Extra Large Throw/Twin Quilt: 64 1/2" x 82 1/2"

Wilmington Prints: A World of Possibilities

Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning. All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvage to selvage, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following:

If using FAT CUTS, you may need to cut additional width-of-fabric strips.

Fabric A - PLEASE NOTE: Panels do not always print the size intended. For this pattern, panels have a coping border added then trimmed so they will fit the quilt correctly.

Fussy cut 1/4" beyond outside edges of 4 panels to approximately 8-1/2" square

Fabric B - Referring to the guilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (2) 8-3/4" x 87" and (2) 8-3/4" x 69" multi-stripe borders

Fabric C - Cut (2) 9-1/2" strips, subcut (5) 9-1/2" squares and (8) 3-1/2" squares

Fabric D - Cut (2) 3-1/2" strips, subcut (18) 3-1/2" squares

Fabric E - Cut (2) 3-7/8" strips, subcut (16) 3-7/8" squares then cut in half $\boxed{}$ diagonally for a total of 32 triangles Cut (10) 1-5/8" strips

Fabric F - Cut (4) 4-1/4" strips, subcut (36) 4-1/4" squares then cut in half \times diagonally twice for a total of 144 triangles

Fabric G - Cut (2) 3-1/2" strips, subcut (20) 3-1/2" squares

Cut (8) 2-1/2" strips (binding)

Cut (2) 2-3/8" strips, subcut (32) 2-3/8" squares then cut 16 in half diagonally and 16 diagonally in the opposite direction for a total of 64 triangles

Cut (6) 2" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2" x 63-1/2" and (2) 2" x 48-1/2" borders

Cut (3) 2" strips, subcut (32) 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles


Cut (4) 1-1/4" strips, subcut (8) 1-1/4" x 10" and (8) 1-1/4" x 9" strips

Fabric H - Cut (5) 4-1/4" strips, subcut (44) 4-1/4" squares then cut in half \mathbb{X} diagonally twice for a total of 176 triangles **Fabric I** - Cut (4) 2" strips, subcut (64) 2" squares

Fabric J - Cut (2) 3-7/8" strips, subcut (16) 3-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for a total of 32 triangles Cut (5) 2-1/2" strips

2. Piecing Order:

1. Stitch **Fabric G** 1-1/4" x 9" strips to sides of a Fabric A panel. Trim strip ends even. Add 1-1/4" x 10" Fabric G strips to top and bottom of panel. Trim bordered panel to 9-1/2"



Block 1 - Make 4

square" (unfinished). Make a total of 4 Block 1.

Stripes and arrows indicate orientation of directional prints.

2. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of each Fabric G 3-1/2" square, half in 1 direction and half in the opposite direction.



3. Arrange 4 marked Fabric G 3-1/2" squares on a Fabric C 9-1/2" square as shown.







Trim seam allowances to 1/4". Press triangles out. Make a total of 5 **Block 2** (9-1/2" square unfinished).

Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric.

4. Stitch a **Fabric J** 2-1/2" strip between 2 Fabric E 1-5/8" strips. Make a total of 5 pieced strips. From these, cut (72) 2-5/8" wide Unit 1 $(2-5/8" \times 4-3/4" \text{ unfinished}).$



5. Sew 2 each **Fabrics** and **H** 4-1/4" triangles to each **Fabric D** 3-1/2" square to make 12 Unit 2a and 6 Unit 2b (4-3/4" square unfinished.




6. Stitch 1 each **Fabrics F** and **H** 4-1/4" triangles together along their short edges as shown to make 36 each Units






shown to make 36 each Units 3a and 3b (3-7/8" x 3-7/8" x 5-1/2" unfinished).

7. Arrange 4 Unit 1, 1 Unit 2a, 2 Unit 3a, 2 Unit 3b, and 2 each **Fabrics F** and **H** 4-1/4" triangles in 5 rows as shown. Stitch into rows matching square corners. Sew rows together matching seam allowances or centering on adjoining row. Make a total of 12 **Block 3a** (9-1/2" square unfinished). In the same manner but with Unit 2b in center, make a total of 6 **Block 3b**.









8. Sew 1 each **Fabrics E** and **J** 3-7/8" triangles together along their long edges. Make a total of 32 Unit 4 (3-1/2" square unfinished).



9. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of each **Fabric I** 2" square.



10. In the same manner as step 3, use marked **Fabric I** squares and 2" x 3-1/2" **Fabric G** pieces to make 32 Unit 5a (2" x 3-1/2" unfinished).



11. Stitch 2 **Fabric G** 2-3/8" triangles to short edges of a **Fabric H** 4-1/4" triangle. Make a total of 32 Unit 5b (2" x 3-1/2" square unfinished).



12. Sew 1 each Units 5a and 5b together as shown. Make a total of 32 Unit 6 (3-1/2" square unfinished).



13. Arrange 1 **Fabric C** 3-1/2" square, 4 Unit 4, and 4 Unit 6 in 3 rows as shown. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together. Make a total of 8 **Block 4** (9-1/2" square unfinished).



Block 4 - Make 8


- 14. Refer to Quilt Layout (Page 4) for arrangement and placement of blocks and borders.
- 15. Arrange blocks in 7 rows. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together completing quilt center (45-1/2" x 63-1/2" unfinished).
- 16. Sew **Fabric G** 2" x 63-1/2" borders to right and left sides of quilt center. Add **Fabric G** 2" x 48-1/2" borders to top and bottom of quilt center.

17. Center **Fabric B** 8-3/4" x 87" borders on right and left sides of quilt center and **Fabric B** 8-3/4" x 69" borders on top and bottom of quilt center with the butterfly stripe next to quilt center. Stitch borders to sides starting and stopping 1/4" from corners of quilt center. Do not trim. Press borders out.

Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric. Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints.

Center

18. Working with 1 corner at a time, fold the quilt right sides together so the outside edges of the borders line up. Using a 45-degree ruler, mark from the end of border seams to outer edges of borders. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner seam open. Repeat on remaining corners.




- 19. The quilt measures approximately 65" x 83" (unfinished). Make backing (**Fabric K**) approximately 8" larger than the top.
- 20. Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (**Fabric G**) and enjoy!!
