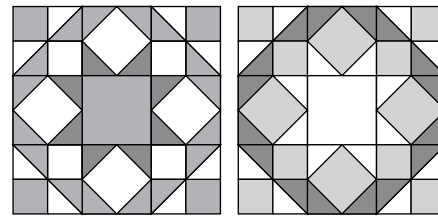
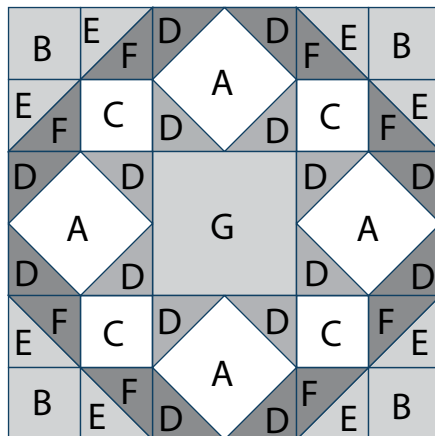

BH4 Block 17 - Shoreline

Color/shading options.

Piecing & Cutting Notes:

- This block uses connector/flip-and-sew corners for the D triangles.
- To trim the HSTs to size, add $\frac{1}{8}$ to $\frac{1}{4}$ to the E and F squares.

Cutting Instructions:

9" Finished Block:

- A - (4) squares - $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "
- B - (4) squares - 2" x 2"
- C - (4) squares - 2" x 2"
- D - (16) squares - 2" x 2"
(8) each of two fabrics
- E - (4) squares - 2" x 2"
- F - (4) squares - 2" x 2"
- G - (1) square - $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ "

4½" Finished Block:

- A - (4) squares - 2" x 2"
- B - (4) squares - $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{4}$ "
- C - (4) squares - $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{4}$ "
- D - (16) squares - $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{4}$ "
(8) each of two fabrics
- E - (4) squares - 1" x 1"
- F - (4) squares - 1" x 1"
- G - (1) square - 2" x 2"

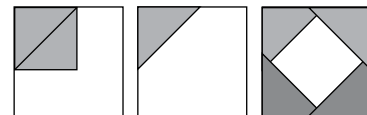
All seams are a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless specified otherwise.

Assembly

1. On the wrong side of the D and E squares, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner.
 - Or use Diagonal Seam Tape as a guide.

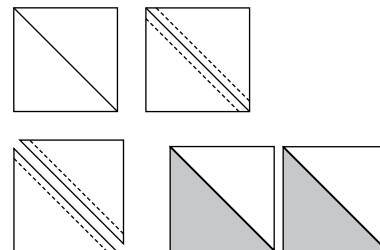


2. With right sides together, align the D squares in the corners of the A squares as shown. Stitch on the line. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press the seam to the triangle.



Repeat for remaining corners.

3. With right sides together, align the E squares with the F squares as shown. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " on both sides of the line. Cut the square apart on the drawn line. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press the seam to the triangle.

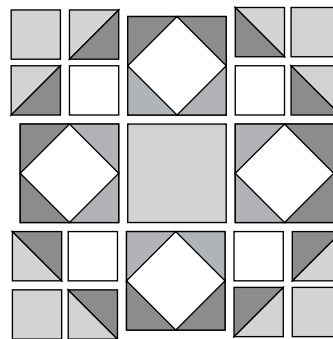


The HSTs will measure 2" x 2" or $1\frac{1}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{4}$ ".

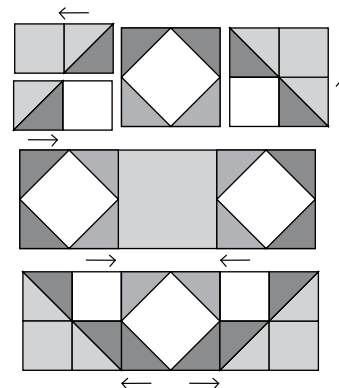

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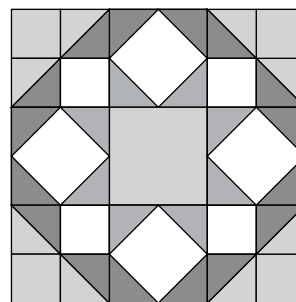
4. Lay out the pieces/parts as shown.



5. Join the units to make three rows. Press the seams in the direction of the arrows - or press them open.



6. Join the rows to complete the block. Press the seams in the direction of the arrows - or press them open.



- 9" block - block will measure 9½" x 9½"
- 4½" block - block will measure 5" x 5"

Stitching with Camille...

- The quilting tip I wish I'd learned when I first started is... lining up, stacking, and cutting multiple strips at once. Especially for background fabrics. It can turn cutting a daunting 428 2" squares into just a few minutes of cutting.
- My best advice to new quilters is to... really work to perfect that 1/4 seam. Everything is easier once you have that perfected.
- When it comes to quilting/sewing tools, don't get between me and my... Bloc-Loc! I use my 6.5" half-squaretriangle Bloc-Loc daily! It's so helpful!
- Don't tell anyone, but when I'm sewing, I don't worry about... pinning. It's pretty rare these days. (Don't tell my mom!)
- My "rock-star stitch group" includes... there are so many quilters I'd love to sit and sew with! But I'll have to go with my "ride or die" Sewdown crew. We met at a retreat 8 years or so ago and just hit it off. We've gotten together many times over the years and it's just so much fun every time!
