Quilt Yardages:

Fabric A: TSUR 5256 PA	1 panel
Fabric B: TSUR 5259 K	1 3/4 yards
Fabric C: TSUR 5262 C	1/4 yard
Fabric D: TSUR 5262 E	1/2 yard
Fabric E: TSUR 5262 R	3/8 yard
Fabric F: TSUR 5263 K	1/2 yard
Backing: TSUR 5261 C suggested	2 1/2 yards
Batting	45" x 63"

Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvages) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

From Fabric A:

1. Cut panel 22 1/2" x 40 1/2" centering design within space.

From Fabric B:

1. Cut four 4 1/4" strips on the length of the fabric (LOF) centering the butterfly area of the stripe within each strip. Trim two strips to 4 1/4" x 56" and two strips to 4 1/4" x 38". (3rd Border)

From Fabric C:

1. Cut five 1" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Trim seams to 1/4" and press open. From this pieced strip, cut two 1" x 49" strips and two 1" x 31" strips. (2nd Border)

From Fabric D:

1. Cut nine 1 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Trim seams to 1/4" and press open. From this pieced strip, cut two 1 1/2" x 48" strips and two 1 1/2" x 30" strips (1st Border). Cut two 1 1/2" x 58" strips and two 1 1/2" x 40" strips. (4th Border)

From Fabric E:

1. Cut six 1 1/2" strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams. Trim seams to 1/4" and press open. From this pieced strip, cut two 1 1/2" x 60" strips and two 1 1/2" x 42" strips. (5th Border)

From Fabric F:

1. Cut six 2 1/2" strips. (Binding)

Piecing Instructions:

Borders are mitered and consist of five border strips. Strips are first sewn together into a panel and then sewn to the panel.

1. Sew together in order, matching the center of each strip to the next: one 1 1/2" x 48" D strip, one 1" x 49" C strip, one 4 1/4" x 56" B strip, one 1 1/2" x 58" D strip, and one 1 1/2" x 60" E strip. Press all seams toward the E strip. Repeat. Note that both ends of strip panel will be uneven.
2. Sew together in order, matching the center of each strip to the next: one 1 1/2" x 30" D strip, one 1" x 31" C strip, one 4 1/4" x 38" B strip, one 1 1/2" x 40" D strip, and one 1 1/2" x 42" E strip. Press all seams toward the first D strip. Repeat. Note that both ends of strip panel will be uneven.
3. Sew one Step 1 border set to one side of the panel, matching center of D strip to center of panel. Sew border set to panel beginning and ending a generous 1/4" from edge of the panel. Backstitch at both ends of the seam. Repeat on the other side of the panel.
4. Sew one Step 2 border set to the top of the panel, matching center of D strip to center of panel. Sew border set to panel beginning and ending a generous 1/4" from edge of the panel. Backstitch at both ends of the seam. Repeat on the bottom of the panel.
5. Close corners of borders with mitered seams using your preferred method. Note that the side and top/bottom border seams will nest together as the seams were pressed in opposite directions for each border set.
6. After mitering corners closed and borders lay flat, trim seams to 1/2" and press open.

Finishing:

1. Prepare backing using two widths of fabric and horizontal seam/s. Press seams open and trim backing to 45" x 63".
2. Layer quilt, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Trim layers even with quilt top, squaring corners.
5. Join six 2 1/2" F binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Attach binding using your favorite method.
6. Make a label and sew to the back of the quilt.

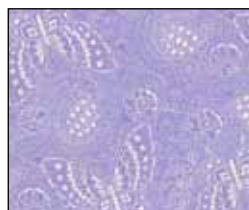

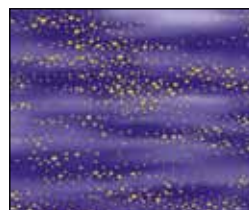

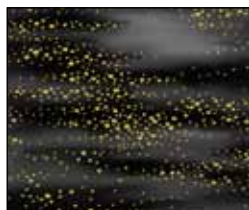
