Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning. All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvage to selvage, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following:

If using FAT CUTS, you may need to cut additional width-of-fabric strips.

Fabric A - PLEASE NOTE: Panels do not always print the size intended. For this pattern, the panel has a coping border added then trimmed so the panel will fit the quilt correctly.

Fussy cut 1/4" beyond outside edges of panel to approximately 23-1/2" x 42"

Fabric B - Referring to the guilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (2) 2" x 83" and (2) 2" x 62" partial garland stripe borders and (2) 4" x 56" and (2) 4" x 35" partial cardinal stripe borders

Fabric C - Cut (3) 11" strips, subcut (2) 11" x 32" pieces and (2) 11" squares

Fabric D - Cut (2) 11-3/8" strips, subcut (4) 11-3/8" squares then cut 2 in half diagonally in 1 direction and 2 in the opposite direction for 8 triangles



Fabric E - Cut (8) 2-1/2" strips (binding) Cut (2) 1-1/2" strips, subcut (2) 1-1/2" x 25" strips

Fabric F - Cut (1) 11-3/8" strip, subcut (2) 11-3/8" squares [then cut in half diagonally for 4 triangles] and (1) 11" square Cut (1) 11" strip, subcut (3) 11" squares

Fabric G - Cut (2) 4-3/8" strips, subcut (12) 4-3/8" squares then cut in half $\sqrt{}$ diagonally for 24 triangles

Fabric H - Cut (3) 4-3/8" strips, subcut (24) 4-3/8" squares then cut in half $\sqrt{}$ diagonally for 48 triangles Cut (2) 1-3/4" strips Cut (2) 2" strips, subcut (2) 2" x 27" strips Cut (7) 2" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2" x 74" and (2) 2" x 56" borders

Fabric I - Cut (2) 4-3/8" strips, subcut (18) 4-3/8" squares then cut in half $\sqrt{}$ diagonally for 36 triangles


2. Piecing Order:

1. Draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of all the Fabric F 11" squares.




Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric. Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints.

2. Arrange 2 marked Fabric F 11" squares right



sides together on ends of a Fabric C 11" x 32" piece as shown. Stitch along the marked lines. Trim seam allowances to 1/4". Press triangles out to complete Block 1a (11" x 32" unfinished). In the same manner, make Block 1b noting placement of Fabric F corners.






3. Sew 1 each Fabrics G and I 4-3/8" triangles together along their long edges. Make a total Unit 1 of 12 Unit 1 (4" square Make 12 unfinished). In the same time, make 24 Unit 2 with Fabrics H and I 4-3/8" triangles.

4. Arrange 1 Unit 1, 2 Unit 2, 1 Fabric G 4-3/8" triangle, and 2 Fabric H 4-3/8" triangles in 3 rows as shown. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together. Make a total of 12 Unit 3 (11-3/8" x 11-3/8" x 16-1/8" unfinished).

5. Sew a Unit 3 and Fabric D 11-3/8" triangle together along their long edges. Make a total of 2 Block 2a (11" square unfinished.

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
6. In the same manner, make 2 each Blocks 2b-2d and 4 Block 4 with 11-3/8" triangles indicated.




- 8. Stitch Fabric H 1-3/4" x width of fabric strips to sides of the **Fabric A** panel. Trim strip ends even. Add 2" x 27" Fabric H strips to top and bottom of panel. Trim bordered panel to 25" x 44" (unfinished).
- 9. Sew Fabric E 1-1/2" x 25" strips to top and bottom of bordered panel.

10. Center Fabric B 4" x 56" borders on right and left sides of quilt center and Fabric B 4" x 35" borders on top and bottom of guilt center with the bottom of stripe next to guilt center. Stitch borders to 1/4" sides starting and stopping detail 1/4" from corners of quilt center. Do not trim. Press B Quilt borders out. Center

> Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric. Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints.

11. Refer to diagrams on top of next column to miter border. Working with 1 corner at a time, fold the guilt right sides together so the outside edges of the borders line up. Using a 45-degree ruler, mark from the end of border seams to outer edges of borders. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner seam open. Repeat on remaining corners.






- 12. Arrange 1 **Fabric C** 11" square, 1 Block 2a, 1 Block 2c, and 2 Block 3 in a vertical row on left side of quilt and 1 Fabric C 11" square, 1 Block 2b, 1 Block 2d, and 2 Block 3 in a vertical row on right side of guilt. Sew into rows (11" x 53" unfinished) and stitch to sides of quilt.
- 13. Arrange 1 each Blocks 1a, 2a, and 2b in a horizontal row above the quilt and 1 each Blocks 1b, 2c, and 2d in a row below guilt. Sew into rows (11" x 53" unfinished) and stitch to top and bottom of quilt.
- 14. Sew Fabric H 2" x 74" borders to right and left sides of quilt. Add Fabric H 2" x 56" borders to top and bottom of quilt.
- 15. Referring to Steps 10 and 11, add Fabric B 2" x 83" borders on right and left sides of guilt center and Fabric B 2" x 62" borders on top and bottom of quilt center with the cream edge next to guilt center.
- 16. The quilt measures approximately 59" x 80" (unfinished). Make backing (Fabric J) approximately 8" larger than the top.
- 17. Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (Fabric E) and enjoy!!
