

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## Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

### Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

#### From Fabric A, cut:

one 9-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: three 9-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric B, cut:

two 9-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: six 9-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric C, cut:

five 9-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 9-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric D, cut:

four 9-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: fourteen 9-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric E, cut:

nine 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-two 6-1/2" x 9-1/2" rectangles four 6-1/2" squares

#### From Fabric F, cut:

fourteen 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one hundred sixty 3-1/2" squares. Mark the back of each square along the diagonal, or press along the diagonal to form a crease.

#### From Fabric G, cut:

two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing.

#### From Fabric H, cut:

eight 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing.

#### From Fabric I, cut:

eight 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Set aside for strip piecing.

#### From Fabric J, cut:


nine 7-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim: two 7-1/2" x 93-1/2" side outer borders two 7-1/2" x 89-1/2" side outer borders

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

ten 2-1/2" x WOF strips

**Step 1:** Sew a Fabric H strip to both long edges of a Fabric G strip. Press toward Fabric G. Repeat to make a second strip set like this.

Step 2: Subcut the strips from Step 1 into a total of twenty 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" units.



**Step 3:** Sew a Fabric I strip to both long edges of a Fabric H strip. Press toward Fabric I. Repeat to make a total of four strips set like this.

Step 4: Subcut the strips from Step 3 into a total of forty 3-1/2" x 9-1/2" units.

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**Step 5:** Gather: one Step 2 unit two Step 4 units

Arrange the units to form the Block. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

**Step 6:** Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the Block.


The resulting Block should measure 9-1/2" square. Repeat to make a total of twenty Strip Pieced Blocks.

## Assemble the Snowball Units

**Step 7:** Place a Fabric F square in the upper right corner of a Fabric A square, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the three remaining corners with Fabric F squares.




Step 8: Repeat Step 7 to make a total of:



six Fabric B Snowball Blocks




ten Fabric C Snowball Blocks




fourteen Fabric D Snowball Blocks

**Step 9:** Place a Fabric F square in the upper right corner of a Fabric E rectangle, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press. Repeat on the upper left corner with another Fabric F square. Repeat to make a total of eighteen Fabric E Snowball Blocks.



Assemble the Quilt



**Step 10:** Arrange the Blocks and plain squares/rectangles into eleven rows of nine units. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

**Step 11:** Sew the units together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 12: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

**Step 13:** Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
