| 1 1/2 yards | Stripe - Lt. Blue (H) | 9124-11 |
| 4 1/3 yards | Homes - Lt. Blue (Backing) | 9128-11 |

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the Large Scenic - Lt. Blue (A), cut:

- (1) 20 1/2" x 16 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) rectangle.

From the Urban Legend - Navy (B), cut:

- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 2 1/2" x 56 1/2" strips.
- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2 1/2" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 2 1/2" x 20 1/2" strips.

From the Pine Trees - Green (C), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (18) 4 1/2" squares.

From the Cardinals - Blue (D), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 4 1/2" squares.
- (1) 8 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 8 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Horses - Brown (E), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x 72" LOF strips.
- (2) 4 1/2" x 68" LOF strips.

From the Urban Legend - Green (F), cut:

- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Splash - Cardinal (G), cut:

- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips.

From the Stripe - Lt. Blue (H), cut:

- (2) 4 1/2" x 48" LOF strips.
- (2) 4 1/2" x 44" LOF strips.

From the Homes - Lt. Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 76" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 72" x 76" back.

Sewing Instructions

1. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric F strip and (1) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric G strip together lengthwise to make (1) FG strip set (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (5) FG strip sets total.

2. Cut the FG strip sets into (76) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Unit 1 strips (Fig. 2).

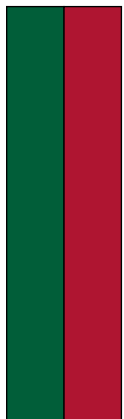
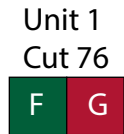

3. Sew (2) Unit 1 strips together lengthwise to make (1) Unit 2 block (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (34) Unit 1 blocks total.

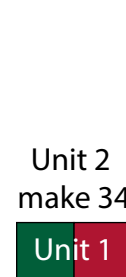

4. Sew (4) Unit 1 strips together lengthwise to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second Unit 3 strip.

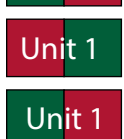

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)

5. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 20 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 16 1/2" x 20 1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 20 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block.

6. Sew (1) Unit 2 block, (1) 4 1/2" Fabric D square, (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) 4 1/2" Fabric C square and (1) Unit 2 block together in that order. Sew the new strip to the left side of the Center Block.

7. Sew (1) Unit 2 block, (1) 4 1/2" Fabric C square, (1) Unit 3 strip, (1) 4 1/2" Fabric D square and (1) Unit 2 block together in that order. Sew the new strip to the right side of the Center Block.

8. Sew (1) 4 1/2" Fabric C square, (1) Unit 2 block, (1) 4 1/2" Fabric D square, (1) Unit 2 block, (1) 4 1/2" Fabric C square, (1) Unit 2 block and (1) 4 1/2" Fabric D square together in that order. Sew the new strip to the top of the Center Block.

9. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square, (1) Unit 2 block, (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square, (1) Unit 2 block, (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square, (1) Unit 2 block and (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square together in that order. Sew the new strip to the bottom of the Center Block.

10. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

11. Center (1) 4 ½" x 48" Fabric H strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

12. Repeat Step 11 to sew (1) 4 ½" x 44" Fabric H to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 5).

13. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 5), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners.

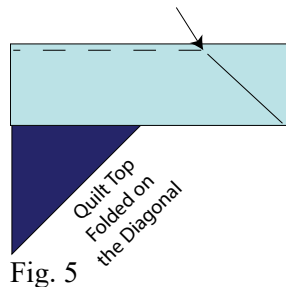

14. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Sew (1) Unit 2 block to each end of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric D strip. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) Unit 2 block to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) Unit 2 block to each end of the new strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) Unit 2 block to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) Unit 2 block to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) Unit 2 block to each end of the new strip. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square to each end of the new strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Center (1) 4 ½" x 72" Fabric E strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

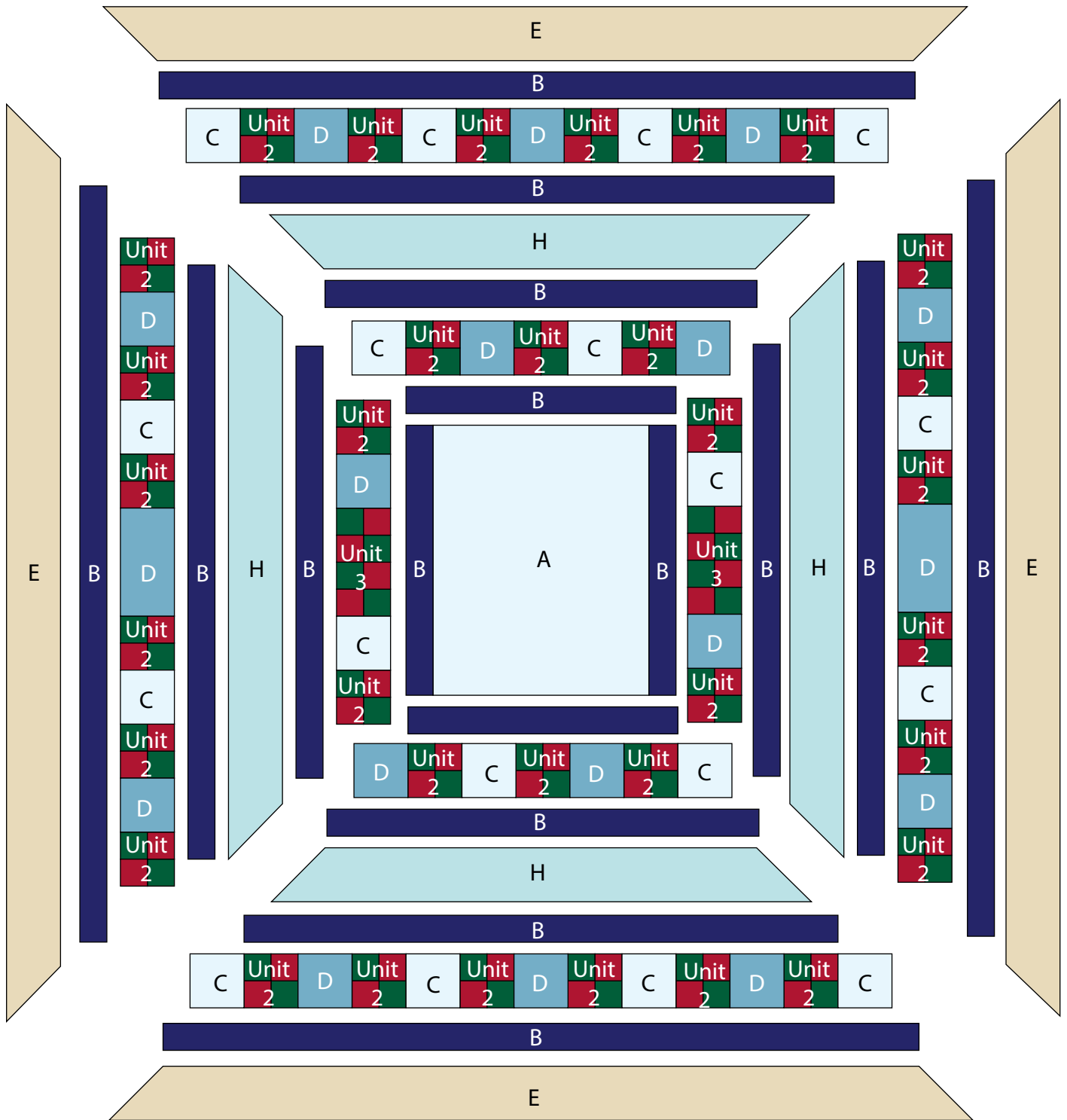
19. Repeat Step 18 to sew (1) 4 ½" x 68" Fabric E to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 5).

20. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 5), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

21. Layer and quilt as desired.

22. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

23. Bind as desired.
