# Flying South Quilt

46 Blocks: 5' x 10'

## Flying Geese blocks have been a favorite of

 patchworkers for decades. These oversized blocks are so easy to construct that your quilt will fly together in no time at all.
## Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ${ }^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$ seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide).

## Fabric A

Cut (4) borders $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (1) border $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 5012^{\prime \prime}$
Cut (1) rectangle $101 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 151^{1 / 2 \prime}$
Cut (1) rectangle $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{1 / 2^{\prime \prime}}$
Cut (1) square $11^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}} \times 11^{1} / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 4 quarter-square triangles ( 1 not used)
Cut (13) squares $57 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ (or $6^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ ), cut in half diagonally to make 26 half-square triangles (read Step 1 before cutting)

## Goldenrod

Cut (7) strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF for binding
Cut (2) squares $111^{\prime \prime} \times 111^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 8 quarter-square triangles
Cut (5) squares $514^{\prime \prime} \times 57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ (or $6^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ ), cut in half diagonally to make 10 half-square triangles (read Step 1 before cutting)

## 2 Solids From each:

Cut (1) square $11^{1} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 4 quarter-square triangles (2 not used)
 diagonally to make 10 half-square triangles (read Step 1 before cutting)

## 3 Solids Fromeach:

Cut (2) squares $11^{1 / 4 " \mathrm{x}} 111 / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 8 quarter-square triangles (3 not used)
Cut (2) squares $57 / \mathrm{s}^{\prime \prime} \times 57 / \mathrm{s}^{\prime \prime}$ (or $6^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ ), cut in half diagonally to make 4 half-square triangles (read Step 1 before cutting)

## 4Solids Fromeach:

Cut (1) square $11^{1 / 4^{\prime \prime}}$ x $11^{1} / 4^{\prime \prime}$, cut in half diagonally twice to make 4 quarter-square triangles
Cut (3) squares $578^{\prime \prime} \times 57 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ (or $6^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ ), cut in half diagonally to make 6 half-square triangles (read Step 1 before cutting)

## Backing

Cut (2) panels $39^{\prime \prime} \times 68^{\prime \prime}$, pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

## Making the Quilt

1. Refer to the Quilt Diagram to determine color combinations for the Flying Geese blocks. Note that the top 6 blocks are made with Goldenrod and Cloud patches, 3 with Cloud corners and 3 have Goldenrod corners. The blocks can be made with 6 " half-square triangles to allow for trimming. If you wish to eliminate the trimming step, cut $57 / \mathrm{s}^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the half-square triangles instead. Stitch a half-square triangle to each short
( $6^{\prime \prime}$ ) 5 ¹/8"


Flying Geese side of a quarter-square triangle, as shown in the block diagram. Press the block. It should measure $5^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times 10^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$. If it does not, adjust your stitching and pressing techniques. Trim the block to $5^{1 / 2 \prime \prime} \times 10^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ as needed. Make a total of 46 Flying Geese blocks.
2. Refer to the Quilt Diagram. Join the 6 Cloud/Goldenrod blocks in a row, alternating the placement of the colors as shown in the top pieced border. Sew the appropriate Cloud patches to the ends of this Flying Geese unit. Set aside.
3. Position 8 Flying Geese into each of 5 vertical rows, following the diagram or as you wish. Once you are satisfied with the arrangement, join the blocks into vertical rows, and then join the rows.
4. Sew the $10^{1 / 2 "} \times 50^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ border between the pieced border from Step 2 and the Flying Geese unit from Step 3.
5. Sew $60^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ borders to the sides of the quilt, and then to the top and bottom.

## Finishing the Quilt

6. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and block patches. Quilt inside the triangles and borders as you wish. Or, quilt an overall pattern. Bind to finish the quilt.
