Additional Supplies Needed

Batting 67" x 83" (Recommended: Air Lite® Colour Me 100% Cotton) Piecing and sewing thread Quilting and sewing supplies

Quilt designed by Heidi Pridemore Finished Quilt Size 58 ½" x 74 ½" Skill Level: Advanced Beginner

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Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (5868-89 6" Blocks of Rustic Winter Motifs - Multi):

• Fussy cut (12) 6" squares, each centered on a block.

Fabric B (5873-89 Buffalo Check – Red/Black), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2" x 6" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2" x 9" strips.

Fabric C (5877-33 Wood Grain - Brown), cut:

• (10) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2" x 7 ½" strips.

Fabric D (1351-Iron Just Color! - Iron), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 1 ½" squares.
- (3) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1 ¾" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¾" x 47" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric E (1351-Pigment White Just Color! - Pigment White), cut:

- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (68) 2 ½" squares.
- (12) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

Fabric F (5875-33 Wood Grain with Snowflakes & Stars – Light Brown), cut:

• (2) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (17) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric G (5872-88 Tossed Circles with Rustic Motifs - Red), cut:

• (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (34) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric H (5871-99 Tiny Tossed Bears - Black), cut:

- (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric I (5876-89 Buffalo Check with White Animals - Red/Black), cut:

- (2) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 63" LOF strips.
- From the remaikning fabric, cut (2) 6 ½" x 47" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Backing (5869-8 Tossed Plaid Animals - White/Red), cut:

• (2) 67" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 67" x 83" to make the back.


Block Two

Sewing


Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 6" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 6" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 9" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure** 7 ½" x 7 ½". Repeat to make (12) Unit 1 squares total.
- 2. Sew (1) 2" x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 2" Fabric D square to each end of (1) 2" x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the newly sewn strips to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 2 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (12) Unit 2 squares total.
- 3. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to each end of (1) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the newly sewn strips to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (12) Block One squares total.



- 4. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square on the top left corner of (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 5).
- 5. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric E square to the upper right corner of the 4 ½" Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 3 (Fig. 7).
- 6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (34) Unit 3 squares total.
- 7. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to the top and to the bottom of (1) 4 ½" Fabric F square to make (1) Block Two strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (17) Block Two strips total.



- 8. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (2) Block Two strips, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Three, Row Five and Row Seven.
- 9. Sew together (3) Block Two strips and (2) 4 ½" Fabric H squares, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Four and Row Six.
- 10. Sew together the (7) Rows from Steps 8-9, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the Center Block (Fig. 9).

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)


- 11. Sew (1) $1 \frac{3}{4}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{3}{4}$ " x 47" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 12. Sew (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 63" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H square to each end of (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 47" Fabric I strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Layering, Quilting and Finishing

13. Press the quilt top and 67" x 83" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

- 14. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric D binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 15. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
