Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (6639P-77 Fractal Vase Panel-24 x 44 – Indigo Multi):

- Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

Fabric B (6631-77 Tossed Leaves – Indigo), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 32 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric C (6632-11 Dotty Diagonal – White), cut:

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 44 ½" strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x 30 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric D (1351-Sea Glass Just Color! – Sea Glass), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (4) 3 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (6) 3 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 3 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 52 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 78 ½" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 63 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

Fabric E (6633-77 Kaleidoscope Floral – Indigo), cut:

- (1) 7 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (5) 7 ½" squares.

Fabric F (1351-Grape Just Color! – Grape), cut:

- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (18) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric G (6630-11 Flower Allover – White), cut:

- (1) 7 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 7 ½" squares.

Fabric H (1351-Green Just Color! – Green), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric I (6637-77 Wave Geo – Indigo Multi), cut:

- (1) 7 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 7 ½" squares.

Fabric J (6635-77 Spirals – Indigo Multi), cut:

- (1) 7 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 7 ½" squares.

Fabric K (1351-Teal Just Color! – Teal), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric L (6636-77 Whirling Striations – Indigo Multi), cut:

- (1) 7 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (4) 7 ½" squares.

Cutting - Continued

Fabric M (1351-Aegean Blue Just Color! – Aegean Blue), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric N (6630-77 Flower Allover – Indigo), cut:

- (1) 7 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (3) 7 ½" squares.

Fabric O (1351-Grass Just Color! – Grass), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 1 ½" x 7 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (6) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric P (6634-77 Nouveau Geo – Indigo Multi), cut:

- (5) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 90" strips.
- (4) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 72" strips.

Fabric Q (6632-77 Dotty Diagonal – Indigo), cut:

- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Backing (6635-77 Spirals – Indigo Multi), cut:

- (2) 94" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 76" x 94" back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 44 ½"**.

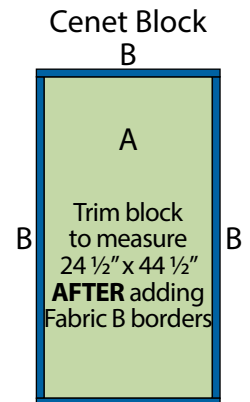

2. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 7 ½" Fabric M strip to each side of (1) 7 ½" Fabric L square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric M strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric L square to make (1) 9 ½" Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

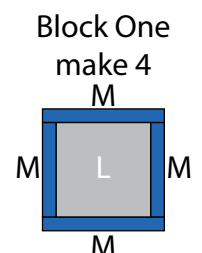
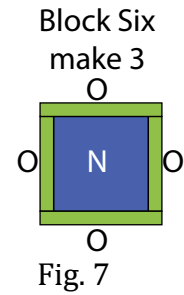
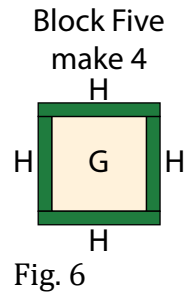
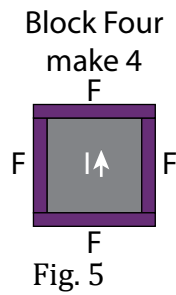
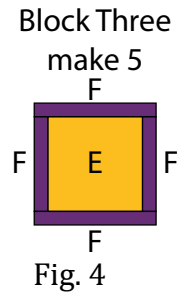
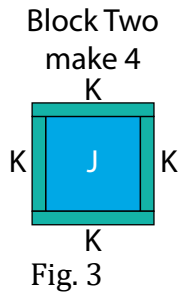

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 3-7 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (4) Block Two squares, (5) Block Three squares, (4) Block Four squares, (4) Block Five squares and (3) Block Six squares.

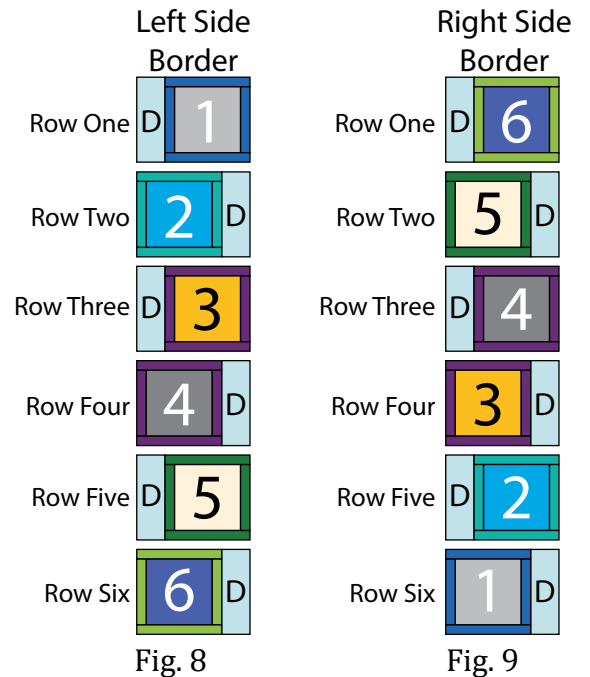


4. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 9 1/2" Fabric D strip to the left side of (1) Block One square lengthwise to make Row One (Fig. 8).

5. Repeat Step 4 and refer to Figure 8 for component identification and placement to make Row Two through Row Six.

6. Sew together the (6) Rows from Steps 4-5, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 8).

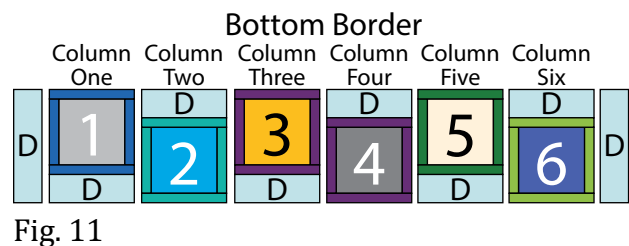
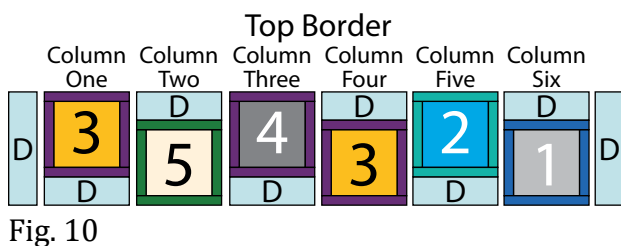
7. Repeat Steps 4-6 and refer to Figure 9 for component identification and placement to make the Right Side Border.



8. Repeat Steps 4-6 and refer to Figure 10 for component identification and placement to make Column One through Column Six.

9. Sew together the (6) columns from Step 8, lengthwise and in numerical order from left to right. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric D strip to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border.

10. Repeat Steps 8-9 and refer to Figure 11 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Bottom Border



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

11. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 30 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
12. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
13. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block.
14. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
15. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.
16. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
17. Sew (1) 2" x 78 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 63 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
18. Center (1) 3" x 90" Fabric P strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
19. Repeat Step 18 to sew (1) 3" x 72" Fabric P strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 12).
20. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 12), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

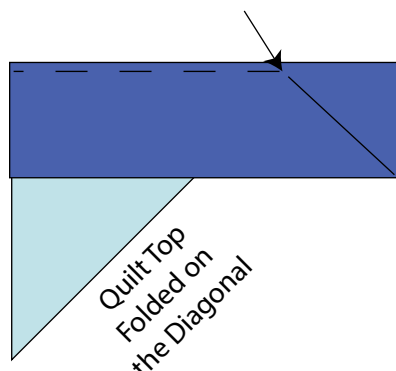

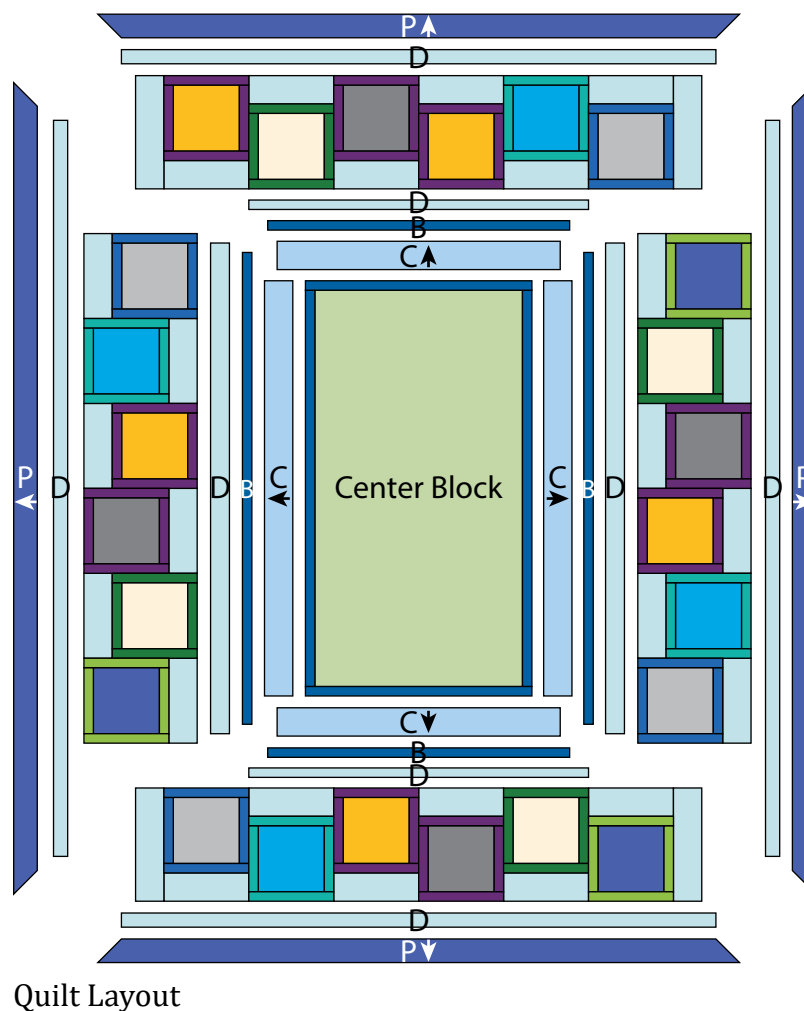
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

21. Press the quilt top and 67" x 85" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

22. Cut the ends of the (8) Fabric Q binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

23. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
