- (A) 7299-93 5/8 yard (0.58 m)
- (B) 1351-Navy** 3/4 yard (0.69 m)
- (C) 1351-Pigment White** 3/4 yard (0.69 m)
- (D) Oyster-35+ 1/3 yard (0.31 m)
- (E) 7301-71 1 yard (0.92 m)
- (F) 7302-77 1 5/8 yards (1.49 m)*
- (G) 7298-93 1/2 yard (0.46 m)
- (H) 7296-77 1 2/3 yards (1.52 m)

Backing

- 7295-77 3 1/2 yards (3.21 m)

Additional Supplies Needed

- Batting 63" x 76" (Recommended: Air Lite® Colour Me 100% Cotton) (160.02 cm x 193.04 cm)
- Piecing and sewing thread
- Quilting and sewing supplies

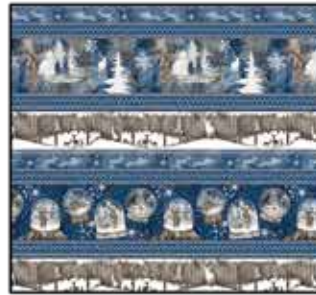

Cutting

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Fabric A (7299-93 Tonal Scenic – Taupe), cut:

- (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (36) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric B (1351-Navy Just Color! – Navy), cut:

- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (144) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric C (1351-Pigment White Just Color! – Pigment White), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 53 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 43 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip, sub-cut (20) 1 ½" squares.

Fabric D (Oyster-35 Peppered Cottons – Oyster), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric E (7301-71 Trees – Blue), cut:

- (6) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (48) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.

Fabric F (7302-77 Snowflake Toss – Dark Blue), cut:

- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (96) 2 ½" squares.
- (11) 1 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (31) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric G (7298-93 Fawn Scenic – Taupe), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (24) 4 ½" squares.

Fabric H (7296-77 Patch Toss – Blue), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x 56 ½" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric cut (2) 6 ½" x 55 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

Backing (7295-77 Snow Globes Toss – Dark Blue), cut:

- (2) 63" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 63" x 76" to make the back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

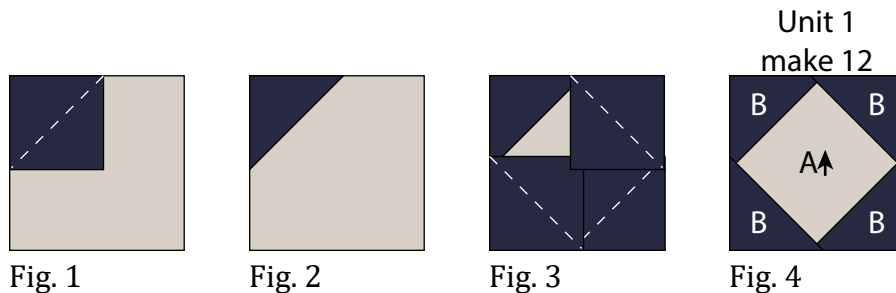
Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

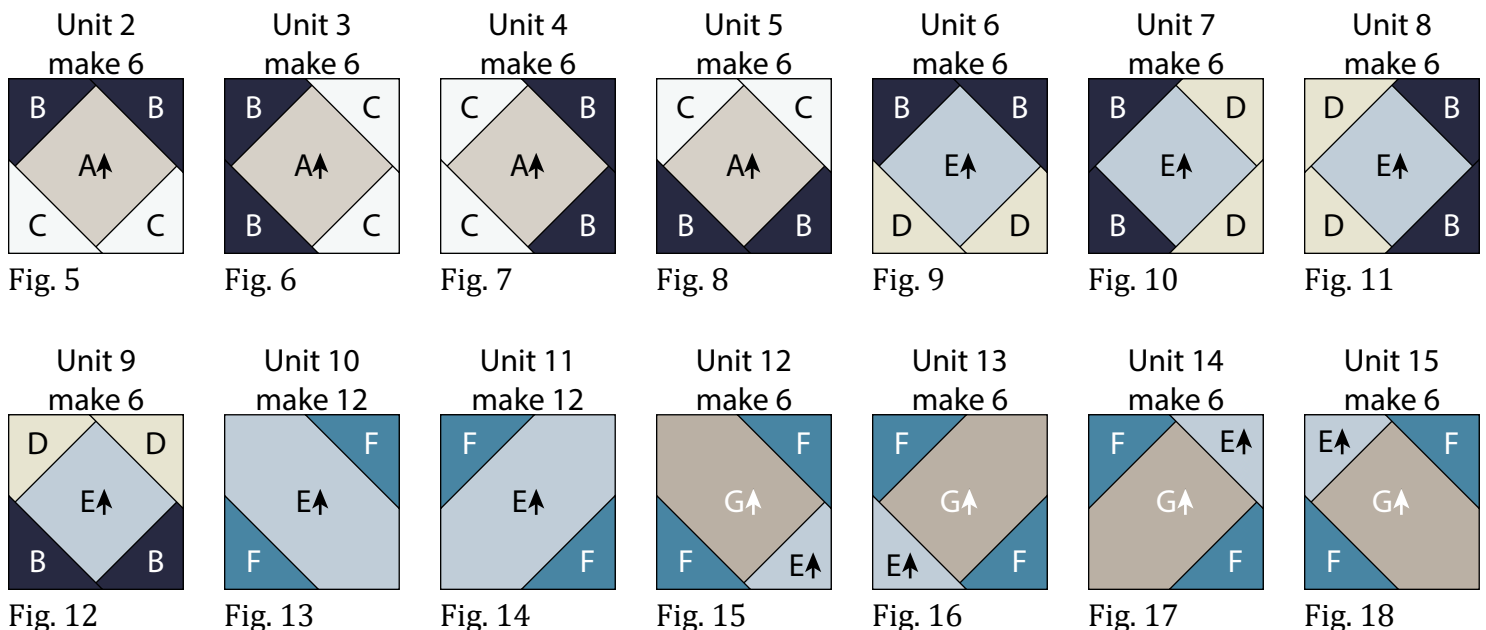
1. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric A square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 2).

2. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the 4 ½" Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 4).

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (12) Unit 1 squares total.



4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figures 5-18 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make the indicated number of each unit square for Unit 2 through Unit 15.



5. Sew together (1) Unit 10 square, (1) Unit 2 square and (1) Unit 11 square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 19).

6. Sew together (1) Unit 3 square, (1) Unit 1 square and (1) Unit 4 square, in that order from left to right, to make the middle row (Fig. 19).

7. Sew together (1) Unit 11 square, (1) Unit 5 square and (1) Unit 10 square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 19).

8. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 5-7 lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 19).

9. Repeat Steps 5-8 to make (6) Block One squares total.

10. Repeat Steps 5-8 and refer to Figure 20 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares.

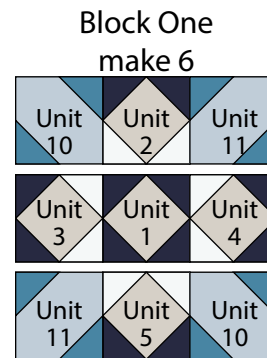

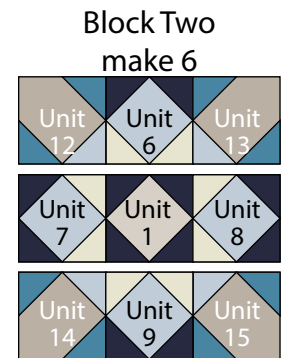

11. Sew together (4) 1 1/2" Fabric C squares and (3) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) 1 1/2" x 40 1/2" Block Three strip (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (5) Block Three strips total.

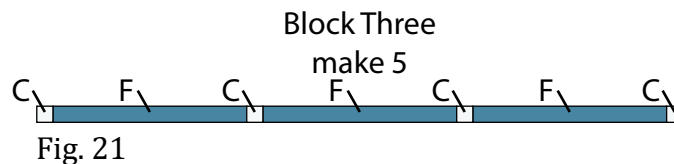

12. Sew together (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, (1) Block One square and (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 22). Repeat to make Row Three.

13. Sew together (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" Fabric F strip, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 22). Repeat to make Row Four.

14. Sew together the (5) Block Three strips and (4) Pieced Rows in numerical order, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the 40 1/2" x 53 1/2" Center Block (Fig. 22).

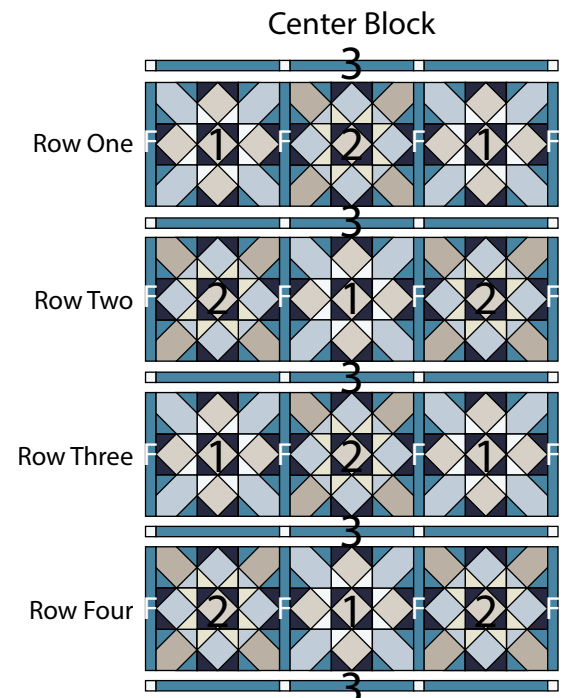

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

15. Sew (1) 2" x 53 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 43 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 6 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

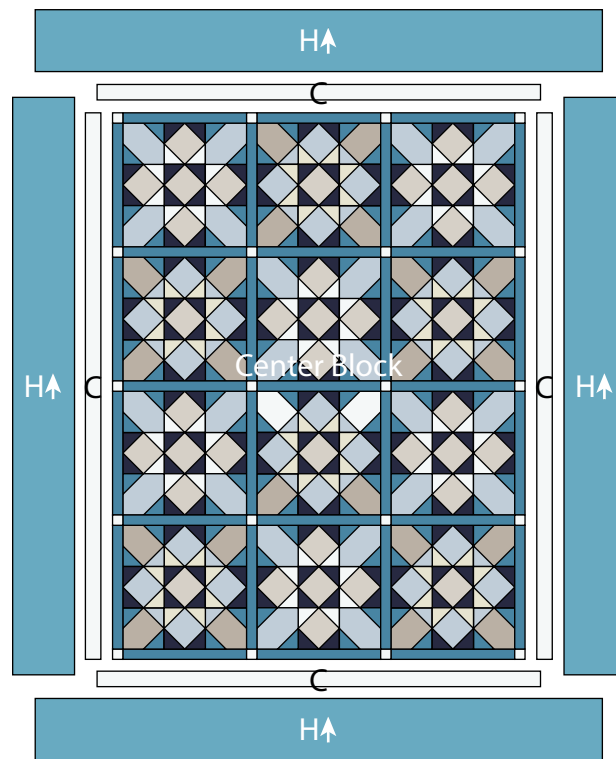
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

17. Press the quilt top and 63" x 76" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

18. Cut the ends of the (7) Fabric F binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

19. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
