Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning. All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvage to selvage, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following for Panel Throw:

Refer to thumbnails on pattern cover for Fabrics A-I used in this design. Fabric A - PLEASE NOTE: Panels do not always print the size intended. For this pattern, the panel has a coping border added then trimmed so the panel will fit the quilt correctly. Fussy cut 1/4" beyond outside edges of panel to approximately 23" x 42"

Fabric B - Referring to the guilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (2) 9-1/2" x 67" and (2) 9-1/2" x 47" multi-stripe borders

Fabrics C and H - From each fabric: Cut (2) 5-7/8" strips, subcut (12) 5-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally 🖊 for 24 triangles

Fabric D - Cut (2) 5-7/8" strips, subcut (12) 5-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for 24 triangles Cut (2) 2-3/4" strips, subcut (2) 2-3/4" x 28" strips

Cut (2) 2-1/4" strips Cut (6) 1-1/2" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 1-1/2"x 63-1/2" and (2) 1-1/2" x 45-1/2" borders

Fabric E - Cut (2) 5-7/8" strips, subcut (12) 5-7/8" squares then cut in half / diagonally for 24 triangles Cut (8) 2-1/2" strips (binding)

Fabric F - Cut (7) 3" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 3"x 78-1/2" and (2) 3" x 63-1/2" borders

Fabric G - Cut (7) 2" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2"x 75-1/2" and (2) 2" x 58-1/2" borders

2. Piecing Order for Panel Throw:

 Stitch Fabrics C and D 5-7/8" triangles together along their long edges. Make a total of 12 Unit 1 (5-1/2" square unfinished).



In the same manner, make 12 each Units 2-4 with fabrics indicated.




Refer to Panel Throw Make 12 Make 12 Make 12 Layout (Page 3) for arrangement and placement of panel, strips, units, and borders.

4. Stitch Fabric D 2-1/4" x width of fabric strips to sides of the Fabric A panel. Trim strip ends even. Add 2-3/4" x 28" Fabric D strips to top and bottom of panel. Trim bordered panel to 25-1/2" x 45-1/2" (unfinished).

Center Fabric B 9-1/2" x 67" borders on right and left sides of quilt center and Fabric B 9-1/2"x 47" borders on top and bottom of quilt center with the blue star stripe next to guilt 1/4" center. Stitch borders to sides starting and stopping detail 1/4" from corners of quilt center. Do not trim. Press 8 Quilt borders out. \rightarrow Center

> Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric. Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints.

6. Working with 1 corner at a time, fold the quilt right sides together so the outside edges of the borders line up. Using a 45-degree ruler, mark from the end of border seams to outer edges of borders. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner seam open. Repeat on remaining corners.



- 7. Stitch **Fabric D** 1-1/2"x 63-1/2" borders to right and left sides of quilt. Add **Fabric D** 1-1/2" x 45-1/2" borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- Arrange 13 units in vertical rows on right and left sides of quilt. Stitch into vertical borders (5-1/2"x 65-1/2" unfinished). Sew to right and left sides of quilt.
- Arrange 11 units in horizontal rows on top and bottom of quilt. Stitch into horizontal borders (5-1/2" x 55-1/2" unfinished). Sew to top and bottom of quilt.
- 10. Sew 1-1/2" x 75-1/2" Fabric G borders to right and left sides of quilt. Add 1-1/2" x 58-1/2" Fabric G borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- 11. Sew 3"x 78-1/2" **Fabric F** borders to right and left sides of quilt. Add 3"x 63-1/2" **Fabric F** borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- 12. The Panel Throw quilt measures approximately 63-1/2" x 83-1/2" (unfinished). Make backing (**Fabric I**) approximately 8" larger than the top.
- Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (Fabric E) and enjoy!!

3. Cut the following for Star Throw:

Refer to thumbrails on pattern cover for Fabrics A-I used in this design.

- Fabric A Referring to the quilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (2) 9-1/2"x 78" and (2) 9-1/2"x 71-1/2" multi-stripe borders
- Fabric B Fussy cut (4) 8" and (5) 5-1/2" squares with motifs centered
- Fabric C Cut (1) 8-3/8" strip, subcut (4) 8-3/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for a total of 8 triangles

 Cut (1) 6-1/4" strip, subcut (4) 6-1/4" squares then cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 16 triangles


 Cut (2) 5-1/2" strips, subcut (12) 5-1/2" squares

- Fabric C (continued)
 - Cut (3) 3" strips, sewn together end to end then cut into (2) 3"x 47-1/2" borders. From remaining strip cut (1) 1-1/2"x 10" strip.
 - Cut (2) 1-1/2" strips, sewn together and to end with (1) 1-1/2" x 10" strip and cut into (2) 1-1/2" x 45-1/2" borders
- Fabric D Cut (1) 8-3/8" strip, subcut (2) 8-3/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for a total of 4 triangles
- Fabric E Cut (1) 8-3/8" strip, subcut (2) 8-3/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for a total of 4 triangles
- Cut (1) 6-1/4" strip, subcut (5) 6-1/4" squares then cut in half diagonally twice of for a total of 20 triangles
- Cut (3) 3-1/2" strips, sewn together end to end then cut into (2) 3-1/2"x 50" borders. From remaining strip cut (1) 1-3/4"x 20" strip.
- Cut (2) 1-3/4" strips, sewn together end to end with (1) 1-3/4" x 20" strip and cut into (2) 1-3/4" x 50-1/2" borders
- Fabric F Cut (1) 6-1/4" strip, subcut (5) 6-1/4" squares then cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 20 triangles
 Cut (8) 2-1/2" strips (binding)
- Fabric G Cut (2) 6-1/4" strips, subcut
 (8) 6-1/4" squares [then cut in half
 diagonally for a total of 16 triangles],
 (1) 6-1/4" square [then cut in half
 diagonally twice for a total of 4 triangles],
 and (1) 5-1/2" square
 Cut (1) 5-1/2" strip, subcut (7) 5-1/2"
 squares
- Fabric H Cut (1) 6-1/4" strip, subcut (5) 6-1/4" squares then cut in half diagonally twice for a total of 20 triangles

PANEL THROW LAYOUT



4. Piecing Order for Star Throw:


 Arrange 4 Fabric G 6-1/4" half-square 📝 triangles around a Fabric B 8" square as shown. Stitch triangles to square. Add 2 Fabric C and 1 each Fabrics D and E 8-3/8" triangles as shown to make Block 1a






Arrange 4 Unit 1a, 1 Fabric B 5-1/2" square, 1 Fabric G 5-1/2" square, and 3 Fabric C 5-1/2" squares in 3 rows as shown. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together to make Block 2a (15-1/2" square unfinished).




In the same manner, make 1 each Blocks 2b-2d.

- 5. In the same manner, make 1 Block 3 using the squares and units indicated.
- 6. Refer to Star Throw Layout (Page 5) for arrangement and placement of blocks and borders.



Block 3 - Make 1

- Arrange blocks in 3 rows. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together to complete guilt center (45-1/2" square unfinished).
- 8. Sew 1-1/2"x 45-1/2" Fabric C borders to right and left sides of guilt center. Add 3"x 47-1/2" Fabric C borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- 9. Sew 1-3/4"x 50-1/2" Fabric E borders to right and left sides of guilt. Add 3-1/2" x 50" Fabric E borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- Center Fabric A 9-1/2" x 78" borders on right and left sides of guilt and Fabric A 9-1/2" x 71-1/2" borders on top and bottom of guilt with the blue star stripe next to guilt center. Referring to Steps 5 and 6 in Piecing Order for Panel Throw Quilt, finish adding the mitered border.
- 11. The Star Throw measures approximately 68" x 74-1/2" (unfinished). Make backing (Fabric I) approximately 8" larger than the top.
- 12. Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (Fabric F) and enjoy!!
