

# **Cutting Instructions:**

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

#### From Fabric A:

1. Fussy cut three 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" squares around different small owl motifs, centering image.

#### From Fabric B:

1. Fussy cut six 10 1/2" x 10 1/2" squares, centering image.

#### From Fabric C:

1. Cut two 5 7/8" strips; subcut eight 5 7/8" squares. Cut each in half on the diagonal to make sixteen triangles.

#### From Fabric D:

- 1. Cut four 3 1/2" strips; subcut thirty-six 3 1/2" squares.
- 2. Cut nine 1 3/4" strips; subcut thirty-six 1 3/4" x 9"
- rectangles.
- 1. Cut seven 2 1/4" strips for binding.

#### From Fabric E:

- 1. Cut four 3 1/2" strips; subcut thirty-six 3 1/2" squares.
- 2. Cut three 3" strips; subcut thirty-six 3" squares.
- 3. Cut seven 2 1/2" strips. Sew together end to end and cut two 2 1/2" x 60 1/2" borders and two 2 1/2" x 64 1/2" borders.
- 4. Cut twelve 1 3/4" strips; subcut thirty-six 1 3/4" x 11 1/2" rectangles.

#### From Fabric F:

1. Cut two 5 7/8" strips; subcut eight 5 7/8" squares. Cut each in half on the diagonal to make sixteen triangles.

#### From Fabric G:

1. Cut one 5 7/8" strip; subcut four 5 7/8" squares. Cut each in half on the diagonal to make eight triangles.

### From Fabric H:

1. Cut three 5 7/8" strips; subcut sixteen 5 7/8" squares. Cut each in half on the diagonal to make thirty-two triangles.

## From Fabric I:

- 1. Cut two 6 1/4" strips; subcut nine 6 1/4" squares. Cut each in half <u>twice</u> on the diagonal to make thirty-six triangles.
- 2. Cut three 3" strips; subcut thirty-six 3" squares.

# Piecing Instructions:

Note: Press seams as directed by arrows or instructions.

 Draw a line across the diagonal of each 3 1/2" E square. Pin one E and one D 3 1/2" square right sides together. Sew together 1/4" from either side of the drawn line. Cut apart on the line and press towards D to make Unit A. Make seventy-two A Units. Trim and square to 3" x 3". (Figure 1)




 Sew two A Units, one 3" E square and one 3" I square together as shown to make a B Unit. Make thirty-six B Units. Trim and square to 5 1/2" x 5 1/2". (Figure 2)

3. Fold the 6 1/4" I triangles, 1 3/4" x 9" D and 1 3/4" x 11 1/2" E rectangles in half, and finger press to mark the centers. Sew one of each together as shown, matching centers. Press. Trim the ends in line with the I triangle and set aside as Unit C. (Figure 3)



4. Sew one pair of 5 7/8" G triangles to either side of Unit C as shown to make a D Unit. Press towards G. Repeat, to make four Fabric G, eight Fabric C, eight Fabric F, and sixteen Fabric H. (Figure 4)





Figure 5 Make 9. 20 1/2" x 20 1/2" unfinished.

5. Sew four B Units, four matching D Units, and one 10 1/2" owl square together as shown to make a block. Pair 10 1/2" A squares with the D units of C and G. Pair 10 1/2" B squares with the D Units of F and H. Make nine blocks. Trim and square to 20 1/2" x 20 1/2". (Figure 5)

- 6. Refer to the Quilt Diagram and sew blocks into three rows. Press seams open. Sew rows together. Press.
- 7. Sew one 2 1/2" x 60 1/2" E border to the top and bottom of quilt center. Press towards E. Sew one 2 1/2" x 64 1/2" E border to each side of the quilt. Press towards E.

## Finishing:

- 1. Press 108" backing well and trim to 72" x 72".
- 2. Layer quilt, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Trim layers even with quilt top squaring corners.
- Join seven 2 1/4" D binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Attach binding using your favorite method.
- 6. Make a label and sew to the back of quilt.




