### Cutting

<b>Fabric 1</b>	<b>Borders</b> cut (6) 4-1/2" x WOF strips <b>A</b> - Cut (4) 4" X WOF strips Subcut (40) 4" x 4" squares
<b>Fabric 2</b>	<b>B</b> - Cut (2) 4" x WOF strips Subcut (18) 4" x 4" squares <b>C</b> - Cut (14) 3-1/2" x WOF strips Subcut (80) 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles
<b>Fabric 3</b>	<b>B</b> - Cut (2) 4" x WOF strips Subcut (16) 4" x 4" squares <b>D</b> - Cut (6) 3-1/2" x WOF strips Subcut (64) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares <b>F</b> - Cut (3) 3-1/2" x WOF strips Subcut (32) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares
<b>Fabric 4</b>	<b>E</b> - Cut (8) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares
<b>Fabric 5</b>	<b>E</b> - Cut (5) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares
<b>Fabric 6</b>	<b>E</b> - Cut (4) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares
<b>Fabric 7</b>	<b>D</b> - Cut (4) 3-1/2" x WOF strips Subcut (40) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares <b>F</b> - Cut (2) 3-1/2" x WOF strips Subcut (20) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares
<b>Fabric 8</b>	<b>D</b> - Cut (3) 3-1/2" x WOF strips Subcut (32) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares <b>F</b> - Cut (2) 3-1/2" x WOF strips Subcut (16) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares
<b>Fabric 9</b>	<b>B</b> - Cut (1) 4" x WOF strip Subcut (6) 4" x 4" squares <b>D</b> - Cut (3) 3-1/2" x WOF strips Subcut (24) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares <b>F</b> - Cut (1) 3-1/2" x WOF strip Subcut (12) 3-1/2" x 3-1/2" squares
<b>Fabric 10</b>	<b>E</b> - Cut (3) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" squares
<b>Binding</b>	cut (7) 2-1/2 x WOF strips
<b>Backing</b>	For non-directional fabric, cut into (2) pieces and sew together.

## Carnaby Street Quilt – by Maywood Studio

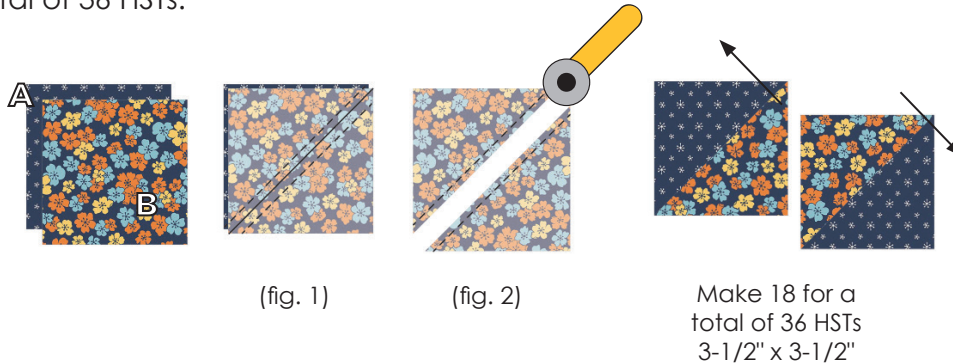
Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4" unless otherwise stated. Use a light sizing/starch on the squares before cutting triangles to help control stretching along the bias edges.

Follow arrows for pressing directions.

### Unit Assembly

#### Make two-at-a-time Half Square Triangle (HST) units

1. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of a (Fabric 2) B square. Place RST over a (Fabric 1) A square. Sew 1/4" away from either side of the marked line. (fig. 1) Cut on the marked line to get two HSTs. (fig. 2) Press toward the Fabric 1 square. Trim to 3-1/2" x 3-1/2". Make 18 for a total of 36 HSTs.



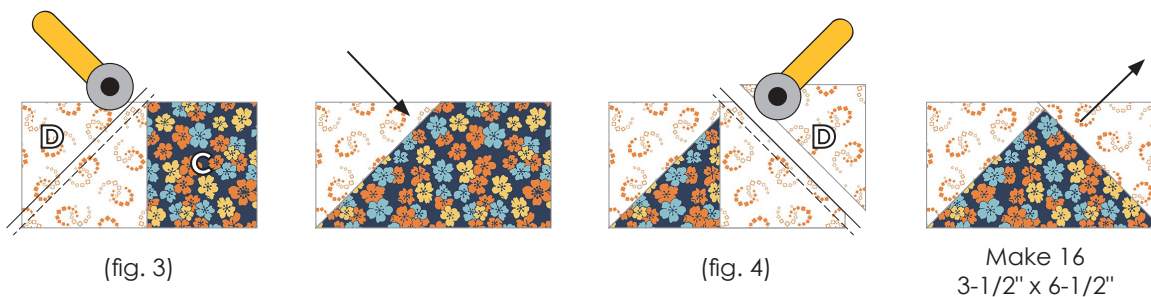
1. Repeat step 1 to make the remaining HST units..



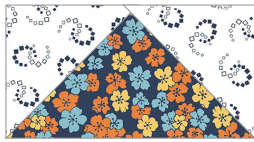
#### Make the Flying Geese units

3. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of 2 (Fabric 8) D squares. Place RST over a (Fabric 2) C rectangle and stitch on the marked line. (fig. 3) Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line. Press in.

4. Place another (Fabric 8) D square RST on the opposite side of the step 1 unit. Stitch on the marked line. Cut 1/4" away from the stitched line. (fig. 4) Press out. Make 16 Flying Geese that finish at 3-1/2" x 6-1/2".



5. Repeat steps 3-4 to make the following Flying Geese units:

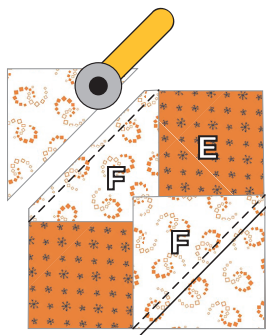

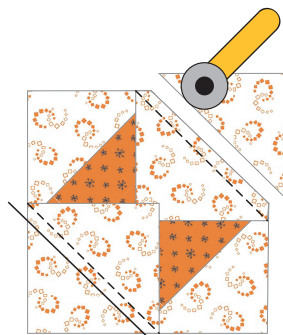
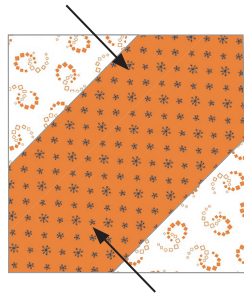

### Make the Square-in-a-Square units

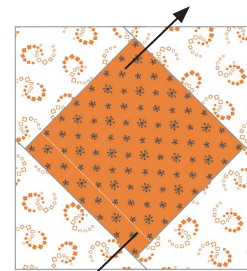
6. Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of 4 (Fabric 8) F squares. Place RST over a (Fabric 6) E square. Sew on the marked line. Trim  $1/4$ " away from the marked line. Press toward center. Repeat on the opposite side. (fig. 5)

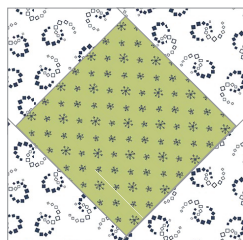

7. Place a (Fabric 8) F square RST over step 6 unit. Sew on the marked line. Repeat on the opposite corner. Trim  $1/4$ " away from the marked lines. Press away from center. (Fig. 6) Square up to  $6\text{-}1/2" \times 6\text{-}1/2"$ . Make 4.

8. Repeat steps 6-7 to make the remaining Square-in-a-Square units.

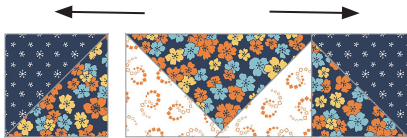

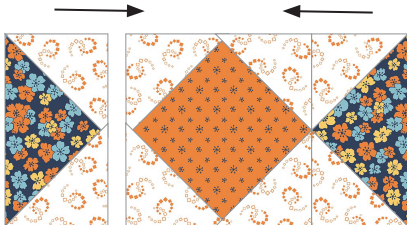

# Block Assembly

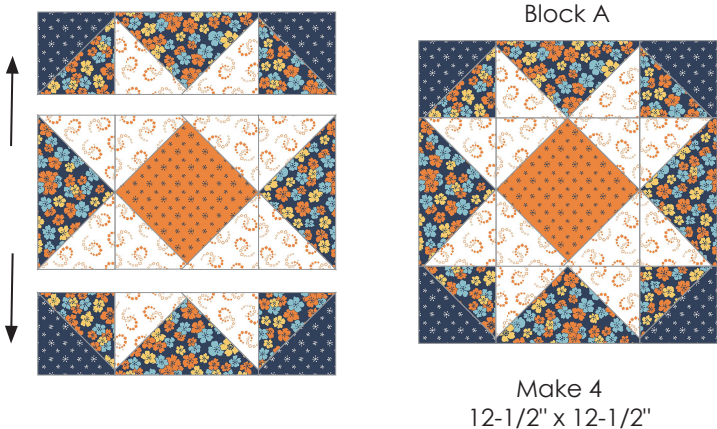
9. Sew a HST to either side of a flying geese unit. Make 2. Press away from center.



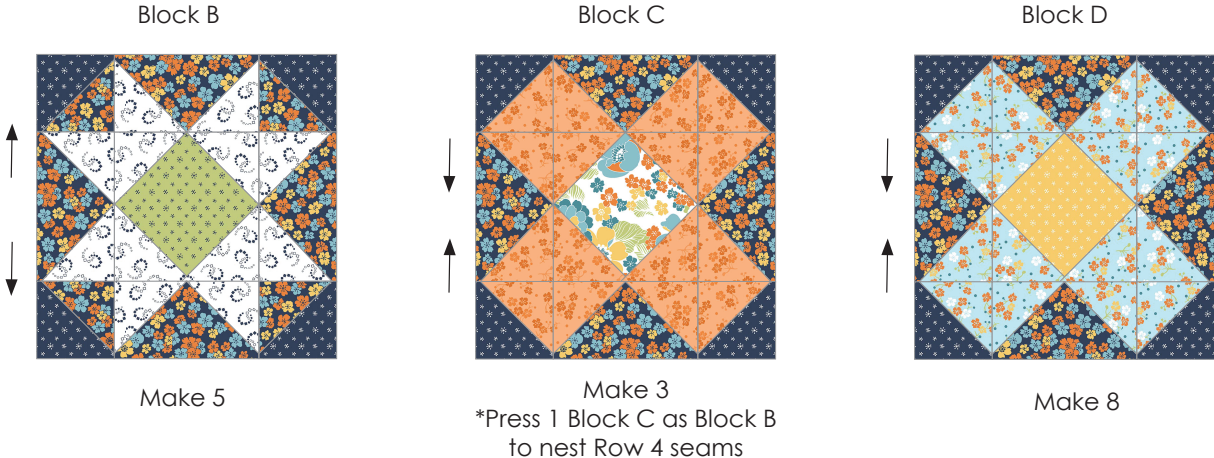
10. Sew a flying geese unit to either side of a Square-in-a-square unit. Make 1. Press towards center.



11. Sew a Step 9 unit to the top and bottom of a step 10 unit. Press away from center. Square up to 12-1/2" x 12-1/2".

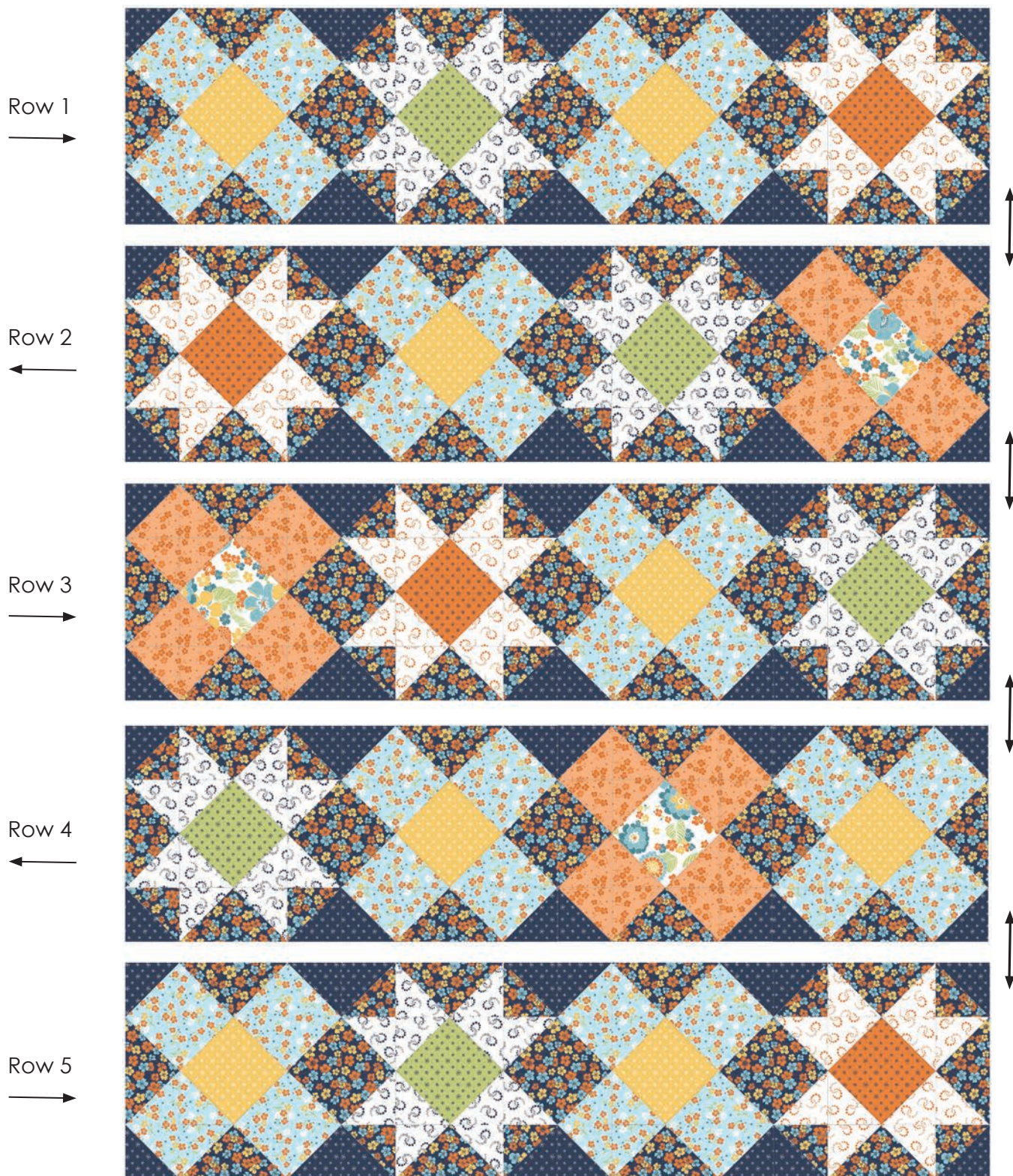


11. Repeat steps 9-11 to make the remaining B-C-D blocks. Follow pressing arrows.



## Row Assembly

7. Sew the blocks into rows following the diagram below. Press rows in opposite directions. Sew row to row. Press open.



8. Side Borders: Measure the length of the quilt through the middle. Piece and trim two (Fabric 1) border strips to this length. Sew to the sides of the quilt. Press.

9. Top and Bottom Borders: Measure the width of the quilt through the middle. Piece and trim two (Fabric 1) border strips to this width. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press.



10. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired.

10. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 3/8" seam allowance, mitering the corners. Trim the excess backing and batting, then turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.
