

Wild and Free Using the Into the Wild fabric collection by Ann Lauer Quilt Size: 62" x 74"



<u>Overview</u>

Wild and Free uses 7 fabrics from the *Into the Wild* collection by Ann Lauer for Benartex. The fabric numbers and descriptions for each are listed below. For reference, cut a swatch from each fabric, staple it to a piece of paper, and label it appropriately 1-7.

- Fabric 1 Panel black 16565-12
- Fabric 2 Stripe multi 16566-99
- Fabric 3Echo black 16261-12
- Fabric 4Echo cream 16261-07
- Fabric 5 Mountain Pass multi 16568-99
- Fabric 6 Slate plum 16572-65
- Fabric 7 Slate teal 16572-85, includes binding

Cutting

Note: Width of fabric (WOF) is fabric cut from selvage to selvage. Lengthwise strips are strips cut parallel with the selvage. <u>Measure your top as you go and adjust any lengthwise cuts to fit your quilt.</u>

Fabric 1

Fussy cut $1 - 23 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " piece (center panel)

Fabric 2

Fussy cut $2 - 3 \frac{3}{4}$ " x 36" lengthwise strips with wildlife landscape centered (see photo)

Fussy cut 2 – 2 ¼" x 66 ½" lengthwise strips with the geometric stripe centered (for fourth border, see photo)

Fussy cut 2 – 2 ¼" x 54 ½" lengthwise strips with the geometric stripe centered (for fourth border, see photo)

Fabric 3

Cut 4 – 2" x WOF strips; trim 2 strips to measure 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " long (for first side borders) and 2 strips to measure 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ " long (for first top and bottom border)

Cut 4 – 3 ³⁄₄" squares

From Fabric 4

Cut 3 - 3 ½" x WOF strips (for second border) Cut 3 - 9 ½" x WOF strips; subcut 24 - 3 ½" x 9 ½" pieces and 4 - 9 ½" squares (for second border)

From Fabric 5

Cut $3 - 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips (for second border)

From Fabric 6

Cut $6 - 2" \times WOF$ strips (for third border) Cut $4 - 2 \frac{1}{4}"$ squares (for fourth border)

From Fabric 7

Cut $3 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips (for second border) Cut $14 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips; (for fifth border and binding)

<u>Assembly</u>

Refer to the quilt photo for steps 1-6. Press border strips away from the quilt center after adding each strip.

1. Sew a 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric 3 square to each end of the 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 36" Fabric 2 strips making the strips 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " long. Noting print direction, sew these strips to opposite sides of the Fabric 1 panel. The Quilt center measures 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x "42 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

2. Sew a 2" x 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric 3 strip to each long side of the quilt center. Sew a 2" x 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric 3 to the top and bottom. The quilt top measures 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

3. 3-Patch Units. Using 3 ½" strips, sew a Fabric 5 strip lengthwise between a Fabric 4 strip and a Fabric 7 strip. Press seams toward Fabric 7. Make 3 strip sets. Cut (28) 3 ½" segments.



4. Sew (8) 3-patch units alternately together with (7) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric 4 pieces to make a $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $45\frac{1}{2}$ " pieced strip. Make 2. Sew these to the long sides of the quilt top. Make 2 more pieced strips using (6) 3-patch units and 5 Fabric 3 pieces each. Sew a $9\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric 4 square to each end of both strips. Sew these strips to the top and bottom. The quilt top measures $51\frac{1}{2}$ " x $63\frac{1}{2}$ ".

5. Sew the 2" wide Fabric 6 strips short ends together to make one long strip. Cut (2) 63 $\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths and (2) 54 $\frac{1}{2}$ " lengths. Sew the longer strips to the long sides of the quilt top and the shorter strips to the top and bottom. The quilt top measures 54 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 66 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

6. Sew a 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 66 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric 2 strip to each long side of the quilt top. Sew a 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric 6 square to each end of the 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 54 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric 2 strips then sew these strips to the top and bottom. The quilt top measures 58" x 70".

7. Sew (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide Fabric 7 strips short ends together to make one long strip. Cut (2) 70" lengths and (2) 62" lengths. Sew the longer strips to the sides of the quilt top and the shorter strips to the top and bottom.

8. Layer the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste the layers together and quilt as desired.

9. Sew (7) 2 ½" wide Fabric 7 strips short ends together to make one long strip and bind.
