$3 / 4$ yard $\quad$ 1616-88*
$11 / 8$ yards Words - Red/Gray (D)
$3 / 8$ yard Farm Animals - Gray (E) 1621-89
$5 / 8$ yard $\quad$ Snowflake - Red (F)
1 yard Swirl/Vine - White/Gray (G)
$1 / 2$ yard $\quad$ Snowflake - Gray (H)
$3 / 8$ yard Monotone Scenic - Red (I)
$21 / 4$ yards Novelty Stripe - Multi (J)
$41 / 2$ yards Small Scenic - Gray (Backing)

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24" Farm Scene Panel - Red/Gray (A), fussy cut: - (1) $231 / 4$ " $\times 351 / 4 "$ panel.

From the Swirl/Vine - Green (B), cut:
-(2) 2 " x $351 / 4$ " WOF strips.

- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 261 / 4 "$ WOF strips.
-(3) $11 / 2>\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $11 / 2 " \times 561 / 2 "$ strips.
-(3) $11 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $11 / 2 " \times 501 / 2 "$ strips.
-(5) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Swirl/Vine - Red (C), cut:
-(2) $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 381 / 2$ " WOF strips.
-(2) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 321 / 2>$ WOF strips.
-(7) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
From the Words - Red/Gray (D), cut:
- (2) $31 / 2 " \times 381 / 2 "$ Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.

From the Farm Animals - Gray (E), cut:

- (2) $41 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) $41 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Snowflake - Red (F), cut:
-(6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) $21 / 2 "$ squares.

## From the Swirl/Vine - White/Gray (G), cut:

- (3) $41 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) $21 / 2>\times 41 / 2 "$ strips.
-(6) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (88) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Snowflake - Gray (H), cut:
-(3) $41 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips.
From the Monotone Scenic - Red (I), cut:
-(2) $41 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) $41 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Novelty Stripe - Multi (J), cut:

- (2) 7 " x 76 " LOF strips.
-(2) 7 " x 67 " LOF strips.


## From the Small Scenic - Gray (Backing), cut:

- (2) $79 "$ x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 71 " $\times 79$ " back.


## Block Assembly

1. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 351 / 4 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $231 / 4 " \times 351 / 4 "$ " Fabric A panel. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 261 / 4 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. Trim the block to measure $241 / 2 " \times 381 / 2 "$ to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1).
2. Sew (1) $31 / 2 " \times 381 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to each side of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 2).

3. Sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 381 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 2 rectangle. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $321 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 3).


## Quilt 1

4. Place (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric $F$ square on the left side of (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric G strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance (Fig. 5).

5. Place another $21 / 2$ " Fabric F square on the right side of the $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric G strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 7).
6. Repeat Steps $4-5$ to make (48) Unit 3 strips total.
7. Repeat Steps $4-5$ and refer to Figure 8 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (40) Unit 4 strips.

8. Sew (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric G square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) $41 / 2 "$ Fabric E square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 9). Pay attention to the orientation of the units. Repeat to make (12) Block One squares total.

9. Sew (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric G square to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) $41 / 2$ " Fabric I square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 9). Pay attention to the orientation of the units. Repeat to make (10) Block Two squares total.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 10. Sew (3) Block Two squares and (2) Block One squares together, alternating them. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew (1) strip to each side of the Center Block.
11. Sew (1) Block One square, (1) Block Two square, (2) Block One squares, (1) Block Two square and (1) Block One square together in that order. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 561 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 501 / 2$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
13. Center (1) 7 " $\times 76$ " Fabric J strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4$ " from the top edge of the panel and stop a $1 / 4$ " from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
14. Repeat Step 13 to sew (1) 7 " $\times 67$ " Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 11).
15. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 11), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

16. Layer and quilt as desired.
17. Sew the (7) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this
long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
18. Bind as desired.
