HST

Quilt finishes 72" x 90" 20 Blocks finish: 18" x 18"

The connections between the easy-to-piece blocks give this quilt a more complex look, and the eye is not certain where one block stops and the next one begins. Choose a rosy or a sky-blue palette to make this queen-comforter quilt. The 20 large blocks are made entirely with simple half-square triangles and squares that make this easy enough for a beginning quilter.

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¹/4" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 43" wide).

8 Med. From each:

Cut (35) squares 4" (or 3%") Read Step 1 before cutting Cut (10) squares $3^{1}\!\!/\!\!2''$

8 Lights From each:

Cut (35) squares 4" (or 3%") Read Step 1 before cutting Cut (10) squares 3½"

Binding


Cut (9) strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF for binding

Backing

Cut (2) panels 40" x 98", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

Making the Quilt

1. The blocks are made with half-square triangles (HST). Select a medium print to pair with a light print. Each quarter block is made with 7 HST made from the same pair of prints. Use your favorite method to make HST that finish 3", or follow these directions. Squares cut 4" will be trimmed after stitching. Cut the squares 3⁷/₈" if you do not wish to trim later.




Quarter Block – Make 80

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the light 4" squares. With right sides together, position a marked square on top of a medium print square. Stitch ¼" on each side of the diagonal line. Cut apart on the drawn line. Press seam allowance toward the medium fabric. Trim to 3½" if needed. Make 7 HST alike for each Quarter Block. Make 80 Quarter Blocks.

2. Referring to the Quarter Block diagram, join 7 HST and a light and a medium 3½" square into 3 rows, rotating the HST as shown. Join the rows. Repeat to make 4 different Quarter Blocks for each big block. Join the Quarter Blocks, rotating them to make the design as shown. Make 20 Blocks.




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Harmony Quilt

3. Referring to the Quilt Diagram, arrange the blocks in 5 rows of 4 blocks each. No print should touch itself between blocks. Once you are satisfied with the color arrangement, join the blocks into rows, and then join the rows.

Finishing the Quilt

4. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around patches or quilt an overall design. Bind to finish the quilt.




Quilt Diagram

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
