



Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24" Block Panel - Red/Gray (A), fussy cut:

• (6) 10 ³/₄" squares each centered on a block.

From the Swirl/Vine - Red (B), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 3/4" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 3/4" strips.

From the Swirl/Vine - Green (C), cut:

- (1) 3 ¹/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ¹/₄" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) triangles.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 1 5%" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 5%" x 55 1/4" strips.
- (3) 1 5/8" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 5/8" x 44 1/4" strips.

From the Monotone Scenic - Red (D), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 %" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 %" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (48) triangles.

From the Swirl/Vine - White/Gray (E), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

From the Snowflake - Gray (F), cut:

- (1) 3 ¹/₄" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ¹/₄" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (48) triangles.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 52 1/4" strips.
- (2) 2" x 42" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ³/₄" x 39" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ³/₄" x 12 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Snowflake - Red (G), cut:


- (4) 7" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 7" x 74" strips.
- (4) 7" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 7" x 61" strips.

From the Trucks and Barn Scene - Green (Backing), cut:

• (2) 78" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 65" x 78" back.

Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 ¾"
Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 ¾" Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2" x 13 ¾"
Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. Trim the block to measure 12 ½" square to make (1)
Block One square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



The arrows in Figures 2-9 and Figures 14-17 denote the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the orientation of the fabric as the units are constructed.

2. Follow Figure 2 and sew together (1) Fabric D triangle, (1) Fabric F triangle and (1) Fabric C triangle to make (1) Unit 1 square. Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total. Trim to measure 2 ½" square.

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 3-9 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Unit 2 squares, (6) Unit 3 squares, (6) Unit 4 squares, (6) Unit 5 squares, (6) Unit 6 squares, (6) Unit 7 squares and (6) Unit 8 squares.

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- 4. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square on the top right corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 11). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.
- 5. Follow Figure 12 for the seam direction to add another 2 ½" Fabric E square to the lower left corner and a 2 ½" Fabric C square to the lower right corner (Fig. 13) of the 4 ½" Fabric D square to make (1) Unit 9 square (Fig. 14).
- 6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (6) Unit 9 blocks total.

7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figures 15-17 for fabric identification, placement, orientation and seam direction to make (6) Unit 10 squares, (6) Unit 11 squares and (6) Unit 12 squares.













8. Sew (1) Unit 9 square to the left side of (1) Unit 10 square with the Fabric C corners touching to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 11 square to the left side of (1) Unit 12 square with the Fabric C corners touching to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together to make (1) Unit 13 square (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (6) Unit 13 squares total.



- Refer to Figure 19 when constructing Block Two and pay attention to the orientation of the units.
- 9. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the top of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to the bottom of the Fabric C strip. Sew the new strip to the left side of (1) Unit 13 square.
- 10. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the top of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip. Sew (1) Unit 7 square to the bottom of the Fabric C strip. Sew the new strip to the right side of the Unit 13 square.
- 11. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to the right side of the Fabric C strip. Sew (1) 2 1/2" Fabric F square to each end of the sewn strip. Sew the new strip to the top of the Unit 13 square.
- 12. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to the left side of (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip. Sew (1) Unit 8 square to the right side of the Fabric C strip. Sew (1) 2 1/2" Fabric F square to each end of the sewn strip. Sew the new strip to the bottom of the Unit 13 square to make (1) Block Two square.
- 13. Repeat Steps 9-12 to make (6) Block Two squares total.



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Ton Assembly

Quilt Top Assembly


(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
14. Sew (1) Block One square, (1) 1 3/4" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 3/4" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip and (1) Block One square together in that order to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.

- 15. Sew (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 3/4" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 3/4" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip and (1) Block Two square together in that order to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.
- 16. Sew the (4) rows and (3) 1 ³/₄" x 39" Fabric F strips together, alternating them, to make the Center Block.
- 17. Sew (1) 2" x 52 1/4" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 42" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 18. Sew (1) 1 5/8" x 55 ¼" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 5/8" x 44 ¼" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

Pay Attention to the orientation of the Fabric G outer border.


19. Center (1) 7" x 74" Fabric G strip on one side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ½" from the top edge of the block and stop a ½" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

20. Repeat Step 19 to sew (1) 7" x 61" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 20).



- 21. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 20), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.
- 22. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 23..Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 24. Bind as desired.
