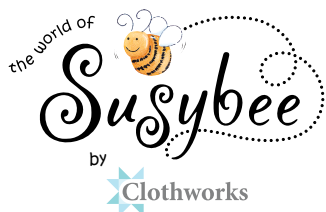

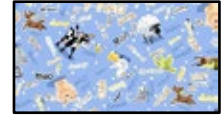

Finished block size: 8" x 8"












Suggested Backing: SB20415-760, 52" x 65" (3y of 42" wide fabric, horizontal seam)















 Fabric A SB20417-760	1y  (1 panel)	Quilt center (1) 34 1/2" x 40 1/2" rectangle, centering design.
 Fabric B SB20053-101	1 1/8y	a. Sashing (1) 1 1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut (1) 1 1/2" x 40 1/2" strip.  b. Tree blocks (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (12) 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles then (12) 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares (1) 1 3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut (12) 1 3/4" x 3" rectangles. (2) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut (12) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" squares.  c. Fence blocks (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut (32) 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares and (8) 1 1/2" x 3 1/2" rectangles. (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut (4) 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" and (8) 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" rectangles.  d. Outer border (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Piece strips and subcut (2) 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" and (2) 2 1/2" x 53 1/2" strips.
 Fabric C SB20053-280	3/8y	a. Tree blocks (1) 1 1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut (6) 1 1/2" x 1 3/4" rectangles.  b. Fence blocks (1) 1 1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut (16) 1 1/2" x 2" rectangles. (1) 2" x WOF strip. Subcut (8) 2" x 2 1/2" rectangles. (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut (8) 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangles.



## Constructing tree blocks

<p>1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabric B square. Place square, right sides together, at the top left corner of (1) 6 1/2" (horizontal) x 7 1/4" (vertical) green rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal corner triangle. Repeat with an additional 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabric B at the top right corner, and (2) 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" Fabric B squares at the bottom left and right corners of the same green rectangle.</p>				
<p>2. Sew (2) 1 3/4" x 3" Fabric B rectangles to the opposite sides of (1) 1 1/2" x 1 3/4" Fabric C rectangle to make a row unit. Sew row unit to the bottom of step 1 unit to make a tree unit. Unit measures 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" unfinished.</p>				
<p>3. Sew (2) 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" Fabric B rectangles to the left and right sides of step 2 unit to complete (1) block. Block measures 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" unfinished.</p>				
<p>4. ## Constructing fence blocks

<p>1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) 1 ½" x 1 ½" Fabric B square. Place square, right sides together, at the top left corner of (1) 2 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim ¼" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal corner triangle. Repeat with an additional 1 ½" x 1 ½" Fabric B square at the top right corner. Make a total of (2) units.</p>	
<p>2. Sew together (2) 2" x 2 ½" Fabric C and (2) 1 ½" x 2 ½" Fabric B rectangles alternating, to make a sewn unit. Add (1) 2 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric B rectangle to the top of unit.</p>	
<p>3. Sew together (2) 1 ½" x 2" Fabric C and (2) 1 ½" x 1 ½" Fabric B squares, alternating, to make a sewn unit. Add (1) 1 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric B rectangle to the top of unit. Make a total of (2) units.</p>	
<p>4. Sew step 1 units to the opposite sides of step 2 units, followed by step 3 units to the opposite sides to complete (1) block. Block measures 8 ½" x 8 ½" unfinished. Make a total of (4) blocks.</p>

# Open Gate

## Quilt Top Assembly

1. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top, and (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the bottom of (1)  $34\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A rectangle.



2. Refer to quilt image for block placement. Arrange and sew together (3) tree blocks and (2) fence blocks to make a pieced row. Make (2) pieced rows and add to the top and bottom of quilt center.



3. Add (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the bottom of quilt center. Sew (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $53\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips to the opposite long sides of quilt center, followed by (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $44\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strips to the remaining opposite short sides of quilt center to complete quilt top.



## Finishing

1. Layer backing, batting and quilt top.
2. Baste the layers together. Quilt as desired.
3. Bind to complete the quilt.
