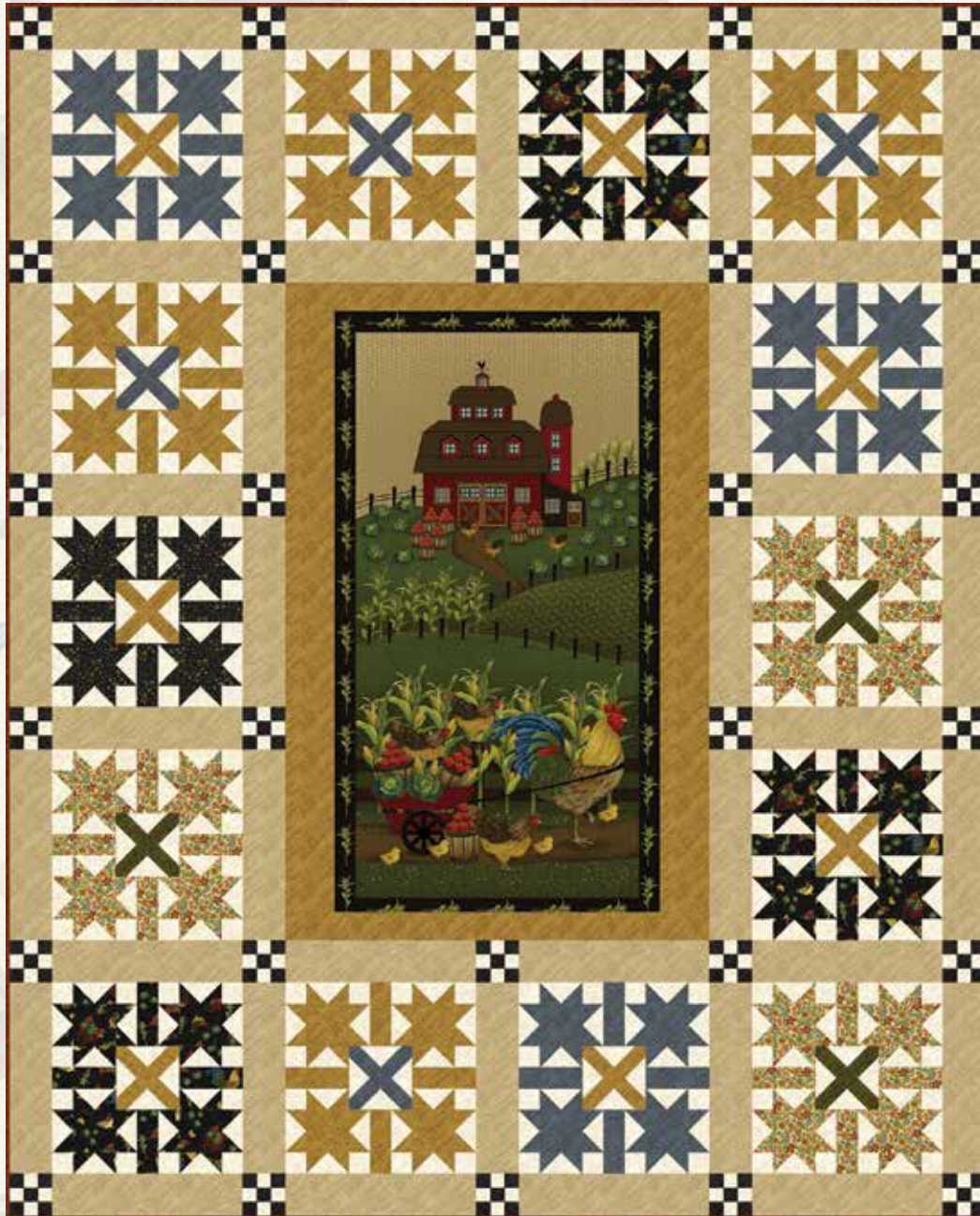

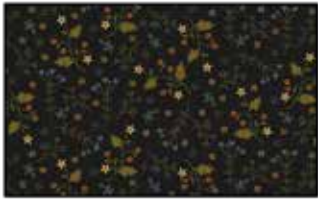

2 ⅛ yards	Folio Basic - Off White (C)	7755-04
¾ yard	Bias Weave Basic - Chambray (D)	2532-17
⅝ yard	Rooster Toss - Black (E)	2560-99
⅓ yard	Mini Floral - Black (F)	2561-99
⅝ yard	Medium Wildflower Toss - Cream (G)	2462-33
¼ yard	Bias Weave Basic - Green (H)	2532-66
1 ½ yards	Bias Weave Basic - Cream (I)	2532-33
⅓ yard	Bias Weave Basic - Black (J)	2532-99
⅔ yard	Bias Weave Basic - Rust (K)	2532-35*
5 ¼ yard	Rooster Toss - Cream (Backing)	2560-33

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the Farm Center Panel - Black (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 23 ½" x 43" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Bias Weave Basic - Butternut (B), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 43" strips.
- (2) 3" x 31 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 2 ¾" squares.
- (7) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (128) 2" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2" x 5" strips.

From the Folio Basic - Off White (C), cut:

- (19) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (224) 2" x 3 ½" strips.
- (14) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (280) 2" squares.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips.

From the Bias Weave Basis - Chambray (D), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 ¾" squares.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 5" strips.

From the Rooster Toss - Black (E), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 5" strips.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2" squares.

From the Mini Floral - Black (F), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3 ½" squares and (4) 2" x 5" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2" squares.

From the Medium Wildflower Toss - Cream (G), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 5" strips.
- (5) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2" squares.

From the Bias Weave Basic - Green (H), cut:

- (1) 2 ¾" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 ¾" squares.

From the Bias Weave Basic - Cream (I), cut:

- (14) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (42) 3 ½" x 14" strips.

From the Bias Weave Basic - Black (J), cut:

- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips.

From the Bias Weave Basic - Rust (K), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Rooster Toss - Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 94" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 77" x 94" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the fabric orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 43" Fabric B strip to each side of the 23 ½" x 43" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 3" x 31 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel. **Trim the block to measure 30 ½" x 47"** to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).

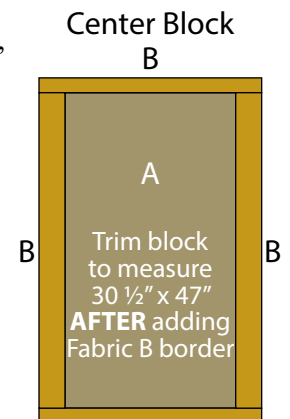

2. Place (1) 2" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 2" x 3 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance.

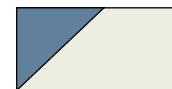

3. Place another 2" Fabric D square on the right side of the 2" x 3 1/2" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (48) Unit 1 strips total.

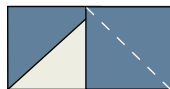

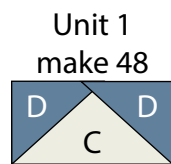

5. Sew (1) 2" Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric D square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) strips together lengthwise to make (1) Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (12) Unit 2 rectangles total.

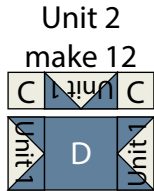

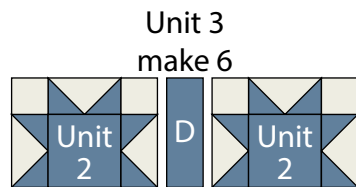

7. Sew (1) 2" Fabric C square to the left end of (1) Unit 1 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2" x 5" Fabric D strip to make (1) Unit 4 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) Unit 4 squares total.

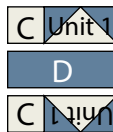

8. Place (1) 2" Fabric C square on the bottom left corner of (1) 2 3/4" Fabric B square, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 10). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.

9. Follow Figure 11 for the seam direction to add a 2" Fabric C square to the upper right corner of the 2 3/4" Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 12).

10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (12) Unit 5 squares total.

11. Sew (4) Unit 5 squares together into a 2 x 2 matrix to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (3) Unit 6 squares.

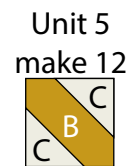

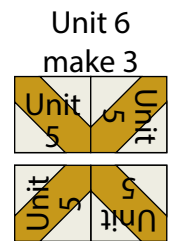

12. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to each side of (1) Unit 6 square to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (3) Unit 7 strips total.

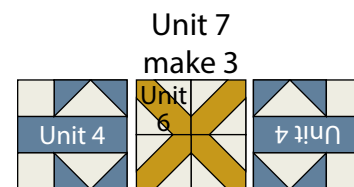

13. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) Unit 7 strip lengthwise to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 15). The block should measure 14" square. Repeat to make (3) Block One squares total.

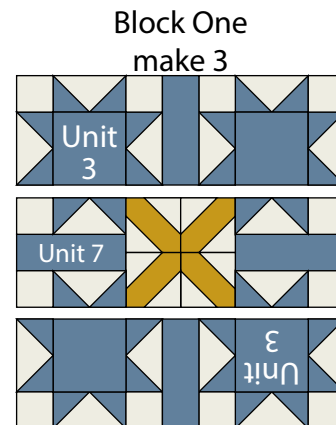

14. Repeat Steps 2-13 and refer to Figures 16-19 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (4) Block Two squares, (3) Block Three squares, (1) Block Four square and (3) Block Five squares.

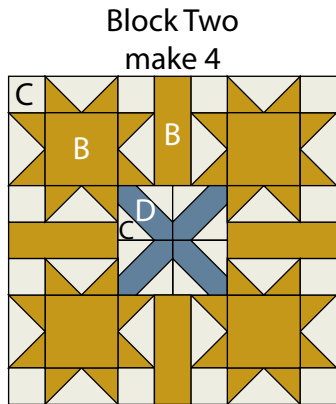

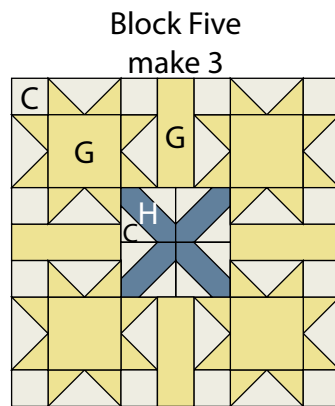

15. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x WOF Fabric J strip to each side of (1) 1 1/2" x WOF Fabric C strip lengthwise to make (1) Strip Set 1 (Fig. 20). Repeat to make a second Strip Set 1.

16. Cut the Strip Set 1's into (56) 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" Unit 8 strips (Fig. 21).

17. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x WOF Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 1 1/2" x WOF Fabric J strip lengthwise to make (1) Strip Set 2 (Fig. 22).

18. Cut the Strip Set 2's into (28) 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" Unit 9 strips (Fig. 23).

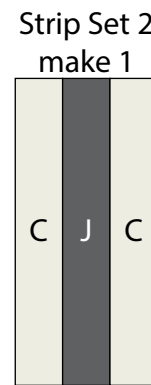

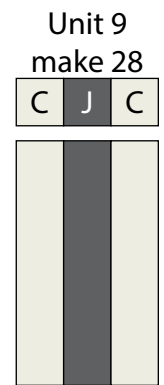

19. Sew (1) Unit 8 strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) Unit 9 strip to make (1) 3 1/2" Unit 10 square (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (28) Unit 10 squares total.

20. Sew (5) Unit 10 squares and (4) 3 1/2" x 14" Fabric I strips together end to end and alternating them to make (1) Unit 11 strip (Fig. 25 below). Repeat to make (4) Unit 11 strips total.

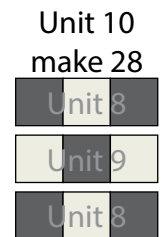

21. Sew (3) 3 1/2" x 14" Fabric I strips and (2) Unit 10 squares together end to end and alternating them to make (1) Unit 12 strip (Fig. 26 below). Repeat to make (4) Unit 12 strips total.

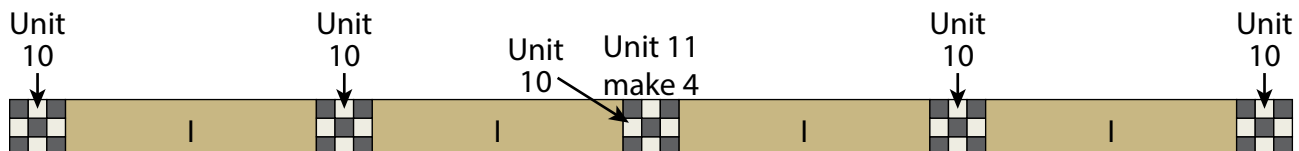

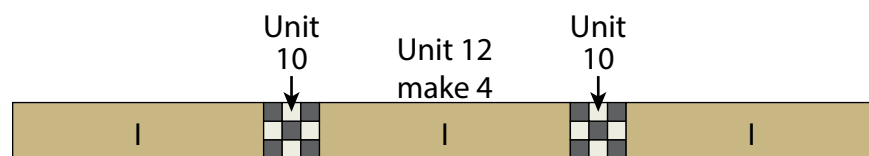

22. Sew (1) Unit 2 square, (1) 3 1/2" x 14" Fabric I strip, (1) Unit 4 square, (1) 3 1/2" x 14" Fabric I strip and (1) Block Five square together in that order top to bottom. Sew (1) Unit 12 strip to each side of the newly sewn strip lengthwise to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 27).

23. Repeat Step 22 and refer to Figures 28-30 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border, Top Border and Bottom Border.

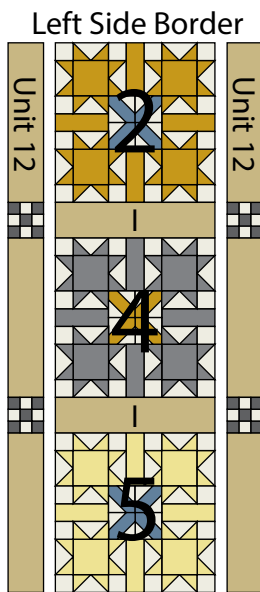

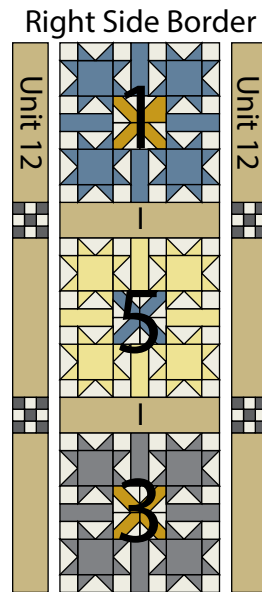

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

24. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right of the Center Block.

25. Sew (1) Unit 11 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Top Border. Sew the newly sewn strip to the top of the Center Block.

26. Sew (1) Unit 11 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Bottom Border. Sew the newly sewn strip to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

27. Layer and quilt as desired.

28. Sew the (8) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

29. Bind as desired.

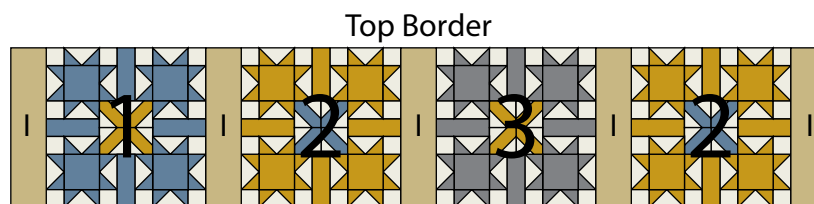

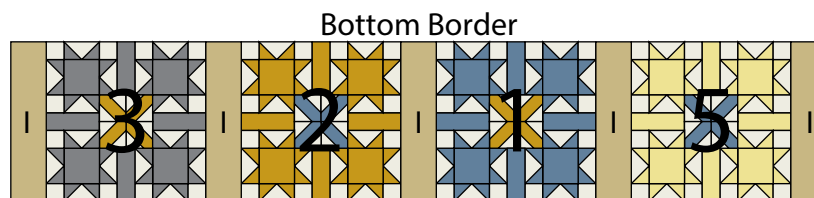
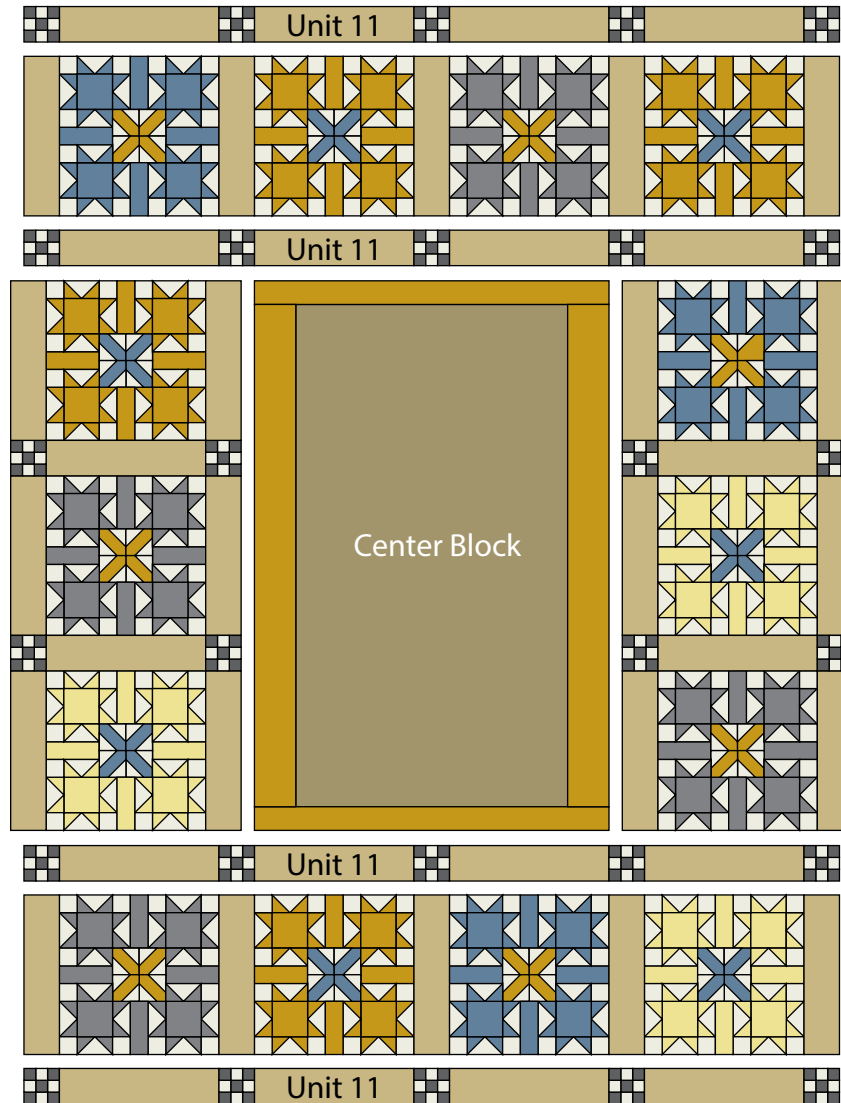
