ dark Fabric A piece, one 2-1/2" x 9-1/4" light Fabric A piece, one 2-1/2" Fabric D square, and one 2-1/2" Fabric G square as shown to make one green \#3 row. Make two.
6. In the same way, make two pink \#3 rows using one 2-1/2" Fabric E square and one 2-1/2" Fabric G square, and four blue \#3 rows using one $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F square and one 2-1/2" Fabric G square.

7. Referring to the Quilt Layout Diagram on p. 4, lay out the eight green rows, eight pink rows, and sixteen blue rows into vertical rows.
8. Sew the rows together into pairs, then join pairs, and continue joining sections to assemble the entire quilt top. Sew seams in opposite directions to keep the rows as straight as possible.

## Finishing

Lay the backing right side down, batting, and quilt top right side up. Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Use the seven 2-1/4" x WOF Fabric G strips to bind the quilt.
