

- Fabric 4 Paisley Rhythm multi/white 16154-09
- Fabric 5Multi Squares white/multi1767-92
- Fabric 6 Paisley Rhythm teal 16155-84
- Fabric 7 Modern Basket Weave light teal 16159-04
- Fabric 8 Modern Basket Weave black 16159-12
- Fabric 9 Diamond Circle teal 16158-84

<u>CUTTING</u>

Width-of-fabric (WOF) is fabric cut from selvage to selvage.

- 1. From Fabric 1: Fussy cut six 9 1/2" squares centered on a floral motif
- 2. From each of Fabric 2, Fabric 3, and Fabric 4: Cut two 9 1/2" squares.
- 3. From each of Fabric 5 and Fabric 6: Cut three 9 ¹/₂" squares.
- **4. Also from Fabric 6:** Cut four $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " pieces.
- 4. From each of Fabric 7 and Fabric 9: Cut three 2 ¹/₂" x WOF strips
- **5. From Fabric 8:** Cut ten 2" x WOF strips, cut six 4 ½" x WOF strips, and cut seven 2 ½" x WOF strips.

ASSEMBLY

Refer to the quilt photo for steps 1-4.

1. Sew the ten 2" wide Fabric 8 strips short ends together to make one long strip. Cut four 2" x 62" strips and fifteen 2" x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces.

2. Block rows. Noting placement, sew six designated 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares alternately together with five 2" x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric 8 pieces to make a 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62" *vertical* row. Make 3 rows.

3. Sashing rows. Using 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF (width of fabric) strips, sew a Fabric 7 strip lengthwise to a Fabric 9 strip. Press the seam toward Fabric 9. Make 3 strip sets. Cross cut forty-eight 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide segments. Sew 24 segments together, alternating the teal fabrics, to make one long strip. Sew a 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric 6 piece to each end, press seams in one direction. Sew a 2" x 62" Fabric 8 strip to each long side to complete a 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62" vertical row. Make a second row.

4. Sew the block rows alternately together with the sashing rows complete the 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 62" quilt center.

5. Sew the six 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide Fabric 8 strips short ends together to make one long strip. Measure your quilt before cutting the following border lengths. Cut two 62" lengths and two 49 $\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths. Sew the longer strips to the long sides of the quilt center and the shorter strips to the top and bottom.


Finishing

1. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste the layers together and quilt as desired.

2. Sew the seven 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide Fabric 8 strips short ends together to make one long strip. Press the strip lengthwise in half wrong sides together.

3. Align the raw edges of the folded binding with the raw edge of the quilt top. Leave an 8" tail and stitch, using a ¼" seam allowance all the way around, mitering the corners and stopping 8" from the starting point. Use your favorite method to join the ends and finish binding.

4. Bring the folded edge of the binding to the back of the quilt and stitch it in place with a blind hemstitch.



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
