

## NIGHT AND DAY

The Night and Day block is designed to use high contrast fabrics for a striking block. When several blocks are put into a quilt, it will create high contrast secondary designs. Make it scrappy or with a few fabrics.

## GUTTJNG JNSTBUGTJONS:

(For fabric choices refer to the diagram)

| C: | (2) $17 / 8$ " squares; cut each square once diagonally to make <br> (4) C triangles. | (2) $23 / 8$ " squares; cut each square once diagonally to make <br> (4) C triangles. | (2) $27 / 8$ " squares; cut the squares once diagonally to make <br> (4) C triangles. | (2) $37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares; cut each square once diagonally to make <br> (4) C triangles. |
| D: | (2) $17 / \mathrm{s}^{\prime \prime}$ squares; cut each square once diagonally to make <br> (4) D triangles. | (2) $23 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares; cut each square once diagonally to make <br> (4) D triangles. | (2) $27 / 8$ " squares; cut the squares once diagonally to make <br> (4) D triangles. | (2) $37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares; cut each square once diagonally to make <br> (4) D triangles. |
| E: | (1) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares; cut each square once diagonally to make <br> (2) E triangles. | (1) $37 / 8$ " square; cut the square once diagonally to make (2) E triangles. | (1) $47 / 8 "$ square; cut the square once diagonally to make (2) E triangles. | (1) $67 / 8$ " square; cut the square once diagonally to make (2) E triangles. |
| F: | (1) $27 / 8$ " square; cut the square once diagonally to make (2) F triangles. | (1) $37 / 8$ " square; cut the square once diagonally to make (2) F triangles. | (1) $47 / 8 "$ square; cut the square once diagonally to make (2) F triangles. | (1) $67 / 8$ " square; cut the square once diagonally to make (2) F triangles. |

## ASSEMBLY INSTBUCTJONS:

1. Place (8) A and B squares into a $4 \times 4$ grid as shown, alternating between fabrics.

2. Place (2) E triangles and (2) F triangles around the edges of the unit created in the above steps.
3. Sew $E$ and $F$ triangles to the unit. Press outward to complete block assembly. Ensure that there is a 1/4" seam allowance as indicated with circles on the completed block diagram.

## ASSEMBLY JNSTBUCTIONS:


9. Trim block using the guide listed below:
a. $4^{1 / 2 "} \times 4^{1 / 2 "}$ unfinished ( 4 " $\times 4$ " finished)
b. $61 / 2 " \times 6 \frac{112 "}{}$ " unfinished ( $6^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ finished)
c. $8 \frac{112 "}{} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ unfinished ( 8 " $\times 8$ " finished)
d. $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2 "$ unfinished ( 12 " $\times 12^{\prime \prime}$ finished)
