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- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

- one 6-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 6-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles four 5" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 - twenty-six 5" squares for the large HSTs
- ten 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 4-1/2" x 12-1/2" rectangles four 4-1/2" x 14-1/2" rectangles twenty-four 4-1/2" squares eight 4-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles twenty-four 4-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles
- eight 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred four 3" squares for the small HSTs one 2-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:

eight 2-7/8" squares. Cut each square in half along one diagonal.

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 2-1/2" x 20-1/2" rectangles forty-four 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 5" squares for the large HSTs one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: ten 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric C, cut:

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 5" squares for the large HSTs two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-six 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric D, cut

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: ten 3" squares for the small HSTs Trim the remainder of the strip to 2-1/2" wide. Subcut: four 2-1/2" squares

From Fabric E, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric F, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric G, cut:

one 4-1/2" square

From Fabric H, cut:

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 5" squares for the large HSTs

From Fabric I, cut:

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut: two 5" squares for the large HSTs Trim the remainder of the strip to 3" wide. Subcut: four 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric J, cut:

one 5" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 5" squares for the large HSTs Trim the remainder of the strip to 3" x WOF. Subcut: seven 3" squares one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: nine 3" squares for the small HSTs, for a total of sixteen

From Fabric K, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: two 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric L, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: two 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric M, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric N, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighteen 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric O, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 3" squares for the small HSTs

From Fabric P, cut:


one 4-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 4-7/8" squares. Cut each square in half along a diagonal.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Large Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 5" Fabric A square with a 5" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 4-1/2" square. Repeat this process to make:



sixteen A/B HSTs



eight A/C HSTs



sixteen A/H HSTs



four A/I HSTs



eight A/J HSTs

Assemble the Small Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 2: Pair a 3" Fabric A square with a 3" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat this process to make:



eight A/B HSTs



thirty-two A/C HSTs




eight B/C HSTs



twelve C/D HSTs



eight A/D HSTs



Assemble the Pieced Triangle

Step 3: Gather: one A/M HST two 2-7/8" Fabric A triangles one 4-7/8" Fabric P triangle


Sew the Fabric A triangles to the Fabric M edges of the HST. Press away from the HST. Sew the Fabric P triangle to the long edge of the pieced unit. Press toward the Fabric P triangle. Trim to 4-1/2" square, if needed. Repeat to make eight pieced triangle units.

Assemble the Center Block

Step 4: Gather and arrange the pieces for the Center Block in ten rows of ten, with the 4-1/2" Fabric G square in the center. Carefully confirm the fabric placement and HST orientation against the diagram.

Sew the square together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions every other row. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the row seams to one side.

The Center Block will measure 20-1/2" square.





Assemble the Quilt Columns



Step 5: Sew the five columns of the quilt individually, sewing sections together as indicated to complete each column. Press any seams in columns 1, 3 and 5 up and any seams in columns 2 and 4 down.

Step 6: Sew the five columns of the quilt together, nesting the seams and pressing the column seams open or to one side.

Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
