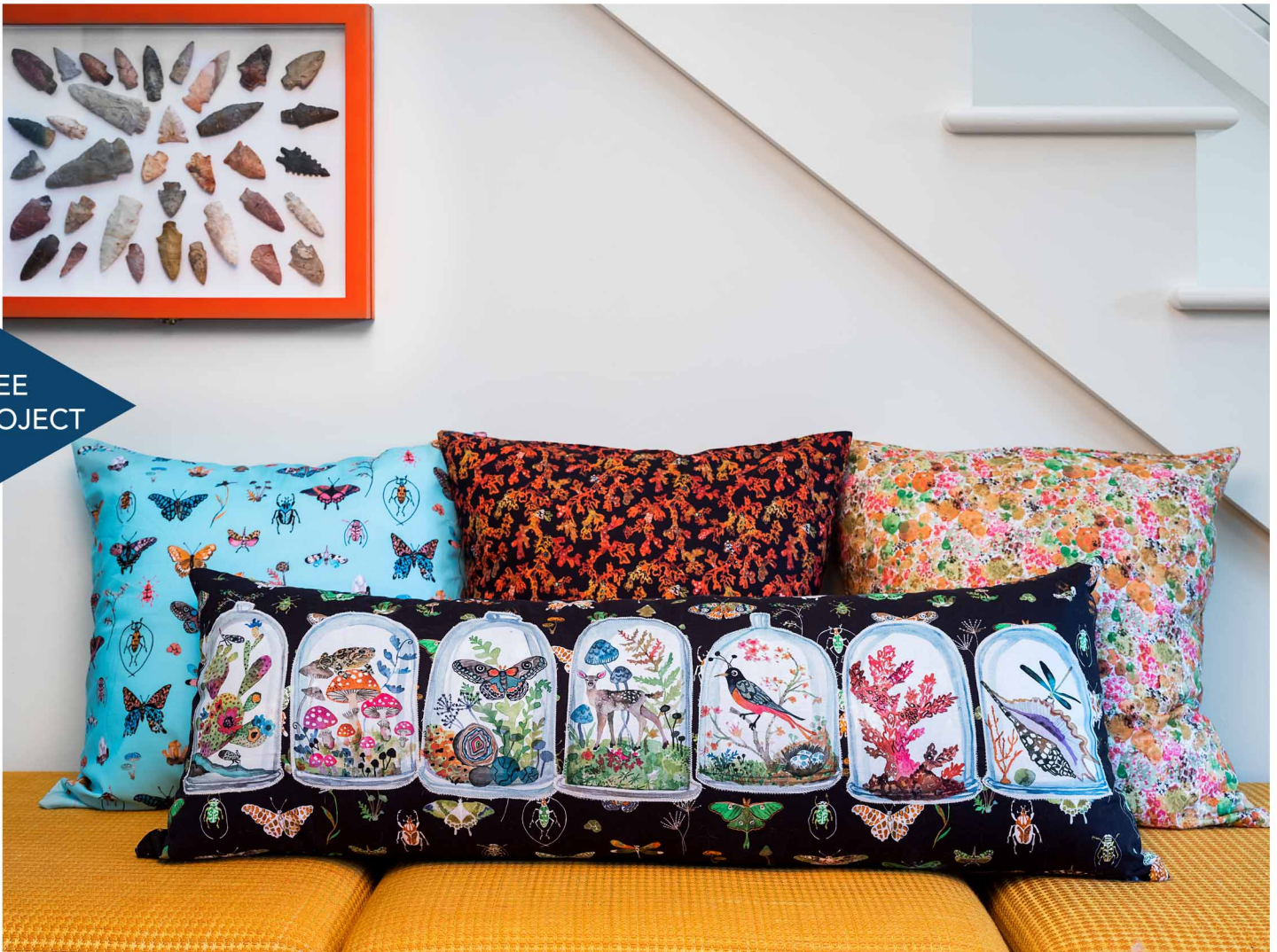

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

Lumbar Pillow

- 1/2 yards black light weight woven fusible (optional)
- 1/2 yard of light weight 2 sided fusible like Misty Fuse®
- (1) 36" x 14" pillow form for insert

16" Square Pillows

- (1) 16" square pillow form for insert for each pillow
- 1/2 yard light weight woven fusible for one pillow or 1 yard for all 3 pillows (optional)



CUTTING:

Lumbar Pillow

From 50864-1 Ink:

- Cut (1) 35 1/2" x 14 1/2" rectangle for face
- Cut (1) 22" x 14 1/2" rectangle for upper back
- Cut (1) 18" x 14 1/2" rectangle for under back

From 50863-X Multi:

- Fussy Cut (1) each of topiary jars pictured above for applique to pillow face

From woven fusible:

- Cut (1) 35 1/2" x 14 1/2" rectangle for face lining (optional)

From 2 sided light weight fusible:

- Fussy Cut to match size of each of the topiary jars to hold in place for applique



Topiary Jars for Lumbar Pillow

Square Pillows

From each fabric 50864-2 Capri, 50866-3 Coral, 50868-1 Ink:

- Cut (1) 16 1/2" x 16 1/2" square for face
- Cut (1) 11" x 16 1/2" rectangle for under back
- Cut (1) 12" x 16 1/2" rectangle for upper back

From woven fusible:

- Cut (1) 16 1/2" x 16 1/2" square for face (optional)



Curio Pillows

ASSEMBLY:

Lumbar Pillow Face

1. With Face of pillow facing up, lay the fussy cut topiary jars + 2-sided fusible across the face of the pillow centering them evenly from top to bottom leaving about 1 3/4" from the sides. Fuse the topiary jars to the face following the manufacturer's recommended instructions. Diagram A

2. With a narrow zigzag stitch, stitch around each topiary jar to secure to the face of the pillow.
3. Optional: With wrong sides together, fuse the woven fusible to the pillow top following the manufacturer's recommended instructions. **Note:** The reason for the fusible is to make a stiffer pillow that looks sturdy but this is truly a matter of choice.

Pillow Back

4. Take 22" x 14 1/2" rectangle of the backing and on one short side, fold fabric toward the wrong side 1/4" and press flat. Fold an additional 1 1/2" and press flat. Edge stitch open edge. Diagram B
5. Take 18" x 14 1/2" rectangle and on one short side, fold fabric toward the wrong side 1/4" and press flat. Fold an additional 1/4" and press flat. Edge stitch open edge. **Special note:** you might want to check the orientation of the print so that the images all face the same direction when you overlap the back hemmed ends.

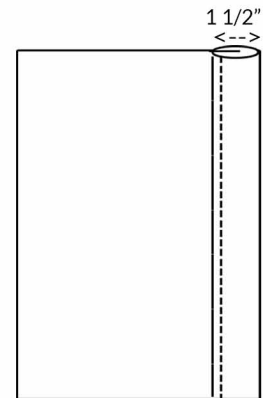
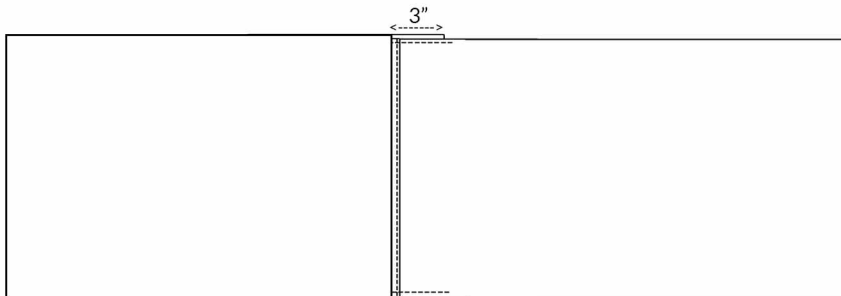

6. With right sides facing down, overlap the narrow hemmed piece on top of the wider hemmed piece so that the final length is 34 1/2". Pin the sides together to hold in place. The overlap is approximately 3 - 3 1/2".
7. Add an edge stitch on each end to hold the overlapped sections in place. Diagram C

Finishing

8. With right sides together, place face on back and sew around the outside of the pillow shell on all 4 sides. Clip corner seam allowance and cover stitch seam allowance edges or add a tight zigzag stitch to prevent raveling.
9. Add a 36" x 14" lumbar pillow form to complete your pillow. **Note:** Pillow shell is slightly smaller than actual pillow form to give a snug fit.

ASSEMBLY:

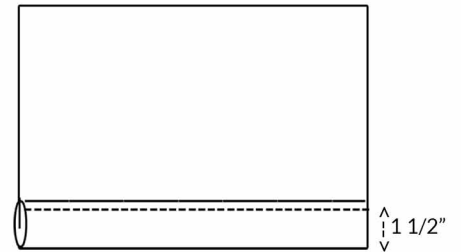
16" Pillow Squares

1. Optional: With wrong sides together, fuse the woven fusible to the face following the manufacturer's recommended instructions. **Note:** *The reason for the fusible is to make a stiffer pillow that looks sturdy but this is truly a matter of personal preference.*

Back

2. Take 12 1/2" x 16 1/2" rectangle of the backing and on one short side, fold fabric toward the wrong side 1/4" and press flat. Fold an additional 1 1/2" and press flat. Edge stitch open edge. Diagram A
3. Take 11" x 16 1/2" rectangle and on one short side, fold fabric toward the wrong side 1/4" and press flat. Fold an additional 1/4" and press flat. Edge stitch open edge. **Special note:** *you might want to check the orientation of the print so that the images all face the same direction when you overlap the back hemmed ends.*

4. With right sides facing down, overlap the small hemmed piece on top of the wider hemmed piece so that the final length is 16 1/2". Pin the sides together to hold in place. The overlap is approximately 3".
5. Add an edge stitch on each end to hold the overlapped sections in place. Diagram B

Finishing

8. With right sides together, place face on back and sew around the outside of the pillow shell on all 4 sides. Clip corner seam allowance and cover stitch seam allowance edges or add a tight zigzag stitch to prevent raveling.
9. Add a 16" pillow form to complete your pillow.

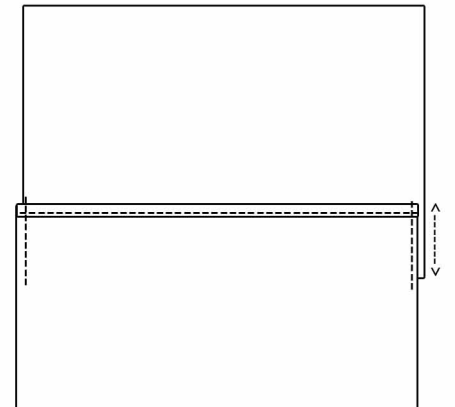
