INSTRUCTIONS

Please read through all the directions first before starting and assume ¼" seam allowance. Sew with right-sides together unless otherwise stated. Press all seams in the direction of the arrows on the diagrams. Yardage is based on a 42" width of fabric.

WOF: Width of Fabric LOF: Length of Fabric RST: Right sides together

This quilt pattern is a beginner level quilt pattern. Basic knowledge of quilt piecing techniques and terminology is required. Please visit our website at www.rileyblakedesigns.com/pattern-updates to check for any updates before beginning this project. Have fun!

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

- 1 Khaki Panel (P11378-KHAKI)
- 2 yards Burgundy Check (C11374-BURGUNDY) (includes ½ yard for binding)
- ½ yard Pearl Moths (C11373-PEARL)
- 1% yards Pearl Stripe (C11377-PEARL)
- ½ yard of the following prints:

Green Trees (C11372-GREEN)

Green Plaid (C11376-GREEN)

Green Animals (C11371-GREEN)

Gray Flowers (C11375-GRAY)

Burgundy Plaid (C11376-BURGUNDY)

Burgundy Moths (C11373-BURGUNDY)

Mahogany Animals (C11371-MAHOGANY)



CUTTING DIRECTIONS:

Note: Please take note of cutting direction of strips, either width of fabric (WOF) or length of fabric (LOF).

Khaki Panel

Trim to measure 36" x 43 1/2"



Burgundy Check



Cut (17) 2½" x WOF strips

Cut (4) 2" x 2" squares and label (A), set aside with the remaining Log Cabin Block pieces below.
Cut (8) 2½" x WOF strips for binding.

Pearl Moths



Cut (5) 3½" x WOF strips

Pearl Stripe



tips (4) 10½" x LOF strips

For the Log Cabin Blocks cut and label each of the following pieces:

Gray Flowers



Cut (4) 1½" x 2" rectangles and label (B)

Cut (4) 1½" x 3" rectangles and label (C)

Burgundy Plaid



Cut (4) 2" x 3" rectangles and label (D)

Cut (4) 2" x 4½" rectangles and label (E)

Green Animals



Cut (4) 1½" x 4½" rectangles and label (F)

Cut (4) 1½" x 5½" rectangles and label (G)

Burgundy Moths



Cut (4) 2" x 5½" rectangles and label (H)

Cut (4) 2" x 7" rectangles and label (I)

Green Plaid



Cut (4) 1½" x 7" rectangles and label (J)

Cut (4) 11/2" x 8" rectangles and label (K)

Mahogany Animals



Cut (4) 2" x 8" rectangles and label (L)

Cut (4) 2" x 9½" rectangles and label (M)

Green Trees



Cut (4) 1½" x 9½" rectangles and label (N)

Cut (4) 1½" x 10½" rectangles and label (O)

Log Cabin Block Unfinshed Block 10½" x 10½"



LOG CABIN BLOCK:

Directions below are given for assembling (1) Log Cabin Block. You will need to make (4) for each corner of the quilt pattern. Please assemble the quilt in order shown. Trim directions are given often to ensure accurate piecing.



1. Sew a B-rectangle to the bottom of an A-square as shown. Press seams in the direction of the arrows.



2. Pin and sew a C-rectangle to the right-side of the AB unit as shown. Press seams. Unit should measure 3" x 3" square.



3. Pin and sew a D-rectangle to the top of the unit and press seams.



4. Pin and sew an E-rectangle to the left-side of the unit and press seams. Unit should measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.



5. Repeat pinning, sewing and pressing rectangles in a counter clockwise direction around the Log Cabin Block. Check your measurements after each 2 rectangles are attached to ensure accurate piecing. Add rectangles F and G to the Log Cabin Block and measure the block at 5½" x 5½" square.



6. Add rectangles H and I to the Log Cabin Block and measure the block at 7" x 7" square.



7. Add rectangles J and K to the Log Cabin Block and measure the block at 8" x 8" square.



8. Add rectangles L and M to the Log Cabin Block and measure the block at 9½" x 9½" square.



9. Add the final (2) rectangles N and O and press block well. The Log Cabin Block should measure 10%" x 10%" unfinished.



10. Repeat this process (3) more times to make a total of (4) Log Cabin Blocks.

BORDERS AND BINDING

Prepare and label all the border strips. For accurate sewing and measurements, please make sure your fabric is pressed and use a rotary cutter and quilting ruler on a flat surface to measure and cut fabrics. Seam allowances vary, so measure through the center of the quilt before cutting border pieces.



Burgundy Check

Sew all 17 Burgundy Check strips together end to end to make one long strip. Press all the seams in the same directions. Sub-cut and label as follows:

Cut (2) 43½" strips and (2) 40" strips (Border A)

Cut (2) 53%" strips and (2) 50" strips (Border C)

Cut (2) 77%" strips and (2) 74%" strips (Border E)

Binding:

Prepare the remaining strips for binding by sewing together end to end and folding and pressing in half along the entire length.

Pearl Moths

Sew all 5 Moth Pear strips together end to end to make one long strip. Press all the seams in the same directions. Sub-cut and label as follows:

Cut (2) 47½" strips and (2) 46" strips (Border B)

Pearl Stripe

Cut (2) 57½" x LOF strips and (2) 50" LOF strips (Border D)



QUILT ASSEMBLY



1. Pin the 43½" Border A strips to either side of the quilt panel as shown. Note: pinning borders on a flat table or surface before you begin sewing ensures that fabrics do not twist or stretch as you are sewing. Sew and press the strips outwards. Repeat this process with 40" Border A top and bottom strips. Press seams.



2. Pin and sew the 47½" Border B strips to each side of the quilt. Press seams outwards. Repeat this process with 46" Border B top and bottom strips.




3. Continue assembling the prepared borders in this way for Border C. The side borders will be 53½" and the top and bottom borders will be 50".



4. Repeat the pin, sew and press process for 57½" Border D side strips. Note the orientation of the fabric.



5. Pin and sew the Log Cabin Blocks to each end of the 50"
Border D top and bottom strips. Note the orientaion of the stripe print and the rotation of the Log Cabin Blocks.
The green edges are all pointing towards the outside of the quilt. Press the Log Cabin blocks towards the Border D strips.



6. Pin and sew the prepared Border D and Log Cabin strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. Note the fabric orientation. Press seams inward.



7. Finally, pin and sew the Border E 77½" strips to each side of the quilt. Press seams. Repeat with the 74" Border top and bottom strips. Press seams.



YOUR QUILT TOP IS COMPLETE!!!

Layer your backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt as desired. Bind the edges with your favorite binding method using the prepared binding.
