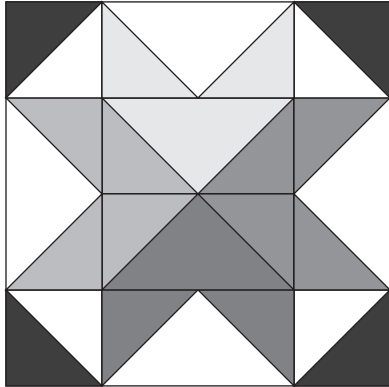

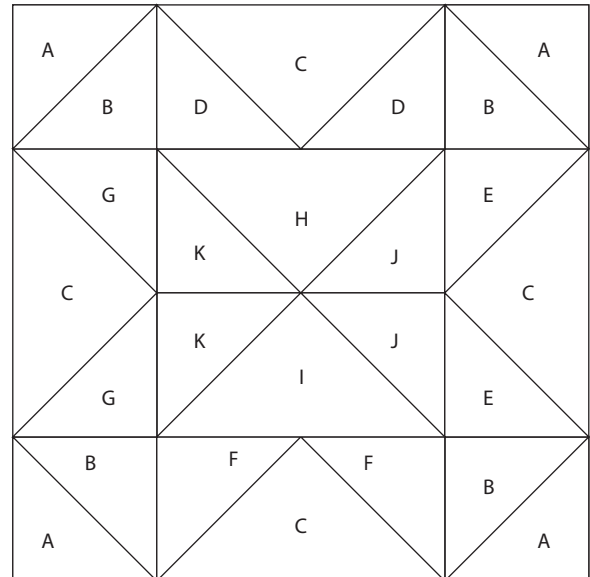
My block is a scrappy star--combining two of my favorite types of blocks. I know you'll enjoy sewing along as much as I do.

### Cutting Instructions

Qty	6" finished block	12" finished block
2	2 ½" squares (A)	4" squares (A)
2	2 ½" squares (B)	4" squares (B)
4	3 ½" x 2" rectangles (C)	6 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles (C)
2	2" squares (D)	3 ½" squares (D)
2	2" squares (E)	3 ½" squares (E)
2	2" squares (F)	3 ½" squares (F)
2	2" squares (G)	3 ½" squares (G)
1	3 ½" x 2" rectangles (H)	6 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles (H)
1	3 ½" x 2" rectangles (I)	6 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles (I)
2	2" squares (J)	3 ½" squares (J)
2	2" squares (K)	3 ½" squares (K)

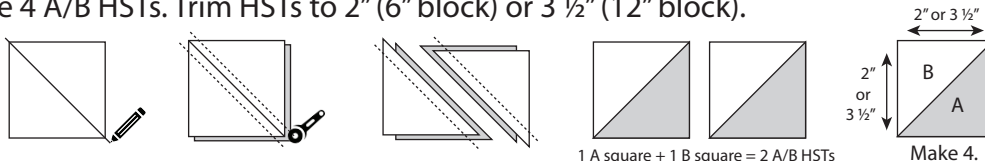
## Piecing Instructions

### Step 1

On the wrong side of each B square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Place A and B squares right sides together. Stitch a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the square apart on the line to yield two HSTs, and press the seams to the darker triangles (A).

Repeat to make 4 A/B HSTs. Trim HSTs to 2" (6" block) or 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).

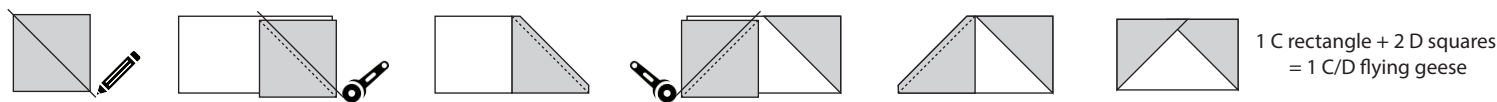


### Step 2

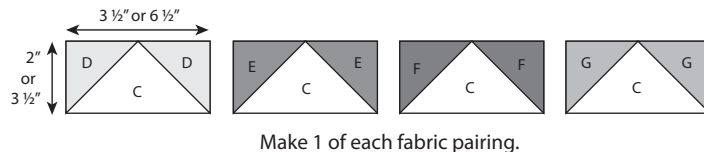
On the wrong side of each D square, draw a line from one corner to the opposing corner as shown.

Align the D square on one end of a C rectangle, right sides together, as shown. Stitch on the drawn line, and trim the seam to  $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press the seam to the D triangle.

Align the other D square on the other end of the C rectangle, right sides together, as shown. Stitch on the drawn line, and trim the seam to  $\frac{1}{4}$ ". Press the seam to the D triangle to complete the C/D flying geese.



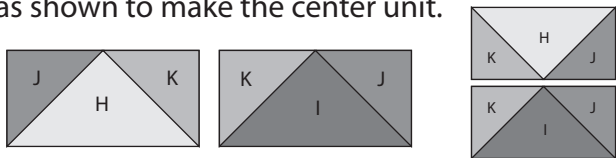
Repeat to make 1 C/D, 1 C/E, 1 C/F, and 1 C/G flying geese. Trim units to 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" (6" block) or 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).



### Step 3

Using the same method, make 1 H/J/K and 1 I/J/K flying geese, placing prints as shown. Trim units to 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" (6" block) or 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " (12" block).

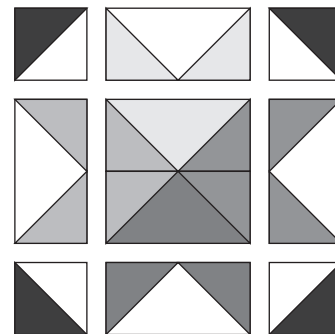
Join H/J/K and I/J/K flying geese together as shown to make the center unit.



### Step 4

Lay out HSTs, flying geese, and center unit as shown.

Join units to make the full block. Trim to 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " or 12  $\frac{1}{2}$ ".
