



#### **Materials**

<sup>3</sup> / <sub>4</sub> yard	Gravel Texture - Charcoal (B)	511-97*
1/4 yard	Tossed Tools - Charcoal (C)	517-97
1/4 yard	Sign Tossed - Stone (D)	512-30
1/4 yard	Tossed Motorcycle - Gray (E)	513-90
1/4 yard	Motor Plate - Black (F)	515-99
½ yard	Modern Melody Basics - Pigment White (G)	
		1063-01W
3/8 yard	Brick - Brick (H)	516-88
⅓ yard	Patchwork - Black (I)	518-99
3 ½ yards	Tonal Print - Gray (Backing)	514-90

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the 24 Inch Bike Panel - Brick (A):

• (1) 42  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22  $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle, centered on the panel.

#### From the Gravel Texture - Charcoal (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 22 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 ½" strips.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Tossed Tools - Charcoal (C), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

#### From the Sign Tossed - Stone (D), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

#### From the Tossed Motorcycle - Gray (E), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ½" x 6 ½" strips.

#### From the Motor Plate - Black (F), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Pigment White (G), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 47 ½" strips.

#### From the Brick - Brick (H), cut:

• (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3 ½" x 47 ½" strips.

#### From the Patchwork - Black (I), cut:

• (3) 8 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 8 ½" x 47 ½" strips.


#### From the Tonal Print - Gray (Backing), cut:

• (2) 55" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 55" x 69" back.

#### **Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 22 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 42 ½" x 22 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 45 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure** 44 ½" x 24 ½".



2. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric G strip to the top of (1) 4 ½" Fabric D square lengthwise to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (3) Unit 1 rectangles total.



3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 3-5 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Unit 2 rectangles, (3) Unit 3 rectangles and (2) Unit 4 rectangles.

- 4. Sew together (1) 4 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric C rectangle,
- (1) Unit 1 rectangle, (1) 4 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric E rectangle,
- (1) Unit 2 rectangle, 4 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric C rectangle,
- (1) Unit 1 rectangle, 4 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric E rectangle,
- (1) Unit 2 rectangle, 4 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric C rectangle,
- (1) Unit 1 rectangle and 4 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric E rectangle, in that order from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 6).



5. Repeat Step 4 and refer to Figure 7 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Bottom Border.




#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
6. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 7. Sew (1) 2" x 36 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 47 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 8. Sew (1) 3 ½' x 47 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 9. Sew (1) 8 ½" x 47 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 10. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 11. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 12. Bind as desired.
