Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5081-69 Dot – Multi), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 ½" squares.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Body.

Fabric B (5082-90 Tonal Dotted Dots – Gray), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (10) 3 ⅞" triangles.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 ½" squares.
- See instructions to cut (2) Owl Heads.

Fabric C (1351-Orange Just Color! – Orange), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (20) 3 ⅞" triangles.
- See instructions to cut (1) Dragonfly Right Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Dragonfly Left Wing.
- See instructions to cut (3) Owl Beaks.

Fabric D (5076-6 Mushrooms and Snails – Multi), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric E (1351-Teal Just Color! – Teal), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (10) 3 ⅞" triangles.
- See instructions to cut (1) Dragonfly Right Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Dragonfly Left Wing.

Fabric F (1351-Mint Just Color! – Mint), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (10) 3 ⅞" triangles.
- See instructions to cut (1) Dragonfly Right Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Dragonfly Left Wing.

Fabric G (Paprika-32 Peppered Cottons – Paprika), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 3 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (10) 3 ⅞" triangles.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Right Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Left Wing.

Fabric H (5077-6 Tossed Dragonflies – Multi), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 ½" squares.

Fabric I (5080-90 Stripe – Multi), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 ½" squares.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Right Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Left Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Body.

Cutting - Continued

Fabric J (5082-66 Tonal Dotted Dots – Teal), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (10) 3 ½" squares.
- (6) 1 ⅝" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1 ⅝" x 49 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ⅝" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- See instructions to cut (1) Dragonfly Right Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Dragonfly Left Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Head.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Right Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Left Wing.
- See instructions to cut (1) Owl Body.

Fabric K (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (2) 9 ⅞" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 9 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (12) 9 ⅞" triangles.
- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 45 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- See instructions to cut (5) Owl Eye Highlights.
- See instructions to cut (5) Owl Outer Eyes.

Fabric L (Surf-75 Peppered Cottons – Surf):

- See instructions to cut (5) Owl Eye Middles.

Fabric M (1351-Iron Just Color! – Iron):

- See instructions to cut (4) Dragonfly Bodies.
- See instructions to cut (5) Owl Eye Centers.

Fabric N (5073-69 Owls in Hot Air Balloons – Light Gray), cut:

- (1) 9 ⅞" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 9 ⅞" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (8) 9 ⅞" triangles.

Fabric O (5078-90 Novelty Woodland Stripe – Gray), cut:

- (2) 4 ¼" x 49 ½" LOF strips.
- (2) 4 ¼" x 40 ½" LOF strips.

Backing (5072-90 Woodland Patch – Gray), cut:

- (2) 69" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 60" x 69" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Also, pay attention to the unit orientations while assembling the various components.

1. Follow Figure 1 and sew together (3) assorted 3 ½" squares, (3) assorted 3 ⅞" triangles and (1) 9 ⅞" triangle to make (1) Unit 1 square. The block should measure 9 ½" square. Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

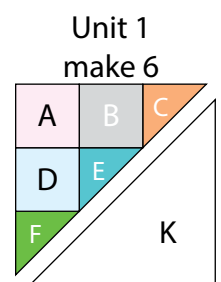

2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 2-4 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (6) 9 ½" Unit 2 square, (4) 9 ½" Unit 3 squares and (4) 9 ½" Unit 4 squares.

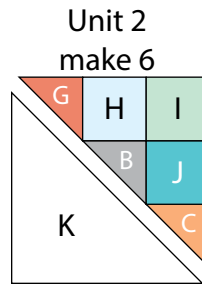

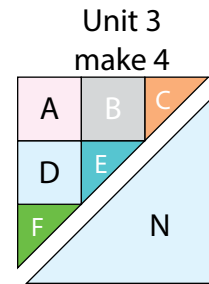

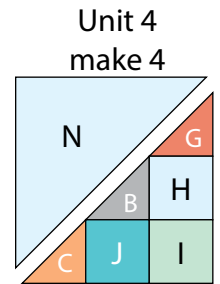

3. Follow Figure 5 and sew together the (20) unit squares into a 4 x 5 matrix to make the Unit 5 rectangle.
4. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
5. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
6. Refer to Figure 6 to arrange and press the components for the (3) Owls onto the Fabric K areas of the Unit 5 rectangle.
7. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the Center Block (Fig. 6).

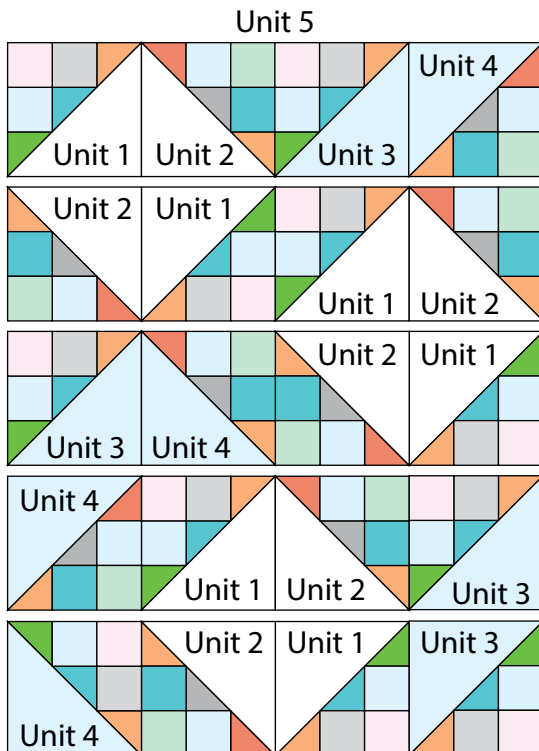

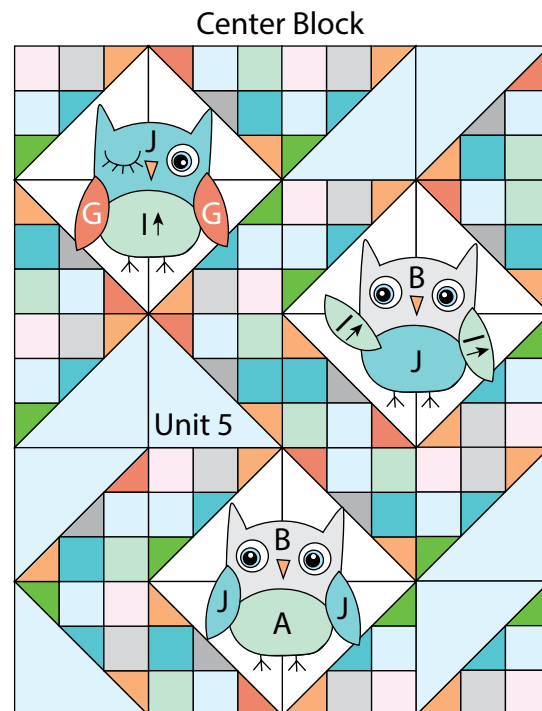

8. Sew (1) $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x $49\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of (1) $4\frac{1}{4}$ " x $49\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric O strip lengthwise to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

9. Repeat Steps 6-7 and refer to Figures 8-11 for component identification, placement and orientation to add the (4) Dragonflies to (4) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric K squares to make (1) Unit 6 square, (1) Unit 7 square, (1) Unit 8 square and (1) Unit 9 square.

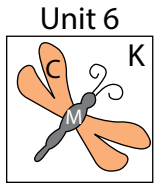

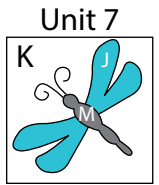

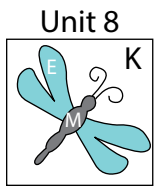

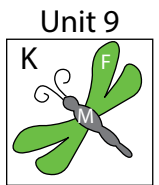

10. Sew (1) $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of (1) $4\frac{1}{4}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric O strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to the left end of the new strip and (1) Unit 7 square to the right end to make the Top Border.

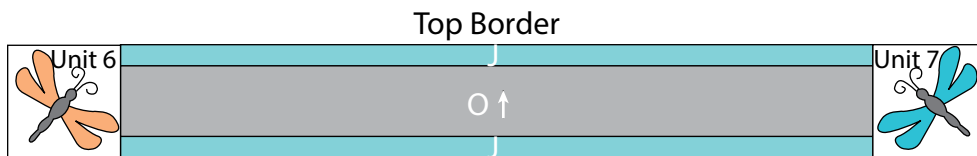

11. Sew (1) $1\frac{5}{8}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to each side of (1) $4\frac{1}{4}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric O strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Unit 8 square to the left end of the new strip and (1) Unit 9 square to the right end to make the Bottom Border.

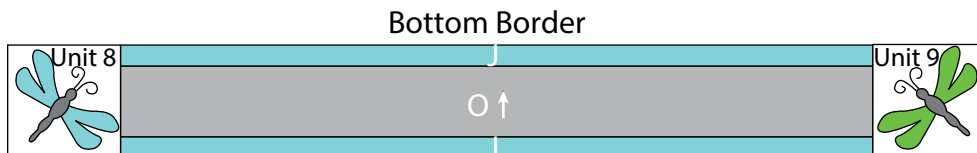

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

12. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 45 ½" Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

14. Sew the Top and Bottom Borders to the Center Block to make the quilt top.

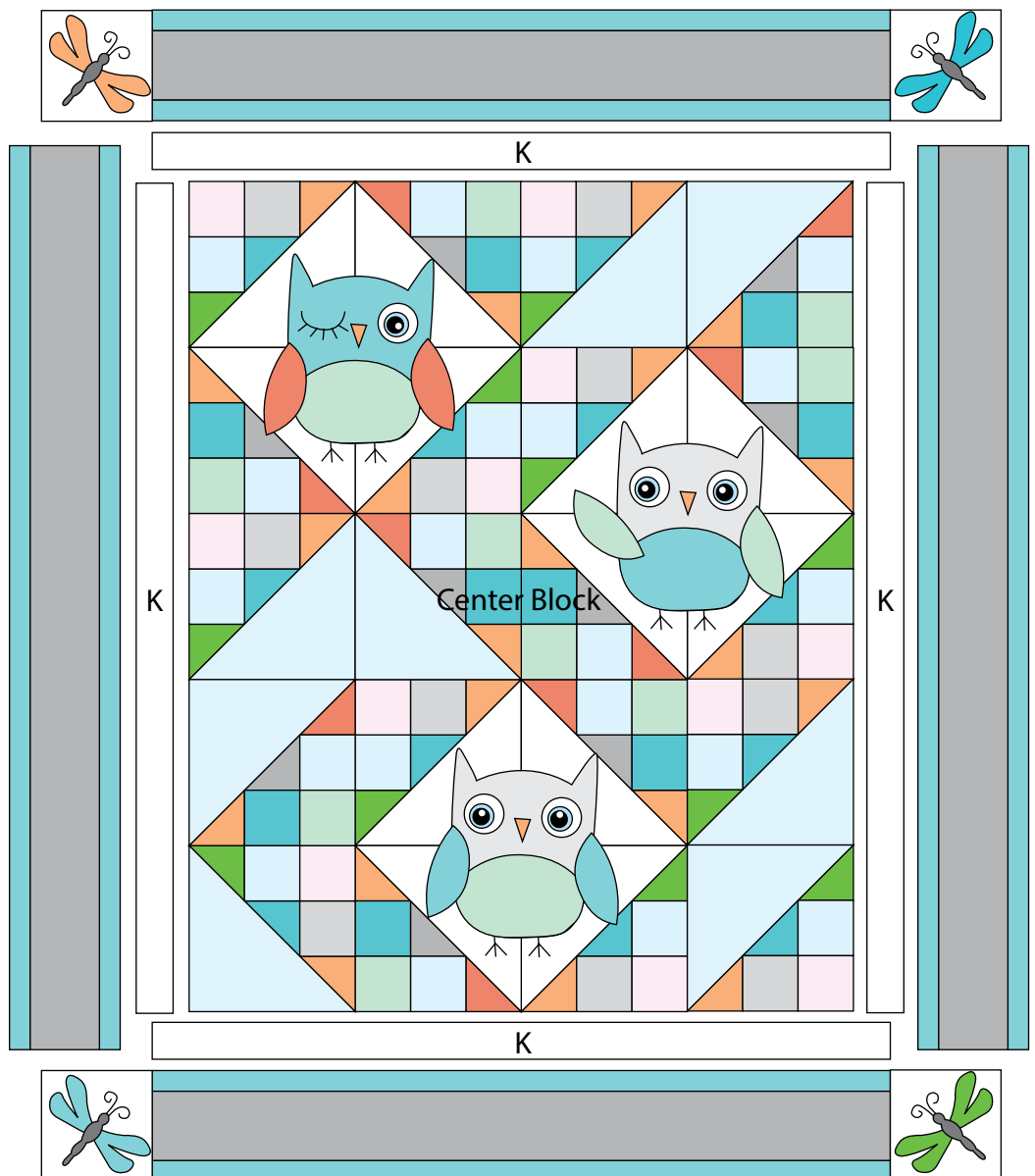
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

15. Press the quilt top and 60" x 69" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

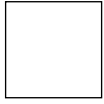
16. Cut the ends of the (6) Fabric I binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

17. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.



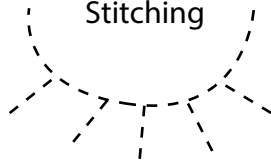
Quilt Layout

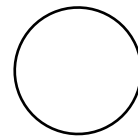
Closed Owl Eye

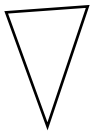


Owl Eye Middle

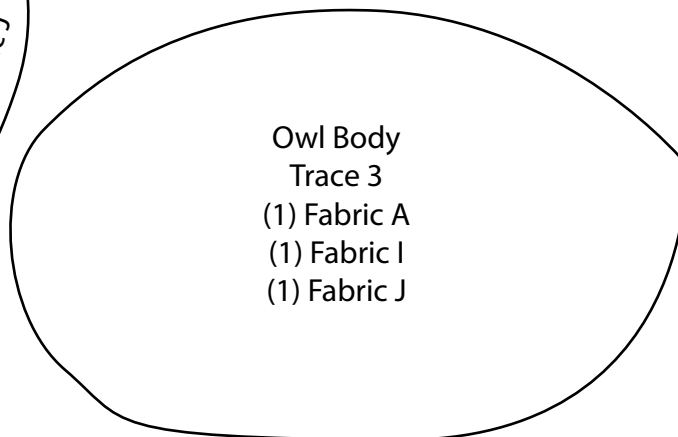

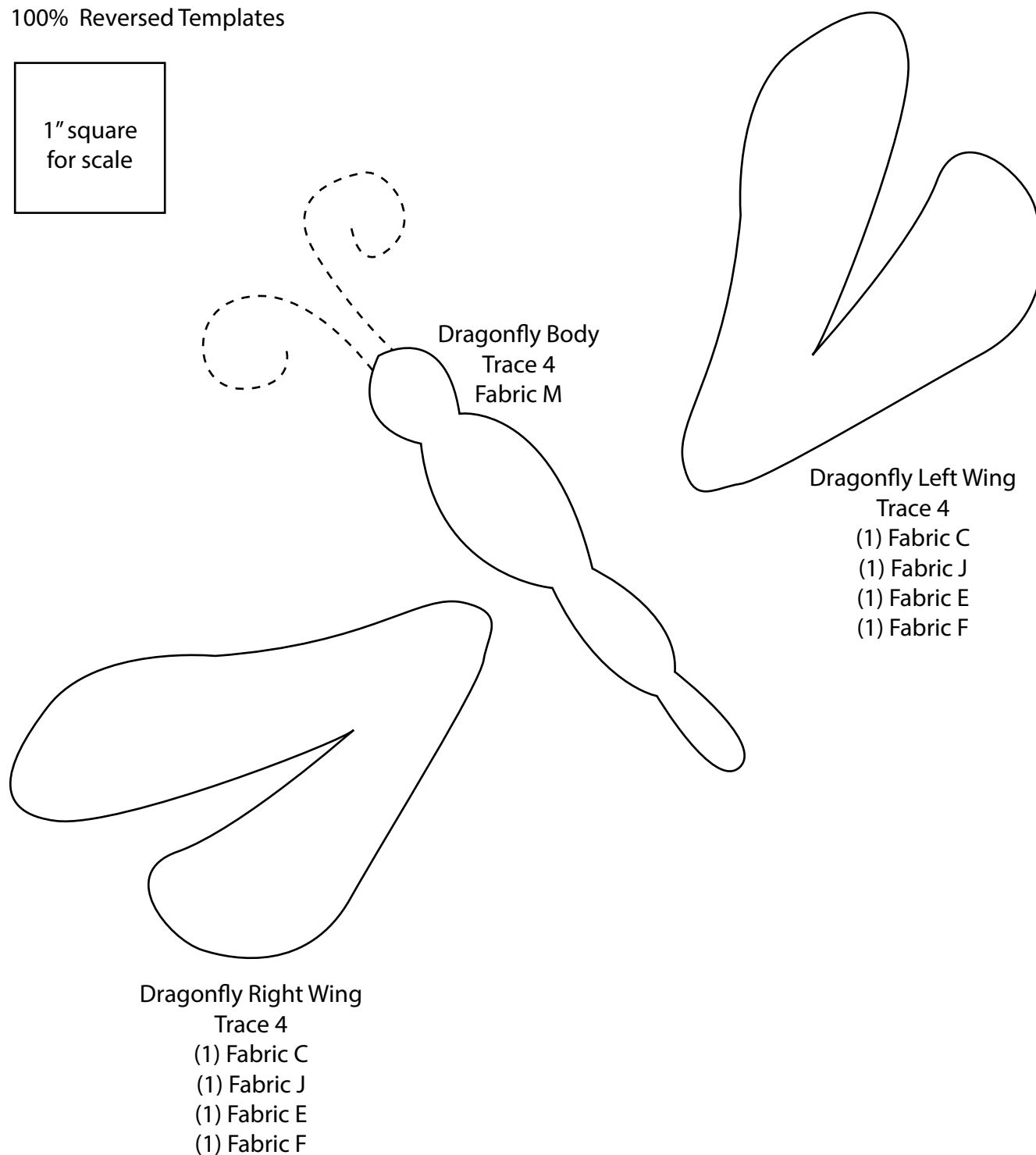
