

## FINISHED QUILT SIZE 66½" × 77½" Measurements include ¼" seam allowance. Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.

Please check our website www.rileyblakedesigns.com for any revisions before starting this project. This pattern requires a basic knowledge of quilting techniques and terminology. The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric.

## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

1 Honey Bee Rolie Polie (RP-11700-40) % yard Honey Bee Black Plaid (C11703)\* 2½ yards Cloud Solid (C120) 1% yards Light Gray Solid (C120) \*Includes Binding

## CUTTING REQUIREMENTS

Please read instructions before cutting fabrics. Refer to the quilt photo for the placement of each of the fabrics.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Sort the Rolie Polie into 2 piles of black & grays and honey & creams. Add the 2 strips of Black Plaid from the Rolie Polie to the Black Plaid yardage. The quilt shown is constructed using 5 black & gray blocks and 15 honey & cream blocks. The cutting instructions reflect that color combination. If you wish to change the color mix, cut the Rolie Polie strips separately for each block. Include 1 strip each of sizes: 8½", 9½", 10½", 11½", & 12½" per block. There are 20 blocks total.

#### Honey Bee Rolie Polie (RP)

Within each of the 2 color groups, organize strips by length. From assorted black & gray strips, cut:

5 strips 8½" × 2½" 5 strips 9½" × 2½" 5 strips 10½" × 2½" 5 strips 11½" × 2½" 5 strips 12½" × 2½"

From assorted honey & cream strips, cut:

15 strips 8½" × 2½" 15 strips 9½" × 2½" 15 strips 10½" × 2½" 15 strips 11½" × 2½" 15 strips 12½" × 2½"

#### Honey Bee Black Plaid



From yardage cut 8 strips  $2\frac{1}{2} \times WOF$  for binding. From 2 Rolie Polie Black Plaid strips, cut: 30 squares  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$  for posts

#### Cloud Solid (BK)

Cut 3 strips 14½" × WOF. Subcut: 120 strips 1" × 14½"

Cut 14 strips 2½" × WOF.

Subcut: 40 rectangles  $3\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ " 40 rectangles  $3^{"} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ " 40 squares  $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ " 40 rectangles  $2^{"} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ " 40 rectangles  $1\frac{1}{2}$ "  $\times 2\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut 2 strips 2" × WOF. Subcut: 40 squares 2" × 2" for stitch-n-flip corners

### Light Gray Solid

Cut 21 strips  $2\frac{1}{2}$  × WOF. Subcut: 24 strips  $14\frac{1}{2}$  ×  $2\frac{1}{2}$  for horizontal sashing 25 strips  $13\frac{1}{2}$  ×  $2\frac{1}{2}$  for vertical sashing

#### QUILT ASSEMBLY

Refer to the cutting requirements list, quilt photo and layout diagrams for the placement of prints. Press seam allowances following the arrows in the quilt diagrams.

#### **Beehive Blocks**

- 1. Draw a pencil line diagonally on back of each 2"× 2" **BK** square.
- 2. With an  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ " strip laid horizontally in front of you, position a square on the top right corner. Sew on the pencil line.



3. Trim ¼" away from the stitching, flip the triangle open and press. (Stitch and Flip corner)



4. Repeat Steps 2 & 3 with the second square on the top left corner of the rectangle. You will end up with the same size as the original rectangle.



- 5. Repeat Steps 2-4 with all RP 8½" × 2½" rectangles regardless of color group. Make 20.
- 6. Using the same rectangles as above, sew a  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " BK rectangle to each end of the strip. It now measures 14½" × 2½".



- 7. Repeat Step 6 to make 20.
- 8. Add 2 BK rectangles and/or squares to RP strips in the same manner as Step 6 matching the following size pieces:

<b>RP</b> strip 9½" × 2½"	+	BK rectangles 3" × 2½"
<b>RP</b> strip 10½" × 2½"	+	<b>BK</b> squares 2½" × 2½"
<b>RP</b> strip 11½" × 2½"	+	BK rectangles 2" × 2½"
<b>RP</b> strip 12½" × 2½"	+	BK rectangles 1½" × 2½"



All RP/BK rectangle/square combinations will measure  $14\frac{1}{2}$ " ×  $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Keep these organized by color and by **RP** strip size.


9. Sew a  $14\frac{1}{2}$ " × 1" BK strip to the bottom of every RP/BK combination.



In addition, sew a second **BK** strip  $14\frac{1}{2}$ " × 1" to the top of the RP/BK combination with the stitch-n-flip corners.



- 10. Select 5 RP/BK sets—1 each of an 8", 9", 10", 11", and 12" in the color combination of your choice. (Sizes refer to the width of the RP fabric rectangles within the 14½" RP/ BK set.)
- 11. Sew a 9" RP/BK set to the bottom of an 8" RP/BK set.
- 12. Add a 10" RP/BK set to the bottom of the 9" RP/BK set.
- 13. Continue in this fashion until all 5 RP/BK sets are sewn together to make 1 Beehive block.



14. Repeat Steps 10-13 to make a total of 20 Beehive blocks, 5 black & gray, 15 honey & cream. The unfinished blocks measure 14½" × 13½".

## PUTTING IT ALL TOGETHER

## Vertical Sashing

1. Sew a 13<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" light gray vertical sashing strip to the right side of each block.

- 2. Audition block placement within a  $4 \times 5$  layout (5 rows of 4 blocks each). Sew the remaining vertical sashing strips to the left side of the first blocks in each row.
- 3. Sew blocks with sashings together by row to make 5 block rows.

## Horizontal Sashing


1. Sew a post to the end of each 14½" horizontal sashing strip to make a post-sashing set (**PS**). Make 24.


 Sew 4 PS sets together end to end making sure to alternate posts and sashing. Sew a post to the last sashing strip to make a sashing row. Make 6.



- 3. Starting with a sashing row, sew rows together alternating block and sashing rows.
- 4. Finish your quilt by layering the quilt top, batting, and back. Bind with 2½" Black Plaid strips.
