
How sweet! These delicate daisies bring an air of Spring to any room, and the daisy applique is a wonderful finishing touch. A charming way to welcome the season.

Finished Size: 40" x 40"



Fields of Daisies

Materials needed:

3/4 yard for the border & binding- Butterfly Tonal #7682-50 Blue 3/8 yard for the sashing- Daisy Scroll Stripe #7684-44 Green (1/2 yd. if fussy cut) 2-1/2" strip for the corners- Leaves & Berries Tonal #7686-50 Blue

1/4 yard of each for the Blocks:

Daisies #7683-50 Blue Daisies #7683-77 Mocha Daisies #7683-99 Multi

Appliqué:

1/8 yard of white #7686-07 Cream (flowers)
1" strip of #7685-33 Yellow (flower centers)
2" strip of medium green #7685-44 green (leaves)
2" strip of dark green #7686-44 green (stems)

Cutting Directions

Cut from the 3 different daisy fabrics

3 8~1/2" squares

Cut from the green sashing fabric

5 2~1/2" strips

Then from that -cut

24 2~1/2" x 8~1/2" Strips

Cut from dark blue colored corner fabric

16 2~1/2" squares


Cut from blue butterfly fabric


4 - 1/2" x WOF for the border

4 2-1/4" x WOF for the binding

Sewing Directions

- 1. Line up the top row with four blue colored 2~1/2" squares and three green striped 2~1/2" x 8~1/2" strips. See A.
- 2. Sew the row across and repeat for three more rows.
- 3. Line up the second row as shown then sew the striped 2-1/2" X 8-1/2" sashing strips down each side of the three different colored 8-1/2" squares. See B.
- 4. Press each row in the opposite direction.
- 5. Repeat for two more rows.
- 6. Sew rows A and B together. See C.
- 7. Line up the rest of the rows and sew across.
- 8. Sew all of the rows together.
- 9. Sew the 4-1/2" X WOF border strips down each side and trim the edges.
- 10. Sew the 4-1/2" X WOF border strips across the top and bottom and trim the edges.





Quick Fuse Appliqué

- 1. Trace and label the appliqué pieces on the fusible web paper.
- 2. Peel off the paper backing and press each piece to the wrong side of fabrics.
- 3. Cut out the pieces.
- 4. Peel off the remaining paper and position the pieces to the top.
- 5. Press firmly with your hands to hold until ironing.
- 6. Press with an iron following your Manufacturer's directions. Cool completely.
- 7. Stitch around each piece with a decorative stitch at this time, if desired.

Finishing

- 1. Lay the pieced top on a layer of quilt batting and backing fabric.
- 2. Hand-quilt or quilt on the sewing machine.
- 3. Sew the four binding strips end to end to make a continuous strip for the binding.
- 4. You will need approx. 162" of binding.
- 5. Fold in half lengthwise with right sides out and press flat.
- 6. Pin the strip around the edge of the pieced top with the raw edges to the outside edge of the quilt top.
- 7. Sew the binding face down to the top and miter each corner.
- 8. Overlap the ends.
- 9. Fold over to the back and pin in place. Hand-stitch to the back.
