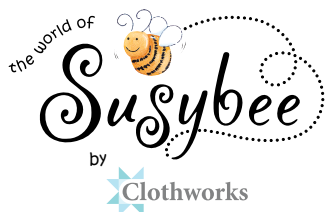

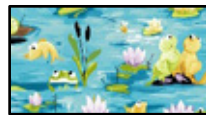

Finished quilt size: 39" x 49"

Backing: 42" x 57" (1 5/8y of 42" wide fabric; SB20408-950 suggested)

Fabric and Cutting Chart

Fabric	Yardage	Cutting Directions
 Fabric A SB20053-101	5/8y	a. Sashing (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (2) 1 1/2" x 18 1/2" and (1) 1 1/2" x 27 1/2" rectangles. b. Inner border #1 (4) 2" x WOF strips. Subcut (2) 2" x 30 1/2" and (2) 2" x 37 1/2" strips. c. Inner border #3 (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Cut (2) 1 1/2" x 35 1/2" strips from (2) WOF strips. Piece leftover fabric with each of remaining strips and subcut (2) 1 1/2" x 43 1/2" strips.
 Fabric B SB20103-950  Fabric C SB20171-845	1/8y	Inner border #2, cut from each fabric (1) 2" x WOF strip. Subcut (2) 2" x 17" rectangles.
 Fabric D SB20197-820  Fabric F SB20268-820	1/8y	Inner border #2, cut from each fabric (1) 2" x WOF strip. Subcut (2) 2" x 20 1/2" rectangles.
 Fabric E SB20208-330	1/2y	Outer border (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (2) 2 1/2" x 39 1/2" from (2) WOF strips. Piece remaining (3) WOF strips and subcut (2) 2 1/2" x 45 1/2" strips.
 Binding SB20053-280	1/2y	Binding (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips Piece strips to make a continuous strip for binding.
 Fabric G SB20405-780	1y	Quilt center Starting from each corner of panel design, measure and cut (4) 13 1/2" x 18 1/2" rectangles.

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Quilt Top Assembly

1. Sew (2) $13\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles cut from the top portion of Fabric G panel design to the opposite long sides of (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle to make a row unit.



Repeat for the bottom (2) $13\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.



2. Sew step 1 row units to the opposite long sides of (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $27\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle to complete quilt center.



3. Inner border #1. Sew (2) 2 " x $37\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strips to the opposite long sides of quilt center, followed by (2) 2 " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strips to the remaining opposite short sides of quilt center.



4. Inner border #2. Sew together (1) 2 " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D and (1) 2 " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F rectangles to make a pieced column. Make (2) pieced columns and sew to the opposite long sides of quilt center, noting placement showing in image.



Sew (1) 2 " x 17 " Fabric B and (1) 2 " x 17 " Fabric C rectangles to make a pieced row. Make (2) pieced rows and sew to the remaining opposite short sides of quilt center, noting placement shown in image.

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5. Inner border #3. Sew (2) 1 ½" x 43 ½" Fabric A strips to the opposite long sides of quilt center, followed by (2) 1 ½" x 35 ½" Fabric A strips to the remaining opposite short sides of quilt center.

6. Outer border. Sew (2) 2 ½" x 45 ½" Fabric E strips to the opposite long sides of quilt center, followed by (2) 2 ½" x 39 ½" Fabric E strips to the remaining opposite short sides of quilt center to complete quilt top.



Finishing

1. Layer backing, batting and quilt top.
2. Baste the layers together. Quilt as desired.
3. Bind to complete the quilt.

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
