Four-Fabric Version:

A B 2 1/4 yards 2 1/4 yards

Panel (10" to 14" sq. or rect.) 2/3 yard (panel)

Pillow (non-directional) 2/3 yard

Two-Fabric Version:

A B 2 3/4 yards 2 3/4 yards

Basic Quillow

Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning. All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvage to selvage, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following for Two-Fabric Version:

Fabric A - Cut (1) 71" x WOF (width of fabric) piece

Cut (1) 19" strip, subcut (1) 19" square

Fabric B - Cut (1) 71"x WOF (width of fabric) piece


Cut (1) 19" strip, subcut (1) 19" square

2. Piecing Order for Two-Fabric Version:

- 1. Determine which of Fabrics A or B 71" x WOF pieces is the widest. Place this piece, or either piece if the same width, right side up on a 48"x 75" piece of guilt batting. Place the second 71" x WOF piece right side down on the first piece, aligning edges as much as possible. Pin layers together.
- With a 1/2" seam allowance stitch around all edges being sure side seams do not include selvage edges. Leave an 8"-10" opening on bottom edge for turning.




- 3. Trim excess fabric and batting. Trim corner seam allowances to 1/4".
- 4. Turn right sides out. Push out all sides and corners. Press flat. Stitch opening closed. Quilt or tie as desired.
- 5. Place a 21" piece of batting on a flat surface. Center Fabric A 19" square right side up on batting. Place Fabric B 19" square right side down on Fabric A square, aligning all edges. Pin layers together.



- Cont. Sew around all edges with 1/2" seam leaving a 4-6" opening for turning. Trim batting even. Turn right sides out. Push out all sides and corners. Press flat. Stitch opening closed. Quilt or tie pillow top as desired.
- 6. Arrange pillow top Fabric A side up on Fabric A side of guilt. Align centered on bottom edge. If Fabric A is directional, have

both quilt and pillow top print orientated to top. Stitch around sides and bottom of pillow top, backstitching to secure at top edges. Finished Ouilt-Pillow is



approximately 42" x 70".

Arrow indicates orientation of directional print if used.


7. To fold quilt into a pillow, place Fabric B side up on a flat surface. Fold the long edges toward center so the entire piece is the width of the pillow top.



8. Turn the pillow right side out so it encloses the bottom Α of the quilt.



Fold the guilt as shown and tuck it into the pocket. Enjoy!!

Basic Quillow

1. Cut the following for Four-Fabric Version:


Fabric A - Cut (1) 71"x WOF (width of fabric) piece

Fabric B - Cut (1) 71"x WOF (width of fabric) piece


Fabric C - Fussy cut 1/4" beyond outside edges of 1 panel from 10" to 14-1/2" square Fabric D - Cut (1) 19" strip, subcut (1) 19" square, (2) 5-1/2" x 19" strips and (2) 5-1/2" x 15" strips

2. Piecing Order for Four-Fabric Version:

1. Stitch Fabric D
5-1/2" x 15" strips to
right and left sides of
Fabric C panel. Trim
strip ends even. Trim
to 19" wide. Sew
Fabric D 5-1/2" x 19"
strips to top and bottom
of panel. Trim bordered
panel to 19" square
(unfinished).



2. Place a 21" piece of batting on a flat surface. Center bordered panel right side up on batting. Place **Fabric D** 19" square right side down on bordered panel, aligning all edges. Pin layers




together. Sew around all edges with 1/2" seam leaving a 4-6" opening for turning. Turn right sides out. Push out all sides and corners. Trim batting even. Press flat. Stitch opening closed. Quilt or tie pillow top as desired.

Arrow indicates orientation of directional prints if used.

- Referring to Two-Fabric Version, follow Steps 1-3 to make the quilt.
- Arrange pillow top Fabric D side up on Fabric A side of quilt. Align centered on bottom edge. If Fabric A is directional, have

both quilt and pillow panel orientated to top. Stitch around sides and bottom of pillow top, backstitching to secure at top edges. Finished Quilt-Pillow is



approximately 42"x 70".

Referring to Two-Fabric Version, follow Steps 7-9 to fold the quilt.
