





12" Block Assembly~

- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the back of two 3-1/2" ivory background squares. See A.
- 2. Lay one on one side of the 4-1/2" x 5-1/2" green bunny strip with right sides together (RST) and sew the line. See B.
- 3. Press the seam open and trim off the excess fabric on back. See C.
- 4. Repeat and sew the second 3-1/2" square to the opposite corner of the same strip then trim off the excess fabric. See D.
- 5. This will be the bunny ear. See B1 finished below.
- 6. Sew a $2 \sim 1/2$ " x $4 \sim 1/2$ " ivory strip down the left side of B1.
- 7. Sew the 3-1/2" x 4-1/2" ivory strip down the right side.
- 8. Draw a diagonal line on the back of two 1-1/2" ivory squares.
- 9. Lay them on one side of a 3" x 4~1/2" green bunny strip with RST and sew both lines. See B2.
- 10. Press the seams open and trim off the excess fabric on back.
- 11. Draw a diagonal line on the back of one 1-1/2" ivory square.
- 12. Lay on the upper corner of a 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" green bunny strip and sew the line. See B3.
- 13. Press the seam open and trim the excess fabric on back.
- 14. Draw a diagonal line on the back of two 1-1/2" ivory squares.
- 15. Lay them on the top corners of the 6-1/2" green square (RST) and sew both lines. Press the seams and trim. See B4.
- 16. Sew the 1-1/2" x 2" ivory strip to the left side of the 2" x 3-1/2" green strip then sew across the bottom of B2
- 17. Sew B3 across the bottom.
- 18. Sew these three down the left side of B4.
- 19. Sew this across the bottom of the bunny ears B1.
- 20. Sew a 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" ivory strip down each side.
- 21. Sew a 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" ivory strip across the top and bottom.
- 22. Make 4 more colorful blocks the same way using different fabrics plus 4 blocks in reverse.



Bunny block shown in reverse








Rows~


- 1. Lay out the nine blocks into three rows.
- 2. Sew a 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" green sashing strip down both sides of the center block in each row.
- 3. Sew the left and right blocks to the center block in each row and press all of the seams.
- 4. Sew a $1 \sim 1/2$ " x WOF green sashing strip across the top and bottom of the center row.
- 5. Trim off the excess fabric on each.
- 6. Line up and sew the three rows together.
- 7. Press the seams again.
- 8. Sew a 1-1/2" x WOF green sashing strip down each side and trim off the excess fabric.
- 9. Sew a 1-1/2" x WOF green sashing strip across the top and bottom and trim off the excess fabric.
- 10. Sew a 3~1/2" x LOF border strip down each side and trim off the excess fabric.
- 11. Sew a 3~1/2" x LOF border strip across the top and bottom and trim off the excess fabric.
- 12. Press all seams.


<u>Finishing~</u>


- 1. Cut 2-3/4 yards of backing fabric in half then sew the two 49-1/2" lengths together and press the seam.
- 2. Lay the quilt top on a layer of batting and the backing fabric.
- 3. Quilt by hand or machine.
- 4. Sew the four binding strips end to end making one continuous strip of binding.
- 5. Fold in half lengthwise with right sides out and press flat.
- 6. Pin the binding around the top with the raw edge toward the outside edge of the quilt.
- 7. Turn under the first 1/2".
- 8. Sew the binding in place.



- 9. Miter each corner as shown and overlap the end by 1/2".
- 10. Cut off the excess binding fabric.
- 11. Fold the binding over to the back and pin in place.
- 12. Hand-stitch on the back of the quilt.
