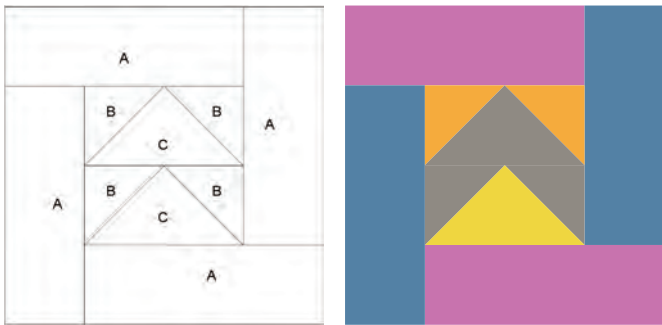
ROUND 2



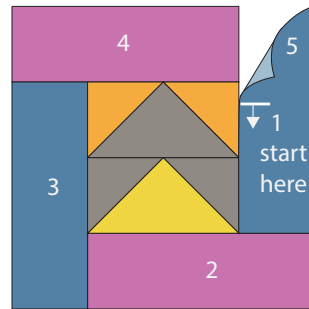
WHAT YOU'LL NEED

For fabric choices refer to the block diagram

- A:** 4 rectangles 5" x 2"
- B:** 4 squares 2" x 2"
- C:** 2 rectangles 3 1/2" x 2"

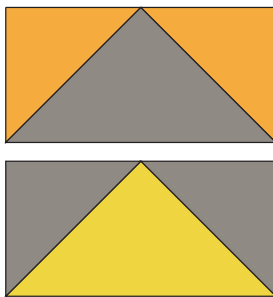


2. Arrange four A rectangles and center unit as shown. Attach first A rectangle with a partial seam: Start with the seam only about 2" apart from the edge and stitch to the end of the seam. Flip upper part of A rectangle backwards and pin. Attach remaining A rectangles. Flip back first A rectangle in place and close the seam to complete the block. Join the rows and press to complete the block. Block measures 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".

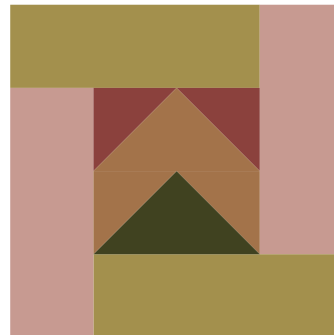


ASSEMBLY

1. Referring to BASIC INSTRUCTIONS stitch and flip technique make two flying-geese units with the B squares and C rectangles. They should measure 3 1/2" x 2". Join both flying geese units to make the center unit.
