



## **Spooky Hallow Quilt Instructions**

Please read all instructions before you begin. Seam allowance is 1/4. Fabric is abbreviated as 'F' - for example, F1 refers to Fabric 1. Press in the direction of arrows.

# **Pumpkin Blocks**

1. Sew an F1-B rectangle to each side of an F3-L square. Press towards B.

2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on all the F1-A squares.

3. Place an F1-A square on one corner of an F2-K square, RST. Sew on the marked line. Cut ¼" away from the stitching. Press away from the center. Repeat for the other 3 corners.

4. Sew the step 1 unit to the top of the step 3 unit. Press.

5. Sew an F1-C rectangle to the top of the step 4 unit. Press towards C.

6. Sew a F1-D rectangle to the bottom of the step 5 unit. Press towards D.

7. Sew an F1-E rectangle to the right side of the step 6 unit. Press towards E.

8. Sew another F1-E rectangle to the left side of the step 7 unit. Press towards E.

9. Repeat Steps 1-8 to make a total of 8 pumpkin blocks.











## **Cat Blocks**

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on all the F5-N squares.

2. Place a F5-N square on one corner of the F1-C rectangle, RST, as shown to the right. Sew on the marked line. Cut ¼" away from the stitching. Press away from the center.

3. Repeat step 2 with another F5-N square on the opposite side.

4. Sew the step 3 unit to the top of an F5-M rectangle. Press towards M.

5. Place a pair of cat eyes on the step 4 unit, refer to the illustration for placement. Make sure to leave enough room for seam allowance at the top and sides of the M rectangles. Use your preferred appliqué method to attach the eyes.

6. Repeat steps 2-5 to make 3 more F5 cat blocks, for a total of 4.

7. Repeat steps 2-6 to make the other cat blocks, paying attention to the total number of each type.

**Cat Tail Blocks** (also known as Snails Trail) 1. Sew a F4-J square to the left of a F1-J square. Press towards F1.

2. Sew a F1-J square to the left of a F5-J square. Press towards F1.

3. Sew step one to step two, creating a four-patch unit. Press. Square to  $4-\frac{3}{2}$ ".

4. Center a F4-I triangle, RST, on the four-patch unit, paying close attention to the diagram. Sew and press towards the I triangle.

5. Repeat step 4 on the opposite side with a F5-I triangle.

6. Center and sew (2) F1-I triangles to the remaining sides of the block. Press towards the I triangles. Square to 6-½".

7. Center a F5-H triangle, RST, on the step 6 unit, paying attention to placement. Sew and press towards the H triangle.

8. Repeat step 7 on the opposite side with a F4-H triangle.

9. Center and sew (2) F1-H triangles to the remaining sides of the block. Press towards the H triangles. Square to 9".

10. Center a F4-G triangle, RST, on the step 9 block, paying attention to placement. Sew and press towards the G triangle.

11. Repeat step 10 on the opposite side with a F5-G triangle.

12. Center and sew (2) F1-G triangles to the remaining sides of the block. Press towards the G triangles. Square to  $12-\frac{1}{2}$ ".

 Repeat steps 1-12 to make a total of (2) F4-F5 cat tail blocks.
Repeat steps 1-12 to make (4) cat tail blocks with F6 & F7.

15. Repeat steps 1-12 to make (4) cat tail blocks with F3 & F8.





# **Top Assembly**

1. Lay out the quilt blocks as shown below. Make (2) each of Row 1, Row 2, and Row 3.

- 2. Sew blocks into rows. Press in one direction to nest seams.
- 3. Sew rows together. Press.



# Finishing

1. Layer the backing (wrong side up), batting and quilt top (right side up). Baste layers to secure. Quilt as desired. Trim the excess backing and batting.

2. Sew the binding strips together into one continuous strip. Press in half length-wise. Sew the binding to the quilt top with a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn the binding to the back side of the quilt and stitch down by hand with matching thread.
