These HST's pointing skyward always remind me that anything is possible!

## CUTTING JNSTBUCTJONS:

(For fabric choices refer to the diagram.)

HST = Half Square Triangle



## ASSEMELY INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Begin HST unit assembly using (4) A triangles and (4) B triangles. Place triangles right sides together and edges aligned.
2. Sew the longest edges of the triangles together using a $1 / 4$ " seam. Press toward the B triangle.
3. Repeat to create (4) HST units using A and B triangles, and (4) HST units using $A$ and $C$ triangles. (HST units should total 8.)
4. Trim $A / B$ and $A / C$ HST units using the following guide:
a. 4" Block: 1 ½" unfinished ( 1 " finished)
b. 6" Block: 2" unfinished ( $11 / 2$ " finished)
c. 8" Block: $21 / 2 "$ unfinished ( 2 " finished)
d. 12 " Block: $31 / 2 "$ unfinished ( 3 " finished)

5. Use HST unit assembly instructions provided above to create (2) HST units using (2) D triangles and (2) E triangles. Press seams toward the E triangle.
6. Trim D/E HST units using the following guide:
a. 4" Block: $21 / 2$ " unfinished (2" finished)
b. 6 " Block: 3 ½" unfinished ( 3 " finished)
c. 8 " Block: $41 / 2 "$ unfinished (4" finished)
d. 12 "Block: $61 / 2 "$ unfinished ( 6 " finished)

7. Complete block assembly using all HST units created in steps 1-6. Sew HST units together as shown in the diagram. Please note the orientation of all HST units. Arrows indicate pressing instructions.
