


ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

-  1 3/4 yards of medium weight 2-sided fusible interlining
-  2 yards 2-sided paper backed fusible for attaching the bats to the border
-  Black Thread

**Note: There is enough orange fabric to make the back of the runner without having to buy extra fabric. However, you may want to have a black backing to match the black bat border. In this case, increase the black fabric to 1 3/4 yards.*

ASSEMBLY:

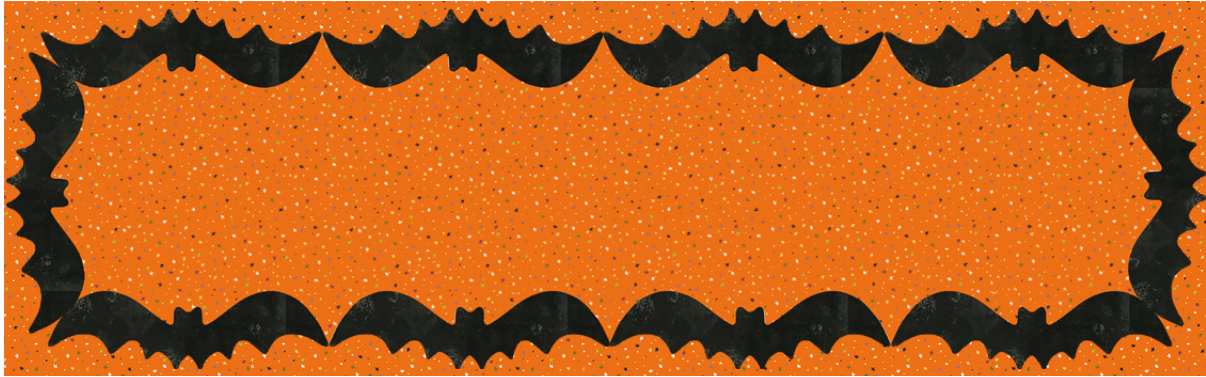
1. Follow directions on Page 3 to create (1) bat template. On the paper side of the fusible, trace around the bat template to create (10) bats. Cut out bats about a 1/4" from the drawn line and then fuse to the wrong side of **Fabric B**. Cut out fused shapes on the drawn line. Make (10) bats.



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2. Take (1) 63" x 20" **Fabric A** rectangle and with the right side facing up, place on a flat surface.

Place the (10) bats around the border as shown.

3. Press the bats into place following the manufacturer's recommended instructions for the fusible.

4. Once all the bats are attached, place the backing fabric, right side down, on a flat surface. Next, lay the 1-3/4 yard 2-sided fusible down on the wrong side of the backing. Then, lay the top, wrong side down, on the fusible to create a quilt sandwich and fuse the layers together.

5. Now that the top and back are attached, use a tight zigzag stitch to sew around each bat to fully secure in place. Take your time sewing around each curve.

6. Carefully cut away the fabric on the outside edge as close to the bat edge as possible. Be careful not to cut your zigzag stitch. Press the runner to flatten edges and now it is ready to use!

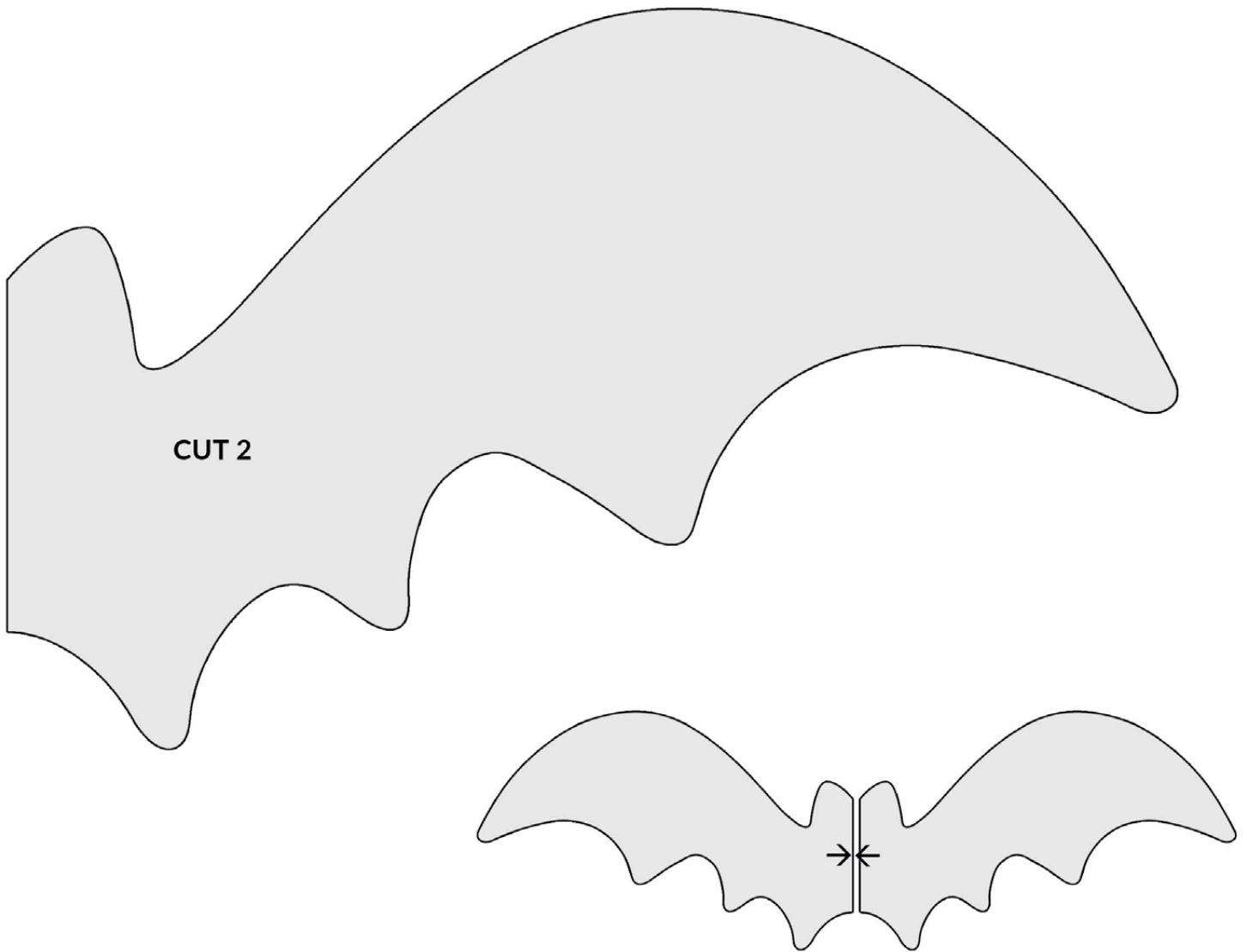
