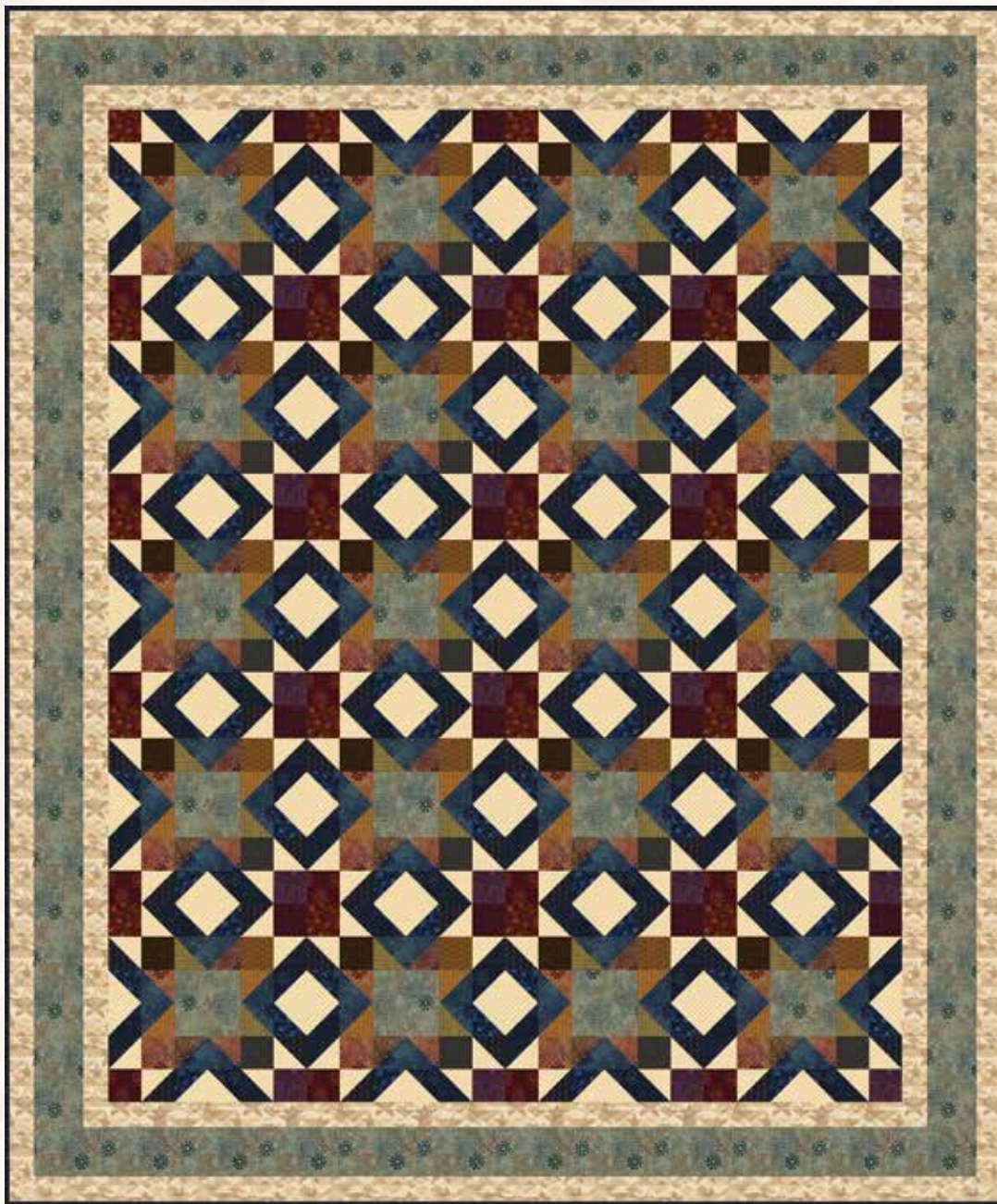

¼ yard	Diamond Dobbie - Slate (G)	2618Y-71
¼ yard	Cross Hatch - Brown (H)	2613-38
¼ yard	Star Basket - Ochre (I)	2612-43
½ yard	Square Texture - Light Blue (J)	2611-77

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Mixed Media Multi - Light Teal (A), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4 ½" squares.
- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 63 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 57 ½" strips.

#### From the Mixed Media Solid - Navy (B), cut:

- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

#### From the Happy Text - Light Pea (C), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Mixed Media Multi - Cocoa (D), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Happy Text - Squash (E), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Mixed Media Multi - Rust (F), cut:

- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Diamond Dobbie - Slate (G), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Cross Hatch - Brown (H), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Star Basket - Ochre (I), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Square Texture - Light Blue (J), cut:

- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Star Basket - Navy (K), cut:

- (3) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 ⅞" squares.

#### From the Lacey Design - Navy (L), cut:

- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Cross Hatch - Navy (M), cut:

- (3) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 ⅞" squares.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Square Texture - Rust (N), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Cross Hatch - Raisin (O), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Mixed Media Solid - Dark Purple (P), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Lacey Design - Red (Q), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Bow Tie - Cream (R), cut:

- (6) 2 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2 ⅞" squares.
- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

#### From the Star Mosaic - Taupe (S), cut:

- (2) 2" x 69 ½" LOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 60 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" WOF strips, piecing as needed, and (2) 2" x 60 ½" WOF strips, piecing as needed.

#### From the Square Texture - Light Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 68" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 80" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.*

1. Place (1)  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric R square on top of (1)  $2\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric M square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (80) Unit 1 squares total.

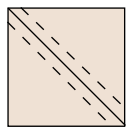

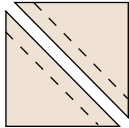

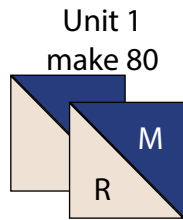

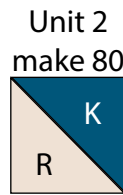

2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figure 4 for fabric identification and location to make (80)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 2 squares.

3. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric N square to the left side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to left side of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (20) Unit 3 squares total.

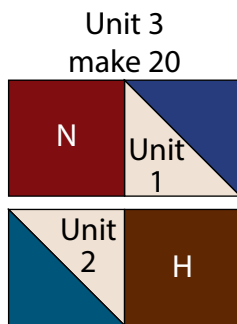

4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figures 6-8 for component identification, location and orientation to make (20) Unit 4 squares, (20) Unit 5 squares and (20) Unit 6 squares.

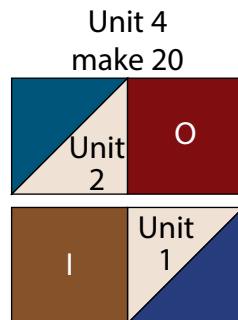

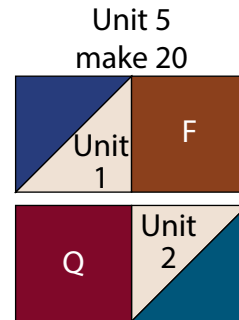

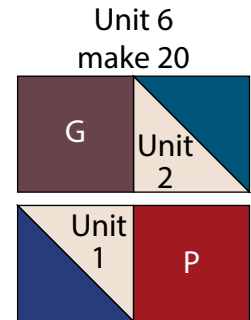

5. Place (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J square on the left side of (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric R strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 10).

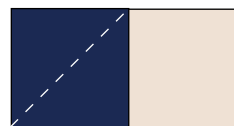

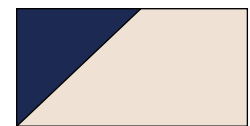

6. Place (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square on the right side of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric R strip, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 7 strip (Fig. 12).

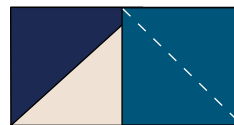

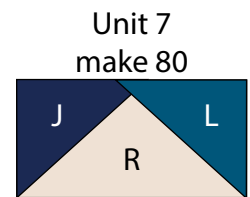

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (80) Unit 7 strips total.

8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figures 13-16 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (20) Unit 8 strips, (20) Unit 9 strips, (20) Unit 10 strips and (20) Unit 11 strips.

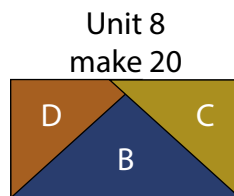

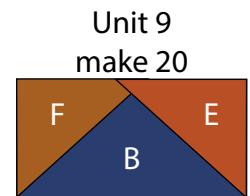

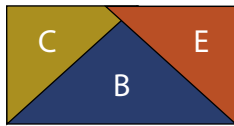

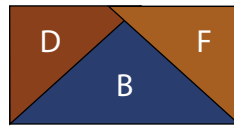

9. Sew (1) Unit 8 strip to the top of (1) Unit 7 strip to make (1) Unit 12 square (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (20) Unit 12 squares total.

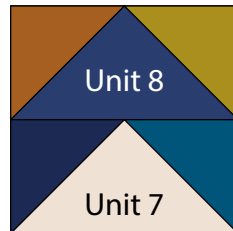

10. Repeat Step 9 and refer to Figures 18-20 for component identification, location and orientation to make (20) Unit 13 squares, (20) Unit 14 squares and (20) Unit 15 squares.

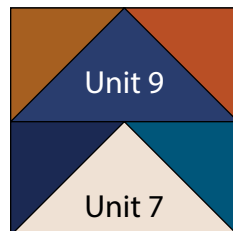

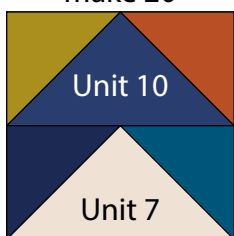

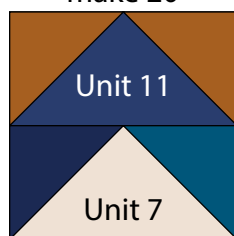

11. Sew together Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 12 square and (1) Unit 4 square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row.

12. Sew together (1) Unit 13 strip, (1) 4 1/2" Fabric A square and (1) Unit 14 strip, lengthwise and in that from order left to right, to make the middle row.

13. Sew together (1) Unit 5 square, (1) Unit 15 square and (1) Unit 6 square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row.

14. Sew the (3) rows from Steps 11-13 together lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (20) Block One squares total.

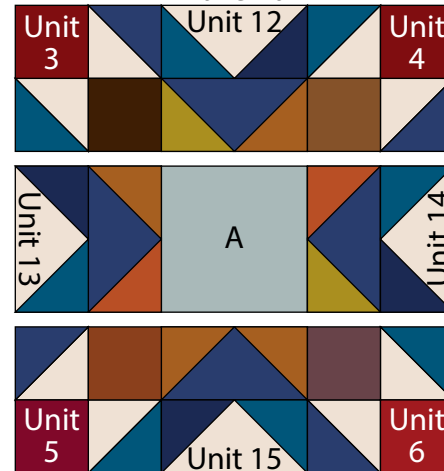

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

15. Sew (4) Block One squares together to make (1) row. Repeat to make (5) rows total.

16. Sew the (5) rows together to make the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 2" x 60 1/2" Fabric S strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 1/2" Fabric S strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

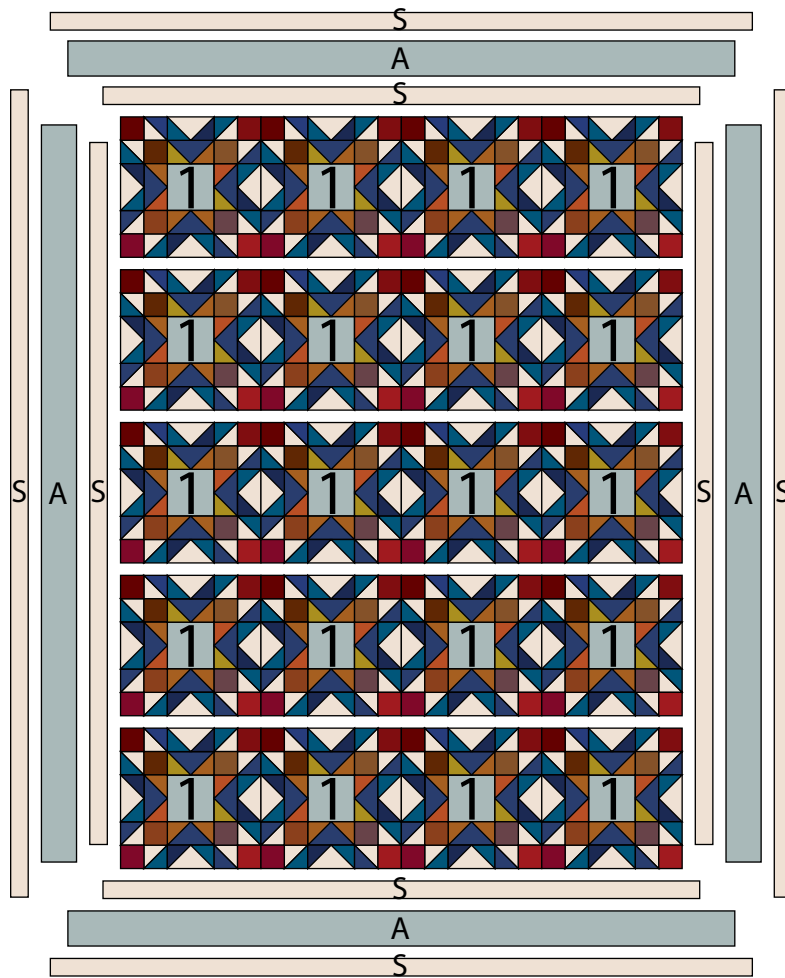
18. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 63 1/2" Fabric A strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 57 1/2" Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1) 2" x 69 1/2" Fabric S strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 60 1/2" Fabric S strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

20. Layer and quilt as desired.

21. Sew the (7) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric M strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

22. Bind as desired.
