## Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Chicken Panel - Red (A), fussy cut:

- (2) 15 " x $11 "$ blocks.
-(4) 7 " square blocks.
From the Novelty Chickens/Coops - Multi (B), cut:
- (1) $161 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip, centered on chickens. Sub-cut
(2) $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 16^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ strips. CUT FIRST
- (2) 8 " $\times 62$ " Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
-(2) $8 " \times 50 "$ LOF strips.
From the Chicken Wire - Beige (C), cut:
- (2) 2 " $\times 381 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) 2 " $\times 291 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (1) $21 / 2 " \times 261 / 2 "$ WOF strip.
- (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 161 / 2 "$ strips.
- (1) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 181 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
-(1) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ strips.


## From the Folio - True Red (D), cut:

- (2) 2 " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 2 " x 11 " strips.
- (2) 2 " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 2" x 18 " strips.
- (2) 2 " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2 " x 7 " strips.
- (2) 2 " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2 " x $10 "$ strips.
-(2) $1 \frac{1 / 2 "}{} \times 411 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
-(2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 311 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
-(6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
From the Chick Tossed Allover - Beige (Backing), cut:
- (2) $54 " \times$ WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 54 " x 66 " back.


## Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 11 "$ Fabric D strip to each side of (1) $15 "$ x 11 " Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2" x 18 " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure $161 / 2 " \times 121 / 2$ " to make (1) Unit 1 block (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 block.

2. Sew (1) 2" x 7 " Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 7" Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2" x 10 " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure $81 / 2$ " square to make (1) Unit 2 block (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 blocks total.

3. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 16^{1 / 2 "}$ Fabric C strip to the bottom of (1) Unit 1 block. Sew (1) $41 / 2 " \times 161 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to the bottom of the sewn block to make (1) Block Two rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a second Block One rectangle.
4. Sew (1) Unit 2 block to the top and to the bottom of (1) $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to make (1) Block Two rectangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second Block Two rectangle.

## Quilt Top Assembly (Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)

5. Sew (1) Block One rectangle to the left side of (1) $21 / 2 " \times 181 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to the right side of the Fabric C strip to make Row One.
6. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to the left side of (1) $21 / 2 " \times 181 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block One rectangle to the right side of the Fabric C strip to make Row Two.
7. Sew Row One, (1) $21 / 2 " \times 261 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip and (1) Row Two together, in that order, to make the Center Block.
8. Sew (1) $2 " \times 381 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x $291 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
9. Sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 411 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 311 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
10. Center (1) 8 " x 62 " Fabric B strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4 "$ from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4 "$ from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
11. Repeat Step 10 to sew (1) 8 " $\times 50$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4 "$ away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 5).
12. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 5), draw a 45 -degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the

13. Layer and quilt as desired.
14. Sew the (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric D strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
15. Bind as desired.
