2/3 yard	6 Block Repeat - Multi (A)	349-77
1 3/8 yards	Snow Allover - Navy (B)	356-77*
2/3 yard	Snowflake - Light Blue (C)	359-11
3/8 yard	Forest Critter Allover - Blue (D)	355-11
5/8 yard	Snowflake Allover - Multi (E)	352-77
1 1/3 yards	Bias Plaid - Multi (F)	354-9
5/8 yard	Mittens Allover - Aqua (G)	353-60
1 2/3 yards	Snowflake Border Stripe - Navy (H)	350-77
5 yards	Snowman & Critter Allover - Blue (Backing)	351-11

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 6 Block Repeat - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 10 1/2" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Snow Allover - Navy (B), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 67 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 50 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Snowflake - Light Blue (C), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 12 1/2" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 15 1/2" strips.

From the Forest Critter Allover - Blue (D), cut:

- (2) 5 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 1/2" squares.

From the Snowflake Allover - Multi (E), cut:

- (3) 6 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (17) 6 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (68) 6 1/4" triangles.

From the Bias Plaid - Multi (F), cut:

- (3) 6 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (17) 6 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (68) 6 1/4" triangles.
- (5) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (68) 3" squares.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 65 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 47 1/2" strips.

From the Mittens Allover - Aqua (G), cut:

- (3) 5 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (17) 5 1/2" squares.

From the Snowflake Border Stripe - Navy (H), cut:

- (2) 5 1/2" x 40 1/2" WOF strips.
- (4) 5 1/2" x 34" WOF strips.
- (4) 5 1/2" x 24" WOF strips.

From the Snowman & Critter Allover - Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 88" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 88" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"**. Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total.

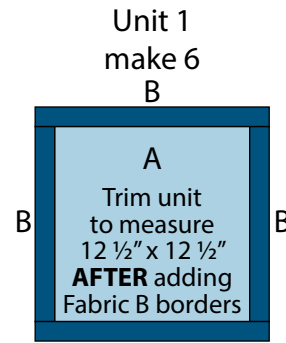

2. Sew (1) 2" x 12 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 2" x 15 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 15 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

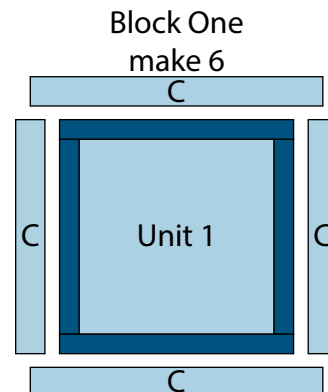

3. Place (1) 3" Fabric F square on the top left corner of (1) 5 1/2" Fabric G square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 4).

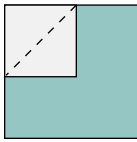

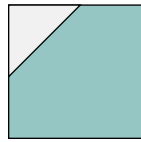

4. Follow Figure 5 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric F square to each of the remaining corners of the 5 1/2" Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 6).

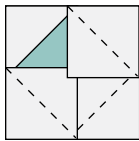

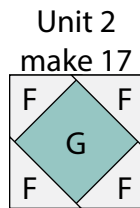

6. Sew together (1) 6 1/4" Fabric E triangle and (1) 6 1/4" Fabric F triangle along short sides to make (1) EF triangle. Sew together (1) 6 1/4" Fabric F triangle and (1) 6 1/4" Fabric E triangle along short sides to make (1) FE triangle. Sew together the (2) triangles along their long sides to make (1) 5 1/2" Unit 3 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (34) Unit 3 squares total.

7. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (17) Unit 4 strips total.

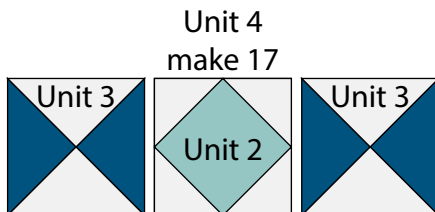

8. Sew together (3) 5 1/2" Fabric D squares and (2) Unit 4 strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Three, Row Five and Row Seven.

9. Sew together (3) Unit 4 strips and (2) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 9). Repeat to make Row Four and Row Six.

10. Sew together the (7) rows from Steps 8-9, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 45 1/2" x 65 1/2" Center Block (Fig. 9).

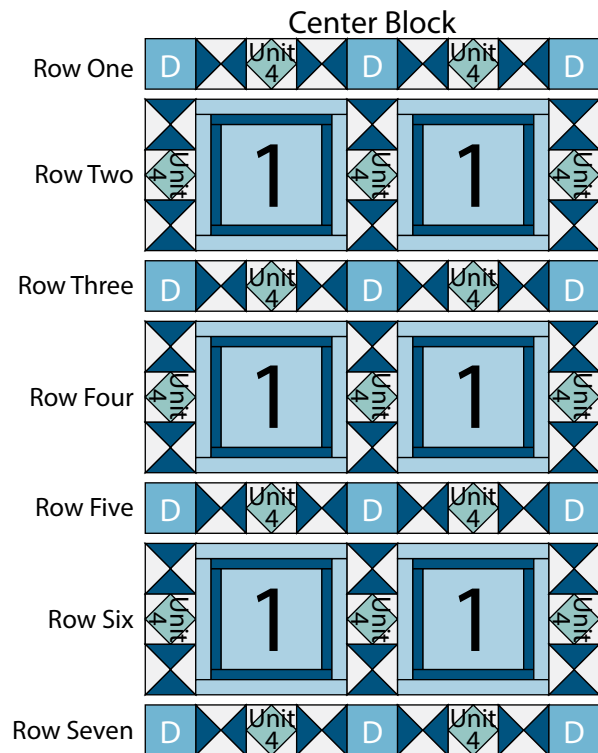

11. Follow Figure 10 for fabric orientation and sew (1) 5 1/2" x 24" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 5 1/2" x 40 1/2" Fabric H strip to make (1) Side Border. Repeat to make a second Side Border.

12. Follow Figure 11 for fabric orientation and sew (2) 5 1/2" x 34" Fabric H strips together end to end to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

13. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 65 1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 47 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) 2" x 67 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 50 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Center (1) Side Border strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

16. Repeat Step 15 to sew the Top and Bottom Border strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 12).

17. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 12), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

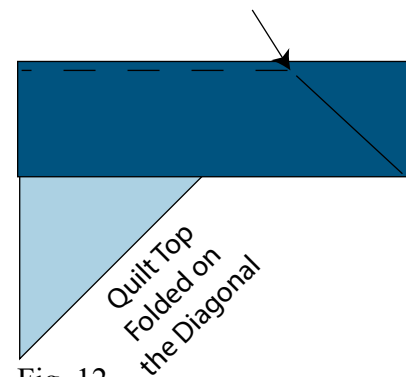

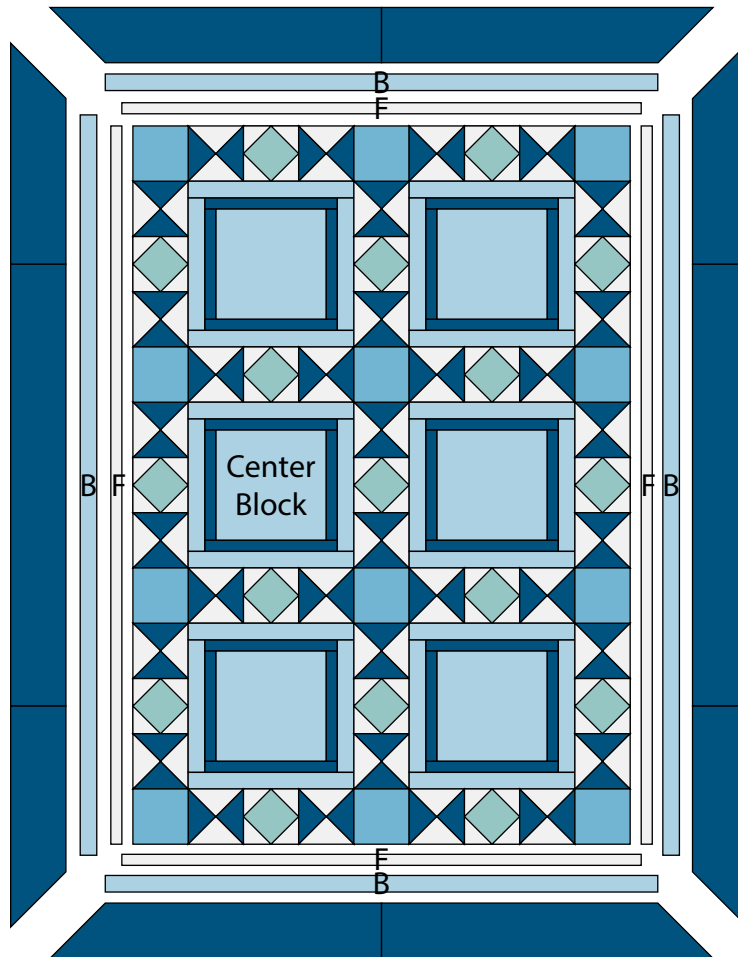
18. Layer and quilt as desired.

19. Sew the (7) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

20. Bind as desired.
