





Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (4451-44 Rooster Blocks - Cream):

• Fussy cut (6) 10 ½" squares each centered on a block.

Fabric B (4453-43 Farm Damask - Cream/Sepia), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 2" x 10 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x 10 ½" LOF strips.
- (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 3/8" squares and (8) 3" squares.

Fabric C (Ink-45 Peppered Cottons - Ink), cut:

- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (1) 3 %" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 %" squares.
- (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 5 ½" squares.

Fabric D (4453-99 Farm Damask - Black), cut:

- (12) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 14 ½" strips.
- (24) 1 ½" x 14 ½" LOF strips.
- (1) 3 3/8" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 3/8" squares and (8) 3" squares.
- (80) Template 1 shapes.
- (80) Template 3 shapes.

Fabric E (4453-88 Farm Damask - Red), cut:

- (15) Template 2 shapes with fabric running horizontal.
- (16) Template 2 shapes with fabric running vertical.

Fabric F (4454-44 Roosters Toss - Cream), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2" squares.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (120) 1 ½" squares.
- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (20) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric G (Bright Kiwi-64 Peppered Cottons - Bright Kiwi), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3" x 5 ½" strips.
- (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3" squares.

Fabric H (4455-88 Plaid - Red), cut:

- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (12) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

Fabric I (4459-44 Small Veggies - Cream), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (16) 3" squares.
- (2) 3" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 3" x $5\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Fabric J (4457-88 Daisy Toss - Red), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 2" x 10 ½" strips.
- (1) 3 3%" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 3%" squares and (8) 3" squares.

Fabric K (Lagoon-78 Peppered Cottons - Lagoon), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

Cutting - Continued

Fabric L (4457-99 Daisy Toss - Black), cut:

• (1) 3 %" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 3 %" squares and (8) 3" squares.

Fabric M (Emerald-30 Peppered Cottons - Emerald), cut:

• (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 2" x 10 ½" strips.

Fabric N (4456-44 Barn Wood - Cream), cut:

- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding. **CUT FIRST**
- (2) 4" x 86 ½" LOF strips. **CUT SECOND**

From the remaining fabric, cut:

- (6) 1 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (8) 1 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (4) 3 %" squares.
- (16) 3" squares.
- (4) 1 ½" squares.
- (2) 4" x 73 ½" strips, piece as needed.
- (10) Template 4 triangles with fabric stripe running horizontal.
- (8) Template 4 triangles with fabric stripe running vertical.

Backing (4452-44 Veggie Toss - Cream), cut:


• (2) 101" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 81" x 101" to make the back.


Sewing


Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 ½" LOF Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" Fabric F square to each end of (1) 2" x 10 ½" WOF Fabric B strip to make (1) FBF strip. Repeat to make a second FBF strip. Sew (1) FBF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Trim unit to measure 12 ½" square.
- 2. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to make (1) FCF strip. Repeat to make a second FCF strip. Sew (1) FCF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 2).
- 3. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 14 ½" LOF Fabric D strip to each side of the Unit 2 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 ½" x 14 ½" WOF Fabric D strip to make (1) FDF strip. Repeat to make a second FDF strip. Sew (1) FDF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 3).








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4. Repeat Steps 1-3 and refer to Figures 4-7 for fabric identifications and placements to make (2) Block Two squares, (1) Block Three square, (1) Block Four square and (1) Block Five square.



5. Place (1) 3 %" Fabric N square on top of (1) 3 %" Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 8). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 8). Cut the two squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 9) to make two Unit 3 squares (Fig. 10). Trim blocks to measure 3" square. Repeat to make (8) Unit 3 squares total.

6. Place (1) 3" Fabric I square on the top left corner of (1) 5 ½" Fabric C square, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 12). Unit 4





Fig. 13 Fig. 14

7. Follow Figure 13 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric I square to each of the remaining corners of the 5 ½" Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 squares total.

- 8. Place (1) 3" Fabric N square on the left side of (1) 3" x 5 ½" Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 15). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 15). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 16).
- 9. Place another 3" Fabric N square on the right side of the 3" x 5 ½" Fabric I strip, right sides together (Fig. 17). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 17). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (8) Unit 5 strips total.











- 10. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 square. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make (1) Top Unit strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Repeat to make (1) Bottom Unit strip. Sew (1) Top Unit strip and (1) Bottom Unit strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 4 square to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 19). Pay attention to the strip orientations. Repeat to make a second Unit 6 square.
- 11. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to each side of (1) Unit 6 square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to make (1) FGF strip. Repeat to make a second FGF strip. Sew (1) FGF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 6 square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make a second Unit 7 square.
- 12. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Unit 7 square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to make (1) FHF strip. Repeat to make a second FHF strip. Sew (1) FHF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 7 square to make (1) Unit 8 square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make a second Unit 8 square.
- 13. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 14 ½" LOF Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 8 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 ½" x 14 ½" WOF Fabric D strip to make (1) FDF strip. Repeat to make a second FDF strip. Sew (1) FDF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 8 square to make (1) Block Six square (Fig. 22). Repeat to make a second Block Six square.



- 14. Repeat Step 5 using (4) 3 3/8" Fabric B squares and (4) 3 3/8" Fabric J squares to make (8) 3" Unit 9 squares (Fig. 23).
- 15. Repeat Step 5 using (4) 3 3/8" Fabric L squares and (4) 3 3/8" Fabric D squares to make (8) 3" Unit 10 squares (Fig. 24).
- 16. Sew (1) Unit 9 square to the right side of (1) Unit 10 square to make (1) Bottom Unit strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew (1) Unit 9 square to the left side of (1) Unit 10 square to make (1) Top Unit strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew the Top Unit strip to the Bottom Unit strip to make (1) Unit 11 square (Fig. 25). Repeat to make a second Unit 11 square.



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17. Repeat Steps 8-9 and refer to Figures 26-27 for fabric identification and placements to make (4) Unit 12 strips and (4) Unit 13 strips.



- 18. Sew (1) Unit 13 strip to each side of (1) Unit 11 square. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew (1) 3" Fabric G square to each end of (1) Unit 12 strip to make (1) Top Unit strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Repeat to make (1) Bottom Unit strip. Sew (1) Top Unit strip and (1) Bottom Unit strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 11 square to make (1) Unit 14 square (Fig. 28). Pay attention to the strip orientations. Repeat to make a second Unit 14 square.
- 19. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric K strip to each side of (1) Unit 14 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric K strip to make (1) FKF strip. Repeat to make a second FKF strip. Sew (1) FKF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 14 square to make (1) Unit 15 square (Fig. 29).
- 20. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of (1) Unit 15 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric H strip to make (1) FHF strip. Repeat to make a second FHF strip. Sew (1) FHF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 15 square to make (1) Unit 16 square (Fig. 30).
- 21. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 14 ½" LOF Fabric D strip to each side of (1) Unit 16 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" Fabric F square to each end of (1) 1 ½" x 14 ½" WOF Fabric D strip to make (1) FDF strip. Repeat to make a second FDF strip. Sew (1) FDF strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 16 square to make (1) Block Seven square (Fig. 31).



22. Repeat Steps 19-21 and refer to Figure 32 for fabric identification and placements to make (1) Block Eight square.



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23. Sew (1) Unit 9 square to the right side of (1) Unit 10 square to make (1) Bottom Unit strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew (1) Unit 9 square to the left side of (1) Unit 10 square to make (1) Top Unit strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew the Top Unit strip to the Bottom Unit strip to make (1) Unit 17 square (Fig. 33). Repeat to make a second Unit 17 square.

24. Repeat Steps 8-9 and refer to Figures 34-35 for fabric identification and placements to make (4) Unit 18 strips and (4) Unit 19 strips.






25. Sew (1) Unit 18 strip to each side of (1) Unit 17 square. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Sew (1) 3" Fabric G square to each end of (1) Unit 19 strip to make (1) Top Unit strip. Pay attention to the unit orientations. Repeat to make (1) Bottom Unit strip. Sew (1) Top Unit strip and (1) Bottom Unit strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 17 square to make (1) Unit 20 square (Fig. 36). Pay attention to the strip orientations. Repeat to make a second Unit 20 square.

26. Repeat Steps 19-21 and refer to Figures 37-38 for fabric identification and placements to make (1) Block Nine square and (1) Block Ten square.





27. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 1 piece to the upper right corner of (1) WOF Fabric E-Template 2 piece. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 1 piece to the lower left corner of the Fabric E piece. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 3 piece to the upper left corner and to the lower right corner of the Fabric E piece to make (1) Unit 21 strip (Fig. 39). Repeat to make (15) Unit 21 strips total.

28. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 1 piece to the upper right corner of (1) LOF Fabric E-Template 2 piece. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 1 piece to the lower left corner of the Fabric E piece. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 3 piece to the upper left corner and to the lower right corner of the Fabric E piece to make (1) Unit 22 strip (Fig. 40). Repeat to make (16) Unit 22 strips total.







- 29. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 1 piece to the left side of (1) WOF Fabric N-Template 4 piece. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 3 piece to the right side of the Fabric N piece to make (1) Unit 23 strip (Fig. 41). Repeat to make (8) Unit 23 strips total.
- 30. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 1 piece to the left side of (1) LOF Fabric N-Template 4 piece. Sew (1) Fabric D-Template 3 piece to the right side of the Fabric N piece to make (1) Unit 24 strip (Fig. 42). Repeat to make (10) Unit 24 strips total.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

31. Sew together (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N squares, (4) Unit 23 strips and (3) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N strips to make Row One (Fig. 43). Pay attention to the unit orientations. Repeat to make Row Eleven.



32. Sew together (2) Unit 24 strips, (4) 4 ½" Fabric F squares and (3) Unit 21 strips to make Row Two (Fig. 44). Pay attention to the unit orientations. Repeat to make Row Four, Row Six, Row Eight and Row Ten.

- 33. Sew together (2) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $16 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N strips, (4) Unit 22 strips, (1) Block One square, (1) Block Six square and (1) Block Two square to make Row Three.
- 34. Sew together (2) 1 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric N strips, (4) Unit 22 strips, (1) Block Seven square, (1) Block Three square and (1) Block Nine square to make Row Five.
- 35. Sew together (2) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $16 \frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N strips, (4) Unit 22 strips, (1) Block Two square, (1) Block Six square and (1) Block Four square to make Row Seven.
- 36. Sew together (2) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N strips, (4) Unit 22 strips, (1) Block Ten square, (1) Block Five square and (1) Block Eight square to make Row Nine.
- 37. Sew together the (11) rows, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.

38. Sew (1) $4" \times 86 \frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric N strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $4" \times 73 \frac{1}{2}"$ Fabric N strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.


Layering, Quilting and Finishing

39. Press the quilt top and 81" x 101" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.


Binding


40. Cut the ends of the (9) Fabric N binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

41. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
