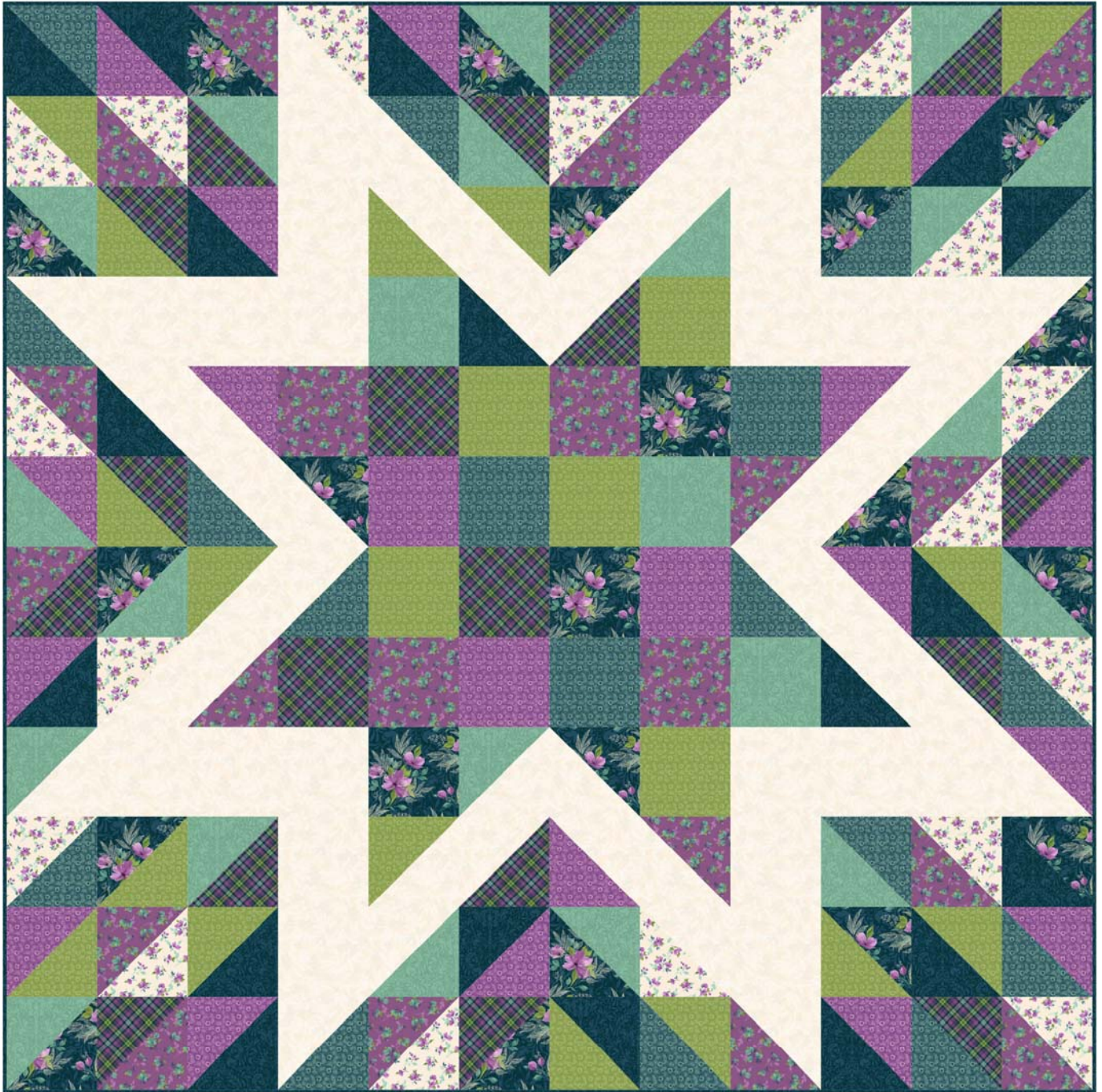

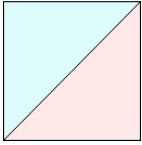

(2) 7" x WOF strips from one fabric is sufficient to cut (10) 7" x 7" squares. Cut each 7" squares diagonally once to yield (160) half-square-triangles.</p> <p>From remainder fabrics, cut an assortment of (24) 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" squares.</p>

Subcut (20) 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" squares. (4) 7" x WOF strips. Subcut (20) 7" x 7" squares. Cut squares diagonally once to yield (40) half-square-triangles.</p>

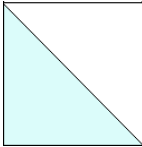
Quilt Top Assembly

1. HST units. Sew together half-square-triangles of 2 different prints to make (1) HST unit. Open and press. Align diagonal seam of HST units against 45 degree line on quilting ruler, trim units to measure 6 ½" x 6 ½" unfinished.



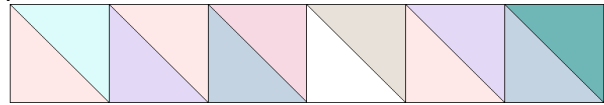
Quilters are free to pair up the fabrics in making a total of (120) HST units using (2) different prints from Fabrics A-I.

Make also a total (40) HST units using (1) print from Fabric A-I and Fabric J.



2. Refer to row unit diagrams below, arrange and sew together (6) HST units and/or 6 ½" squares to make a row unit. Make a total of (6) row units.

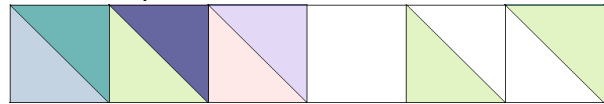
Row 1: (5) 2-print HST units, and (1) print/Fabric J HST unit.



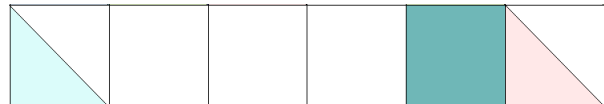
Row 2: (4) 2-print HST units, (1) print/Fabric J HST unit and (1) 6 ½" Fabric J square.



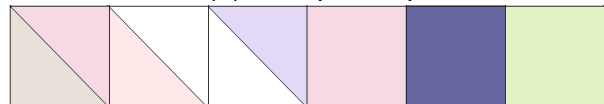
Row 3: (3) 2-print HST units, (2) print/Fabric J HST unit and (1) 6 ½" Fabric J square.



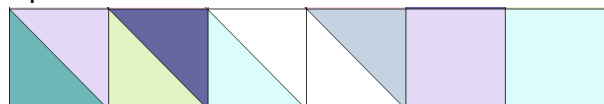
Row 4: (2) print/Fabric J HST unit, (1) 6 ½" print square, and (1) 6 ½" Fabric J square.



Row 5: (1) 2-print HST unit, (2) print/Fabric J HST units, and (3) 6 ½" print squares.

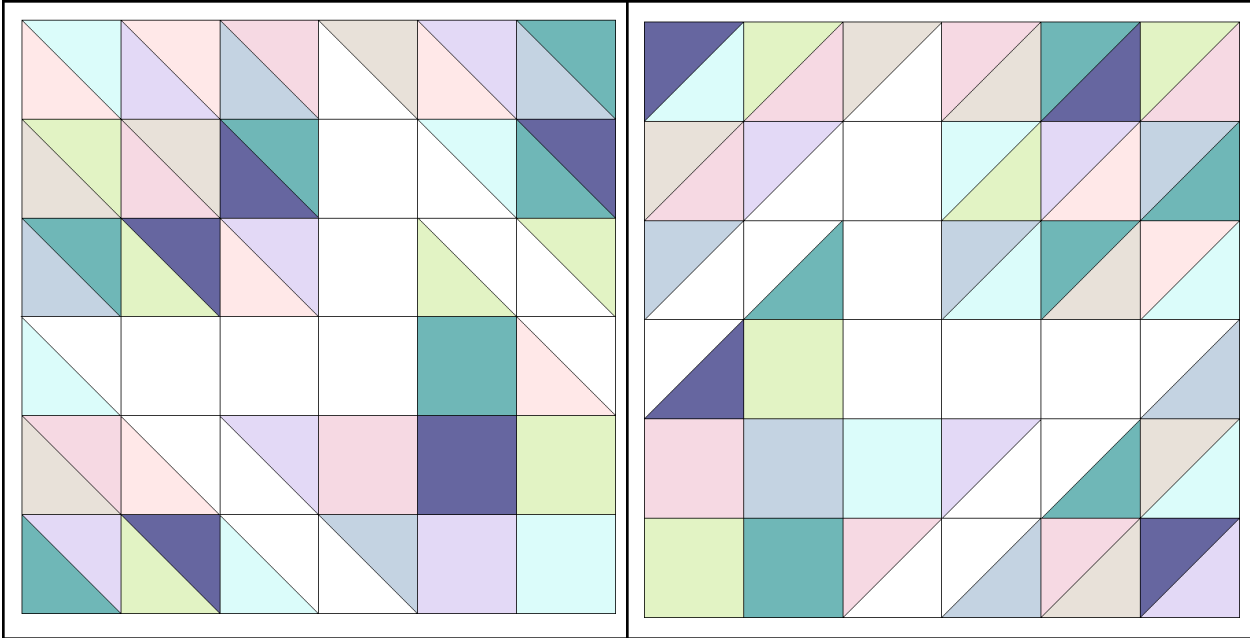


Row 6: (2) 2-print HST units, (2) print/Fabric J HST units, and (2) 6 ½" print squares.

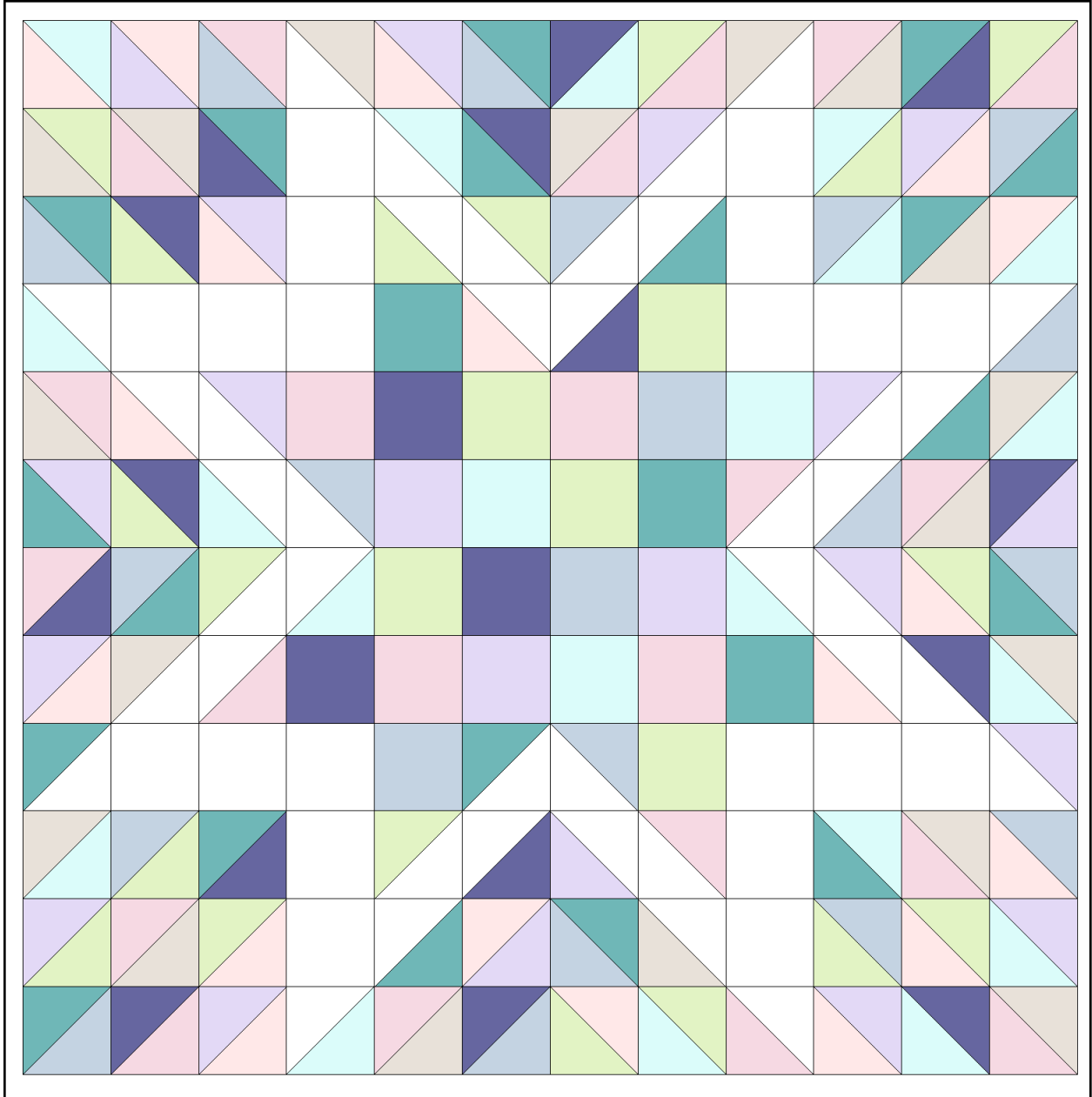


3. Sew together step 2 row units along the long sides to make a quadrant. Make a total of (2) quadrants

4. Repeat to make (2) mirror-imaged quadrants.



5. Sew (1) quadrant from step 3, and (1) mirror-imaged quadrant from step 4 to make a row unit. Make a total of (2) row units. Sew row units together to complete quilt top.



Sample Quilt showing fabric placements, even though quilters are free to determine the final layout with different fabric placements.



Finishing

1. Layer backing, batting and quilt top.
2. Baste the layers together. Quilt as desired.
3. Bind to complete the quilt.
